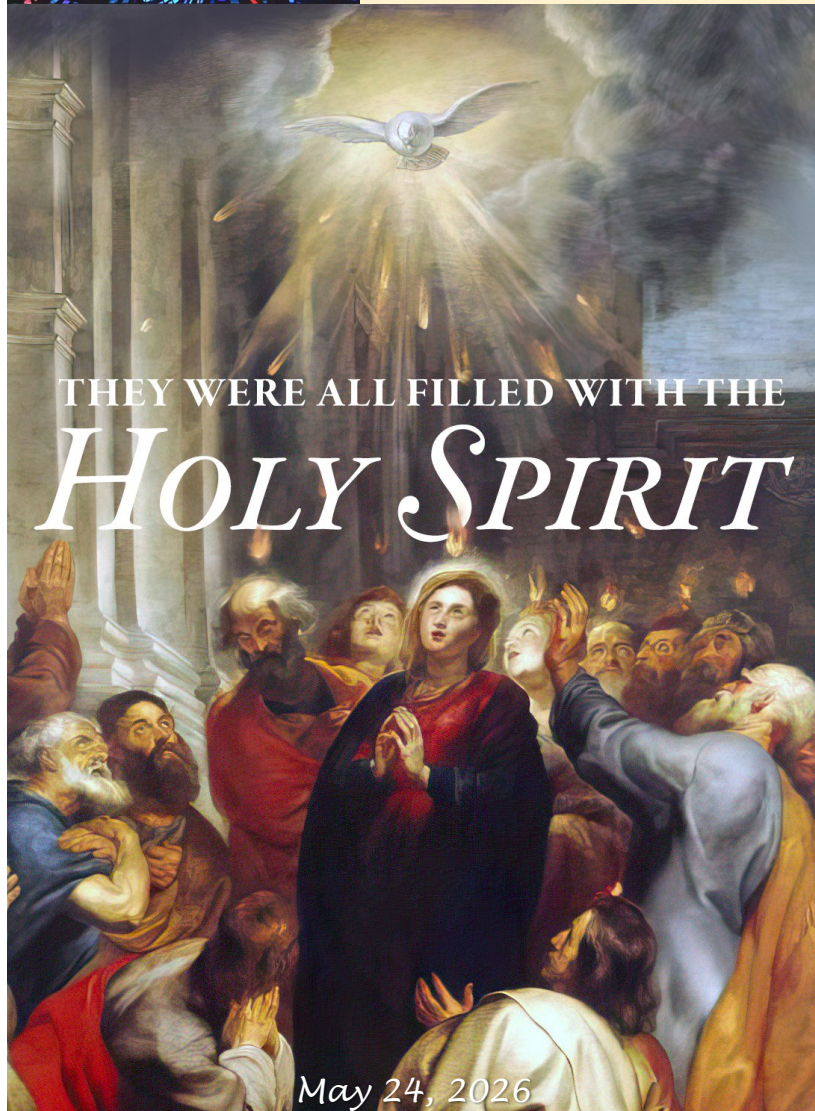

In the readings on Pentecost Sunday, the Spirit is described as a driving wind and tongues of fire. Knowing that the Holy Spirit is a Person of the Trinity, we seem to be able to picture the Spirit only in terms of what the Spirit does. In our second reading, Paul tries to explain just that. Though the English translation sounds vague, let's jump in.

First, Paul says that we cannot know Jesus as Lord without the Spirit. The Spirit is the way Jesus is present today, so anyone who truly believes in Jesus is guided by the Spirit. The Spirit never contradicts Jesus, so anyone claiming to have new knowledge that is opposed to what Jesus taught is not using the Spirit. So, for example, if someone starts a cult that teaches that we no longer need to love our enemies, we know that the Spirit is not in them.

Second, Paul acknowledges that the Spirit works in many ways. As examples, he mentions there are many different gifts and services in the church. He emphasizes that all these differences come from one and the same God. Even today we see this happening; people serve the Church in different ways and with different abilities. People even have different ways of looking at things. Some have more patience than others, some are better listeners, and some are great organizers. The point is that all these differences come from the same source, God.

When we think of the strength of the Church, we usually think of its unity, i.e., one baptism, one faith, one Lord. But we also draw strength from the diversity of gifts and services that people offer to God. No one person can do all it takes to bring the world to Christ. Even Jesus shared his work of spreading the gospel with his disciples. If sin brought a multitude of problems to the world, then the Spirit brings a multitude of gifts to help us through these problems. As Paul says, this diversity of gifts is all part of one Body of Christ. So look at the gifts of those around you, and you may be able to see the Holy Spirit more clearly.

En las lecturas del domingo de Pentecostés, el Espíritu se describe como un viento torrencial y lenguas de fuego. Sabiendo que el Espíritu Santo es una Persona de la Santísima Trinidad, parece que sólo podemos imaginar al Espíritu de acuerdo a sus acciones. En nuestra segunda lectura, San Pablo intenta explicar precisamente eso. Aunque la traducción al inglés suena vaga, vamos a reflexionar sobre ella.

Primero, Pablo dice que no podemos conocer a Jesús como Señor sin el Espíritu. El Espíritu es la forma en que Jesús está presente hoy, así que cualquiera que realmente crea en Jesús es guiado por el Espíritu. El Espíritu nunca contradice a Jesús, así que cualquiera que afirme tener un nuevo conocimiento que se oponga a lo que Jesús enseñó, no está usando el Espíritu. Entonces, por ejemplo, si alguien empieza un culto que enseña que ya no tenemos que amar a nuestros enemigos, sabemos que el Espíritu no está en ellos.

Segundo, Pablo reconoce que el Espíritu obra de muchas formas. Como ejemplos, menciona que hay muchos dones y servicios diferentes en la iglesia. Resalta que todas estas diferencias provienen de un mismo Dios. Incluso hoy vemos que esto sucede; las personas sirven a la Iglesia de diferentes formas y con diferentes habilidades. Las personas incluso tienen diferentes maneras de ver las cosas. Algunos tienen más paciencia que otros, algunos saben escuchar mejor y algunos son grandes organizadores. El punto es que todas estas diferencias provienen de la misma fuente, Dios.

Cuando pensamos en la fuerza de la Iglesia, solemos pensar en su unidad, es decir, un solo bautismo, una sola fe, un solo Señor. Pero también sacamos fuerzas de la diversidad de dones y servicios que las personas ofrecen a Dios. Ninguna persona puede hacer todo lo necesario para llevar el mundo a Cristo. El mismo Jesús compartió el trabajo de difundir el evangelio con sus discípulos. Si el pecado trajo una multitud de problemas al mundo, entonces el Espíritu trae una multitud de dones para ayudarnos a superar estos problemas. Como dice San Pablo, esta diversidad de dones es parte de un solo Cuerpo de Cristo. Así que fíjate en los dones de los que te rodean, y capaz podrás ver al Espíritu Santo más claramente.
