## CONCORD COUNTRY JUBILEE

## TERMS and CONDITIONS

The Concord Country Jubilee will be held on the *third weekend in October*, both Saturday and Sunday from 9 am to 5 pm. Concord, Georgia is in Pike County, six miles west of Zebulon on State Highway 18.

Vendor Categories. Vendor categories are Arts & Crafts (including but not limited to hand crafted products, antiques and collectibles), Food (on site preparation and pre-made edibles) and Children's Activities (including but not limited to inflatables, train and pony rides).

**Applications**. All vendor applications are subject to approval by Jubilee personnel. Vendors will state exactly what will be sold. Only items listed on the application will be allowed for sale. Applications will be approved or denied based on this information. First time vendors must include pictures of merchandise with the application. *The application deadline for return vendors is the first Monday of September*. Regardless of vendor longevity at the Jubilee, booth space **WILL NOT** be guaranteed after this date.

**Vendor Spaces**. ALL vendor spaces are 15 ft x 15 ft. **Items must not extend beyond the booth space**. If your canopy is located on pavement, you must secure it without the use of stakes and not exceed 15 ft x 15 ft. Respect neighboring vendors; do not spread booth items beyond the above-mentioned space. Acceptable options for securing canopies include cinder blocks with bungees, buckets or gallon size milk containers with sand. If the canopy is located on ground tent stakes are permissible as long as they do not present a trip hazard.

**Utilities**. Electricity is available for \$20.00 per 20Amp circuit. Maximum electrical load per circuit is 20 Amps. Generators are not allowed. **Food vendors** are encouraged to **use propane for onsite food preparation**. Food vendors using oil or water must furnish containers to properly dispose of cooking oil and/or dirty water.

**Vendor Equipment**. Vendors should test any cooking appliance and equipment prior to arrival at Jubilee grounds. This includes but is not limited to cookers, microwaves, popcorn machines, crock pots, deep fryers, coffee makers, burners/warmers and **electrical cords**. Failure to ensure proper operation of the aforementioned items may cause electrical circuits to trip.

**Set up**. Due to the presence of open and operating businesses in the area where the Jubilee is held set up will begin AFTER 4 PM Friday before Jubilee. NO ONE WILL BE ALLOWED TO SET UP BEFORE 4 PM. DO NOT BRING VENDOR SET UP ITEMS AND LEAVE THEM PRIOR TO THIS DATE AND TIME. Upon arrival, Jubilee personnel will be available at the Information Booth to assist with locating vendor spaces. Anyone who disturbs the landscaping or damages property during set up may be denied participation during future Jubilees. Please remember this is a TWO-DAY EVENT. Participation on both days is strongly encouraged.

**Vehicles**. All vehicles must be moved from the display area by 8:00 AM, Saturday. DO NOT PARK VEHICLES ON OR NEAR THE WALKING PATH. NO EXCEPTIONS! Vendors may park their vehicles in designated areas. No vendor vehicles will be allowed in the display area **for the purpose of dismantling booths** until after 5 PM Sunday. Anyone who drives a vehicle into the Jubilee area between 9 and 5 on Saturday or Sunday may be denied future Jubilee participation.

Other. Raffles, fireworks, firearms, including ammunition, are not allowed at or during the Jubilee.

**Security**. Security will patrol the exhibit area during off hours. The City of Concord, nor Jubilee personnel, will be held responsible in the event of loss or damage.

Closure. The vendor booth area must be clean and free of trash. There should be nothing left in the space including but not limited to food debris, zip ties and gem clips. Trash receptacles will be available for disposal of debris. Failure to clean a vendor space thoroughly at time of departure could prevent returning for future Jubilees. Again, food vendors that cook with oil must take their oil home with them. Anyone who leaves the oil, pours it on the ground or in the ditch WILL BE DENIED future participation in the Jubilee.
