It's been months since Easter and it's a long way to Christmas, but there seems to be a lot of rejoicing in today's readings. Isaiah talks about rejoicing with Jerusalem. The Gospel shows the disciples rejoicing when they came back from visiting towns to tell about the Kingdom. St. Paul is happy to be suffering for Christ. So what is the reason for such joy?

The readings make clear that it is not because of what the people of Jerusalem did, or even what miracles Jesus' disciples performed. Isaiah talks about what God will do for the people, how "the Lord's power shall be known to his servants" (Isaiah 66:14). Jesus tells his disciples not to rejoice that they cast out demons; no, they should "rejoice because your names are written in heaven" (Luke 10:20). In other words, we are to rejoice over all the Lord has done for us, not what we have done for him.

Does that sound like false humility? Like someone receiving an Oscar who says, "I wasn't that good—it was all that my director, my producers, my wife and children, and my dog Snoopy did." No, when we do anything for others, we can honestly say that God does the real work. Knowing that frees us from expecting everyone to be happy, everything we do for others to be successful. When our offer of help is rejected, our prayers for a sick friend don't seem to be working, or our good advice is ridiculed, we can be confident that God has something else planned. Instead of being discouraged, we can trust that God's plan is working in ways we just can't see.

Paul has a similar theme in the second reading. You would think he would be proud of all the converts he made or the people he cured. He boasts only about his suffering because that is how he is most like Jesus. He sees all of his accomplishments as the work of God, and he knows that the greatest thing Jesus did was to die for us. All three readings remind us that what changes our lives and changes the world is not how hard we work or how holy we are; what really makes the difference is how much God loves us. That is the real reason to rejoice.

Han pasado meses desde la Pascua y falta mucho para la Navidad, pero parece que hay mucho regocijo en las lecturas de hoy. Isaías habla de regocijarse con Jerusalén. El Evangelio muestra a los discípulos regocijándose cuando regresaban de visitar pueblos para hablarles sobre el Reino. San Pablo está feliz de estar sufriendo por Cristo. Entonces, ¿cuál es la razón de tanta alegría?

Las lecturas dejan claro que no es por lo que hizo la gente de Jerusalén, ni por los milagros que realizaron los discípulos de Jesús. Isaías habla de lo que Dios hará por el pueblo, de cómo "Y los siervos del Señor conocerán su poder" (Isaías 66,14). Jesús les dice a sus discípulos que no se deben alegrar porque han expulsado demonios, sino deben "Alégrense más bien de que sus nombres están escritos en el cielo" (Lucas 10,20). En otras palabras, debemos regocijarnos por todo lo que el Señor ha hecho por nosotros, no por lo que nosotros hemos hecho por él.

¿Suena eso a la humildad falsa? Como si alguien que recibiera un Oscar dijera: "No fui tan bueno; fue todo lo que hicieron el director, los productores, mi esposa e hijos y mi perro Snoopy". No. Cuando hacemos algo por los demás, podemos decir honestamente que Dios hace el verdadero trabajo. Saber eso nos libera de esperar que todos estén felices, que todo lo que hagamos por los demás sea exitoso. Cuando ofrecemos ayudar y lo rechazan, nuestras oraciones por un amigo enfermo no parecen estar funcionando o el buen consejo que damos es ridiculizado, podemos estar seguros de que Dios tiene otros planes. En lugar de desanimarnos, podemos confiar en que el plan de Dios está funcionando de formas que simplemente no podemos ver.

Pablo tiene un tema semejante en la segunda lectura. Uno pensaría que estaría orgulloso de todas las conversiones que ha hecho o de las personas que ha curado. Presume sólo de su sufrimiento porque así es como más se parece a Jesús. Ve todos sus logros como obra de Dios y sabe que lo más grande que hizo Jesús fue morir por nosotros. Las tres lecturas nos recuerdan que lo que cambia nuestras vidas y cambia el mundo no es cuánto nos esforzamos ni cuán santos seamos; lo que realmente marca la diferencia es cuánto nos ama Dios. Esa es la verdadera razón para regocijarnos.
