

WHERE WERE YOU FIFTY YEARS AGO TODAY?

May 10, 1958 in Stilwell, Oklahoma was the ONLY place to be. That was the date the Stilwell Kiwanis Club, under the leadership of its capable and multi-talented President D. C. (Tobe) O'Neal, set for its 11th Annual Strawberry Festival.

Perhaps those of you old enough to have been here that day will enjoy taking a second look at and remembering a few of that day's events and compare them to what

you see unfolding here today.

Maybe, once again, you will appreciate the efforts and hard work of those community leaders of fifty years ago. Most of them have gone on to their eternal awards and tossed the torch of leadership to a group of younger men and women that make up the roster of today's Kiwanis Club. They and many other civic minded men and women of other civic organizations are cooperating together to make our community an even better and more inviting place to spend a day of celebration.

That festival morning fifty years ago dawned clear and bright. It was a good omen for the spirited fun filled day that lay ahead. Colbert Starr had been chosen as Parade Marshall. He and his committee had assembled an impressive number of floats, bands, numerous other entries and, of course, an array of horse back riders to thrill the estimated crowd of 12,000 people gathered along both side of the parade route.

The Kiwanis Club of 1958, sponsors of the festival, was composed of the

following 30 civic-minded individuals:

At 10 A. M. President, O'Neal, speaking from the Bandstand on the courthouse lawn, gave the welcome address. He then served as his own Master of Ceremonies being ably assisted by Dr. James Dawson, who served as Program Chairman. Together they identified each and every parade entrant as they passed in review before the Bandstand, giving a brief resume of each and leading the deserved applause they received,

Immediately following the parade, Enoch Estep sang the National Anthem and Rev. Hal Nobel, minister of the First Methodist Church, gave the invocation.

The crowning of the Strawberry Queen by Dr. Harold Garrison, Lieutenant-Governor Division XXI, Texas-Oklahoma District, Kiwanis International was next. The crowd cheered wildly as he placed the coveted crown on the head of the lovely Miss Delois Nofire as the reigning Queen of the 1958 festival.

Following the coronation, the formal program began with a twenty-five minute presentation by the Scamps, a Novelty Band. Next on stage was the Knight Trio consisting of Barbara, Patsy and Jerry Joe. They sang several songs to the delight of the

Ronnie Young of Grove, Oklahoma, next presented Dance and Song specialties. Bud Carrione and Boys, (known as the Rhythm Kings) presented a fifteen-minute performance.

The Oakies and the Singerettes of Grove, Oklahoma, under the direction of Elsie Smith were the next act to follow

Kenneth Thompson and Sue Ritchie were introduced and sang several solos. Jimmie Summy of Westville, Oklahoma presented a comedy routine next, This act delighted the crowd. A girls trio made up of Beverly Johnson, Sue and Sandy Houseburg sang several numbers and a Drill team known as the Norse Stars, from Northeastern A& M Junior College, Miami, Oklahoma completed the days entertainment.

All of the attractions and entertainment were centered at the Bandstand that day except for the judging of the berries. They were on exhibit across the street from the Bandstand. (Carlos Brannon's berries won first prize, Wren Worley's entry was judged to be in 2nd place and Charles Dewalt's was given 3rd place)

The Berry entries were then carried across the street to the Bandstand for the Auction that followed. The amount of prize money received by the grower or the price

paid for the prize berries could not be found in any records available

Immediately following the auction of he berries, the serving of free strawberries and ice cream began in the middle of Division Street just north of the Bandstand and the line of eager recipients reached almost to the Bank of Commerce building several blocks to the east. I am afraid there were many blouses and shirts stained by the juicy strawberries and ice cream that became soft in the warm afternoon sun. However, an equal number of happy sunburned faces were in evidence by the end of the day

That night, it seemed that nearly everyone stayed over and attended the Rodeo sponsored by the Stilwell Roundup Club at the local arena north of town.

Some interesting facts about the city of Stilwell and surrounding area were noted in the festival booklet of that year. The KCS Railroad through Stilwell provided services direct to New Orleans, Kansas City and Port Arthur, Texas. Bus transportation was furnished by the Cookson Hills Stages with headquarters in Stilwell.

Overlooking Stilwell from the top of Davis Mountain east of town a 30 foot cross was erected and lighted each night. It was a symbol of the religious sprit of this area.

And, Oh, yes it was noted that Stilwell had no city tax.







In the early 1900s, J.R. Reed started a business located on the property where the Bank of Commerce is now located, selling, according to the sign on the windows, "Dry Goods, Groceries, and Ladies' and Gents Shoes". Others in the business with him were his son, Lowery M. Reed and his wife, Sarah, and B.F. (Fay) Reed and his wife, Lillus.

