This was the case with Father McGivney, his father passed away and he went back home from the Seminary to help support his Mother. Eventually returning to the Seminary and becoming a Parish Priest. With his background he started the Knights with the intent to start an insurance program that was affordable to families and to help them in time of untimely death like he himself experienced with his father.

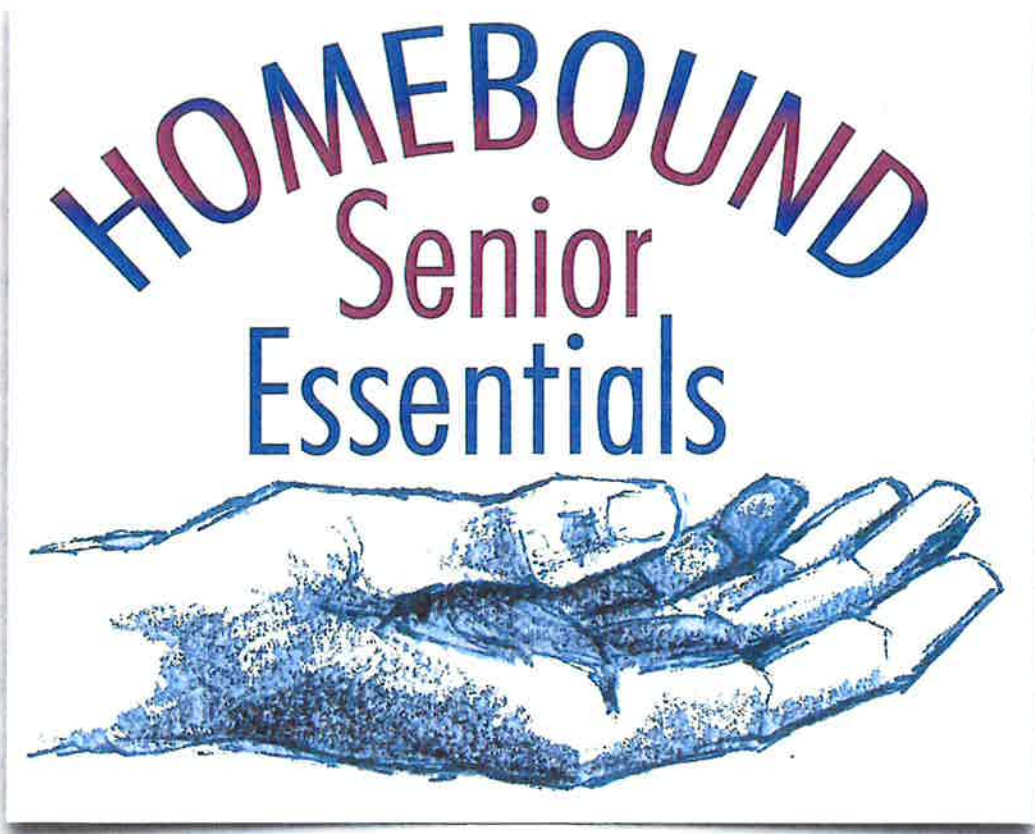
