In St. Paul's time, the Church was so new that everyone remembered how they came to the faith. That's not a bad thing. Even today, in helping with the RCIA, I like to hear how the new converts were drawn to the Lord. But it seems that some people in Paul's time actually boasted about who baptized them. They acted as if they were better Christians because of the person whose preaching first attracted them.

Paul, of course, would have no part in those rivalries. In fact, you can almost hear Paul laughing when he talks about people who consider Christ as just another leader of one of the factions. Christ should be the sign of unity for all Christians, not just one congregation. It may be even more difficult to seek unity today, with so many Christian churches and a modern view of diversity as somehow better than unity. While no one says they want to divide the body of Christ, I'm sure you know someone who thinks the only way to have a unified Church is for everyone to pray the same way they do.

Yet even Paul did not expect all believers to be clones of one another. He frequently wrote about people having many different gifts, yet all working to build up the Body of Christ. He doesn't mean that those gifts are divisive or that the Church survives in spite of them. Those differences are necessary; we need all the gifts that the Spirit gives us. So what can we do to help unify the Church? First, do what Jesus himself did—pray for unity in the Church (John 17:20–21). Pray that you come to know what your own gifts are, have the courage to use them for the Church, and appreciate the gifts of others. Second, Paul was very aware of his own weaknesses. That's what he is talking about in the last line of the reading. Jesus had to die before he could rise from the dead. Without the cross, we would have never heard of the Resurrection. So also, without weakness, how can we experience God's strength? Instead of looking down on those with whom we disagree, look up to see what God may be revealing to you through that person's differences.

25 de enero de 2026

En tiempos de San Pablo, la Iglesia era tan nueva que todos recordaban cómo llegaron a la fe. No es una cosa mala. Incluso hoy, al ayudar con el RICA, me gusta escuchar cómo los nuevos conversos se sintieron atraídos al Señor. Pero parece que algunas personas en tiempos de Pablo incluso se jactaban de quién los bautizó. Actuaban como si fueran mejores cristianos por la persona cuya predicación los atrajo inicialmente.

Pablo, por supuesto, no quería participar en esas rivalidades. De hecho, casi se puede oír a Pablo reírse cuando habla de quienes consideran a Cristo como un líder más de una de las facciones. Cristo debería ser el signo de unidad para todos los cristianos, no solo para una congregación. Quizás sea aún más difícil buscar la unidad hoy en día, con tantas iglesias cristianas y una visión moderna de la diversidad como algo mejor que la unidad. Aunque nadie dice que quiere dividir el cuerpo de Cristo, seguramente conoces a alguien que piensa que la única manera de tener una Iglesia unida es que todos recen de la misma forma que él.

Sin embargo, ni siquiera Pablo esperaba que todos los creyentes fueran clones unos de otros. Con frecuencia escribió sobre personas con dones diferentes, pero todas trabajando para edificar el Cuerpo de Cristo. No quiere decir que esos dones causen división ni que la Iglesia sobreviva a pesar de ellos. Esas diferencias son necesarias; necesitamos todos los dones que el Espíritu nos da. Entonces, ¿qué podemos hacer para ayudar a unificar la Iglesia?

Primero, haz lo que Jesús mismo hizo: reza por la unidad en la Iglesia (Juan 17,20-21). Reza para que llegues a conocer tus propios dones, tengas la valentía de usarlos para la Iglesia y aprecies los dones de los demás. Segundo, Pablo era muy consciente de sus propias debilidades. De eso habla en la última línea de la lectura. Jesús tuvo que morir antes de poder resucitar. Sin la cruz, jamás habríamos oído de la Resurrección. Así también, sin debilidad, ¿cómo podemos experimentar la fuerza de Dios? En lugar de menospreciar a quienes tienen una opinión diferente, miren hacia arriba para ver lo que Dios pueda estarles revelando a través de las diferencias de esa persona.

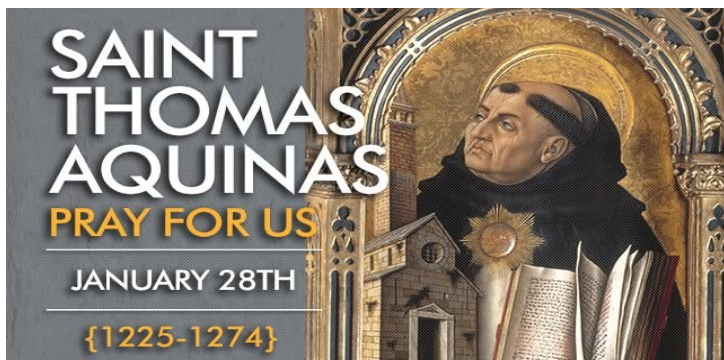
