



Clogging is a Living Folk dance with it's orgin in the Appalachian Mountains in the 1800's where immigrants from England, Scotland, and Ireland had settled. It was made popular by Ben Smathers on the Grand Ole Opry in the 40's and 50's. It is now in a revival all over the U.S. as well as other countries.

Betty first became interested in clogging about 15 years ago when she saw an exhibition dance in Louisiana. In 1986 she began clogging under the instruction of Alan Keene of Tulsa. Mr. Keene is noted for bringing this style of dance to Oklahoma. Betty has been clogging on a weekly basis ever since and teaches, along with her husband, Keith, four times a week in Tahlequah, Salina, Wagoner and Muskogee. Also, Betty teaches beginning and intermediate clogging at Northeastern State University in Tahlequah.

Crafts and music, good food and floats and hometown people,

The Strawberry Festival starts May the 9th.

"So, neighbor, we'll see you there!"

Short Season

The strawberry season is relatively short, starting early in May and ending about June 1 - but it's long enough for everyone to get his or her share.

Crates of strawberries sell especially fast on Strawberry Festival Day, so those wishing to buy are reminded to get their share as early in the day as possible.

Growers will be in Stilwell on Festival Day to sell berries near the band stand where much of the action takes place.

Hundreds of people, including migrant workers, students and housewives, jump in each year to harvest the strawberry crop.

A good picker can pick about 100 quart boxes in a six hour day. A few years ago, 73 pickers picked 250 crates from $2\frac{1}{2}$ acres for one of the best days on record anywhere in the county.

Betty retired in 1989 from the Stilwell School System after over 38 years in the field of education. She was born in Stilwell, the daughter of Floyd and Ada Starr, and graduated from Stilwell High School in 1945. She received a bachelor of science degree in education in 1950 and a master of education degree in 1962 from Northeastern State University.

Betty was twice named Teacher of the Year for the Stilwell School System and was selected Adair County Teacher of the Year in 1977.

Always a teacher, after retirement from Stilwell, Betty took training in the Laubach method of teaching reading and has worked with the Spanish Literacy Mission at Calvary Baptist Church since it began in 1989. For many years she has taught a first grade Sunday School Class at the First Baptist Church, where she is a member.

Currently she is chairperson of the Adair County history book committee and co-editor of the History of Adair County book which was just released.

Betty and her husband, Bill, live on a farm in the Chalk Bluff community. They have one daughter, Dianne Barker, Tahlequah attorney, and two grandchildren, Angel Risenhoover, Tahlequah, and Melinda McLemore, St. Louis, Missouri.



Carl Stevens

Mr. Stevens was a senior in Stilwell High School in 1943 when he volunteered for the United States Navy during World War II. He served on the U.S.S. Warhawk, an attack transport ship, attaining the rank of Seaman 1st Class. He spent two years and five months in the Navy.

After returning from WWII, he returned to Stilwell

and graduated in 1946. After graduation, he attended Connors State College on a football and boxing scholarship from 1946 to 1948. He then attended Northwestern University from 1948 to 1950 on a football scholarship and there received a bachelor's degree.

In 1950, as a member of the Stilwell unit of the Oklahoma National Guard, Carl was recalled to active duty to fight in the Korean War, with a rank of 2nd Lieutenant. After arriving in Korea, he transferred to the 45th Division Airborne Rangers. He organized and commanded and elite fighting force called "Stevens Raiders".

In 1989 the 45th Division of the Oklahoma National Guard decided to re-name the Nowata Unit after Steven's Ranger unit in the Korean War. Carl was honored with a banquet and commissioned Honorary Colonel by the Brigade Commander, General Smith. The Nowata Unit now proudly bears the name "Steven's Raiders".

Carl married Katherine Sue Buckner in 1953. They have two married sons and five grandchildren. Carl is the son of Al and Minnie Stevens.



FAVORITE RECIPES

MAMA'S HOUSE STRAWBERRY LAYER CAKE

(John David Thomas)

2 1/2 cups flour 2 cups sugar

1 1/3 cup buttermilk 1/2 cup shortening

1 tsp. baking powder 1 tsp. vanilla 1/2 tsp. baking soda 4 egg whites 1/8 tsp. salt

Combine first 5, then add next 3 and mix on low speed 30 seconds, then high speed 2 minutes. Add egg whites and beat 2 minutes. Pour into 2 greased-floured 9" pans. Bake at 350 degrees for 30-35 minutes. Cool completely before frosting.

Optional-Strawberry sauce to be poured over cake when served.

Strawberry sauce-juice from one quart strawberries mixed with one cup sugar. Cook and add a mixture of 4 tbl. of water and 3 tbl. of cornstarch. Cool until thickened and add the quart of berries.



FAVORITE RECIPES

INDIVIDUAL STRAWBERRY SHORTCAKES

(Billye Baird)

Batter for shortcake:

2 cups flour

3 tsp. baking powder

1/2 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. cream of tarter

1/3 cup sugar

1/2 cup shortening

1 cup milk

Mix all dry ingredients together, stir well. Add shortening, cut into flour mixture, add milk just to moisten. Place on floured board, pat to 1 inch thick, cut with biscuit cutter. Place on greased cookie sheet and bake at 350 degrees or 15 minutes or until golden brown. (Recipe makes about one dozen.)

Slice biscuit in half. Place bottom in serving dish, cover with strawberries, then top half of biscuit. Garnish with ice cream, whipped topping, whipping cream or half and half. Each person can create his own masterpiece. Biscuits can be stored for late use.

FRESH STRAWBERRY PIE

(Carolyn Denny)

1 1/2 cups sugar

1 1/2 cups water

1/4 cup cornstarch

Dash of sait

Red food coloring 1 pkg. strawberry jello

1 pint fresh strawberries

1 baked pie shell

Whipped cream

Combine sugar, cornstarch, water and salt. Cook until clear and thick. Remove from heat, add color, add jello and stir well. Let cool, put strawberries in shell, pour sauce over, chill. Top with whipped cream before serving.
