



General Terms & Conditions of Agrim B.V.

Article 1. Application

The General Terms and Conditions of Agrim B.V. are applicable to all proposals, agreements and activities of Agrim B.V. towards clients and their legal entities. If one of the articles is not applicable all other articles remain applicable.

Article 2. Fees and invoicing

The services of Agrim B.V. will be invoiced based on actual spent hours, unless agreed otherwise. Times mentioned in proposals are no more than an estimate. The fees are always excluding travel and subsistence expenses, unless agreed otherwise. Fees are always excluding taxes. Invoicing will be monthly with a payment term of 30 days after invoice date, unless agreed otherwise.

Article 3. claim

If a client does not agree with the sent invoice a written claim can be filed within 8 days after invoice date. Agrim B.V. will discuss the discrepancies with the client within 15 days after claim date.

Article 4. Notice period

Both client and Agrim B.V. are entitled to end any agreement per the first of the second month after date of written notice.

Article 5. Confidentiality and copyright

All information on the client during the service of Agrim will be treated with full confidentiality and will not in any way be made available to third parties, unless agreed otherwise in writing. On the information of Agrim B.V. no copyright is applicable. Clients are allowed to reuse presentations, documents and materials. Citation is appreciated.

Article 6. Liability

Agrim B.V., her coworkers and third parties hired by Agrim B.V. accept no liability for direct or indirect damage in relation to services provided by Agrim B.V. except in case of intent or gross negligence. If any liability exists, it will always be limited to the maximum of EUR 1.000.000 per occasion and to the maximum of EUR 1.000.000 per year.

Article 7. Applicable law

Agrim B.V. has the right to protect her interests as mentioned in these articles in a court of law. On all proposals the Dutch Law is applicable. In case of disputes will be dispatched to Dutch Law in a Dutch Court of Law.
