

Trees of Hope

It was just over a year ago that the Sycamore Gap Tree along Hadrian's Wall was felled by vandals. Fergus, a 12 year old boy from near Bristol, died at about the same time from childhood bone cancer. The National Trust have grown 49 saplings from that felled tree and are distributing them to local communities calling them Trees of Hope. One of these saplings has been planted at Blackwell near Bristol in memory of Fergus and all those other children who suffer from bone cancer. By collecting used postage stamps we can raise money to support research into this disease and last year we raised over £12,000. Will you help by saving your stamps?
