TOP 10 FEDERAL POLICY PRIORITIES

1. **Supports** legislation aimed to reduce the burden of taxes and regulations on businesses.
2. **Supports** comprehensive bipartisan immigration solutions to help businesses meet the critical workforce needs and encourage economic growth, including lawful, permanent status for DACA recipients.
3. **Supports** investments and positive policies and regulations in industry driven workforce programs and wraparound support services for all learners who persist and achieve their education and training.
4. **Supports** all actions to address supply chain constraints and encourage the free flow of goods and services with all U.S. trading partners.
5. **Supports** an inflationary-adjusted five-year reauthorization of the Federal Surface Transportation Act.
6. **Supports** legislation to expand access and improve quality for comprehensive mental health services and substance use disorder treatments.
7. **Supports** the expansion of federal programs that reduce barriers to entry and improve access for local and emerging small businesses seeking to compete for federal contracts.
8. **Supports** the appropriations for early childhood education, public education, higher education, skills training, and entrepreneurship development through federal programs.
9. **Supports** strengthening the political and business relationships with governments from across the world to promote trade, strengthen supply chains, and increase foreign direct investment.
10. **Supports** strengthened federal and local military partnerships that leverage existing authorities to modernize mission-critical facilities, enhance operational readiness, and advance national security priorities, including collaborative campus development opportunities aligned with Air Force mission needs.
