- Weather is unpredictable – pack layers and rain gear
- Locals are welcoming; strike up conversations in pubs
- Peak greenery in May–June, fewer crowds in September
- Pubs serve food early; kitchens often close before 9 p.m.
- Bring sturdy shoes for exploring countryside and cliffs
