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City of Aurora Mayor Mike Coffman to Join Aurora Housing Authority's Board of Commissioners

Aurora, CO – On Thursday, July 23, 2026, Aurora Mayor Mike Coffman announced his self-appointment to fill a vacant seat on the Aurora Housing Authority's (AHA) Board of Commissioners. The appointment reflects the mayor's decision to strengthen collaboration between AHA and the City of Aurora.

"My goal will be to be the bridge between the Aurora City Council and the Aurora Housing Authority so that both organizations are working together to expand opportunities to help meet the need for affordable housing that so many of Aurora's struggling families have," said Mayor Coffman.

Mayor Coffman brings decades of public service experience to the Board. He has served in the Colorado House of Representatives, the Colorado State Senate, and the U.S. House of Representatives, where he served on several committees. He also served as Colorado State Treasurer and Colorado Secretary of State. In addition to his civilian public service, Mayor Coffman completed a combined 20 years of military service in the U.S. Army, the U.S. Army Reserve, the U.S. Marine Corps, and the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve. He has served as mayor of Aurora since 2019, continuing a career dedicated to public service and civic leadership.

"Mayor Coffman's career in public service exemplifies the kind of qualities that AHA looks for in commissioners," said AHA Executive Director Steve Blackstock. "We expect he will be of true service to AHA's mission and vision."
