<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shoes – casual high or low top sneakers, sandals, boots 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shoes – low top sneakers, flats, loafers, dress shoes, dress sandals, boots
<p>NO HEELS! Comfortable shoes are of the utmost importance. Please try to break in new shoes prior to the trip. Pack extra shoes in case one pair is not as comfortable as expected. Shoes are the most important part of the dress code, but are the least important part of the attire (i.e. if they are comfortable – wear them for any function)</p>	
<p>No pajama bottoms, No sweatpants (only acceptable for travel days), No workout shorts, No inappropriate language/logos, No torn or tattered items, No dirty clothes, No inappropriate length or revealing clothing allowed.</p> <p>If a chaperone does not approve of your clothing, you will be asked to change.</p> <p>If you are unsure if it is acceptable or are questioning if it fits the dress code - probably just leave it at home.</p>
