In John 17, Jesus prays for all believers. He says, "I have given them the glory that you




gave me, that they may be one as we are one—I in them and you in me—so that they may be brought to complete unity. Then the world will know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me."

ACTIONS TAKEN AT 7.15.21 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Administration update

- Minner Labrador, UCC president, shared a brief devotional and an update regarding his recent acceptance of a position with North American Division.
- Rodney Mills, UCC vice president for administration, shared the current conference membership statistical report.
- It was voted to approve the minutes of the April 28, 2021, Executive Committee.
- It was voted to approve the minutes of the July 15, 2021, Administrative and Finance Committee.

Financial update

- Allee Currier, UCC vice president for finance, presented an update on conference finances.
- It was voted to receive the April and May 2021 Finance Reports, subject to audit.
- It was voted to approve funding of \$254,000 from reserves for special missional evangelistic plans in local churches across the Upper Columbia Conference in 2021.
- Committee members signed and returned Conflict of Interest Statements for Conference Executive Committee and Corporation/Mission Society Board.

Education update

- Brian Harris, UCC vice president for education, gave an update from Office of Education. The 2021-2022 school year begins August 23, 2021.
- It was voted to elect the following individuals to fill the vacancies on the Upper Columbia Conference Board of Education: Kenton Gonzalez (pastor); Darla Shupe (instructional); Brooke Colburn (region 2); and Shawn Dietrich (region 3).
- It was voted to approve the following amendment to the UCA Constitution:

Article VII Section 7: Board Membership
The Board shall have 20 members or less, according

to the need.

(ix) Lake City Academy Principal

President Search Process

- John Freedman, president of North Pacific Union Conference, will serve as chair for items pertaining to the conference president appointment process.
- It was voted to record that the committee acknowledges and will follow the UCC Constitution & Bylaws-mandated method to fill officer vacancies between sessions. Freedman shared with the committee the process that will be used by the North Pacific Union Conference to gather information from UCC constituents and the vetting of prospective candidates for the position of president.
- It was voted to elect the following individuals to fill the vacancies on the Upper Columbia Conference Nominating Committee: Greg Carter (pastor); Saul Dominguez (pastor); Luke Irvine (lay); and Hannah Stonas (lay).