Mr. J.R. Reed was a successful and prosperous businessman and pioneer in the early days of Stilwell. He was president of the First National Bank of Stilwell, chartered in

About 1932 Lowery M. Reed, C.J. Carson 1911. and R.L. Reese bought the Rogers Hardware & Furniture Company from W.M. Rogers. It was located across the street from the J.R. Reed business. They renamed the store Reed-Carson Hardware & Furniture Company and sold groceries, furniture, and John Deere farm equipment. The John Deere farm equipment was shipped from St. Louis, and some were shipped in "pool cars" with Lewis Brothers in Fayetteville, Arkansas.

After Lowery's death in 1934 until 1946 Sarah Reed, C.J. Carson, and B.F. Reed were partners in the business. Slogans for the hardware store were "Buy your hardware from a Hardware Store -- the House of Quality Merchandise for Farm & Home" and "Quality remains long after the price is for-gotten". Working in the business with Sarah Reed were B.F. and Lillus Reed, parents of Emma Dean Panter.

After returning from service in 1946 Quentin M. and Welch E. (Gene) Reed bought C.J. Carson's part of the business. The name was changed to Reed's Hardware & Furniture Company with Sarah Reed Bragg and her two sons as partners. After Sarah's death, Quentin Reed, Jr. became a partner.

Today Reed's Hardware is a franchised Servistar Dealer, selling plumbing, electrical supplies, hardware, paint, and floor covering.

None of the success that Reed's Hardware has enjoyed in the past would have been possible without the help and support of B.F. Reed, Ross Reed, and Leonard Poor.

The following have also worked for Reed's Hardware at different times: Carl Reed (B.F.'s brother), Naomi (Sis) Reed, Doris Jo Reed, Austin Johnson, Dollie Sharp, Pauline Ray, and Jack Eubanks.



Stilwell High School Outstanding Male Alumni

Charlie Soap



Charles has overcome many challenges to become one of the most respected Cherokee men of our time. One of the first major challenges he faced was enrolling in Zion School as a Cherokee speaker who did not speak any English. Many years later, that boy who entered first grade without any English skills at all earned a Bachelor's Degree in

Charlie has always been a multi-talented person with many different interests. During his years at Stilwell High School, Charlie excelled at sports, especially basketball. Larry Adair, the former Oklahoma Speaker of the House, who was a couple of years behind Charlie in high school said, "It was a joy to watch Charlie play basketball. He could jump Education from Northeastern State University. very gracefully, like a deer. And he was an aggressive and focused player." Charlie's coaches became his advocates and mentors and helped steer him toward high education.

He has traveled extensively to visit community development projects and indigenous communities in Brazil, Suriname, South Africa, New Zealand and China as well as

Charlie is an accomplished community development practitioner and organizer who received numerous awards for his work, including the Common Cause Public Service Achievement Award, and two National Certificates of Merit from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development. His unique skills and work is the subject of an upcoming feature film entitled, "The Cherokee Word for Water," and the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation is considering an international initiative in self-help and $community\ development\ based\ primarily\ on\ the\ early\ community\ development\ work\ of\ Charlie\ Soap.$

Working principally in Cherokee communities, he has developed an array of organizations and services, ranging from self-help housing and water systems to walking trails for people with diabetes. Among other accomplishments, he helped traditional Cherokee artisans, including elderly basket makers, form an arts and crafts cooperative.

He is currently employed as a Community Services Department Group Leader (Executive Director) with the Cherokee Nation. This position allows him to use his problet solving skills to assist a great many individuals as well as communities in resolving longstanding problems with basic infrastructure like housing and water. Over the course more than two decades of community development work in rural communities, Mr. Soap has developed some unique methods for organizing communities and helping the

Besides his work in Cherokee communities, Mr. Soap also worked with business, education and political leaders to found the Boys and Girls Club of Tahlequah and served its founding director. Under Mr. Soap's leadership, the Club initiated a comprehensive summer enrichment program and working with Tahlequah Public Schools develop the first after-school programs in the school system which now serves hundreds of students each year. The collaboration between the Boys and Girls Club and the Tahleq

Mr. Soap served as the Oklahoma Area Director of the Christian Children's Fund. During his seven year tenure at the Christian Children's Fund, he oversaw the transition of Public Schools has served as a national model. program from issuance of clothing vouchers to community-based development projects. At one point, he oversaw more than forty separate community-based projects.

Charlie served in the United States Navy from 1965-1969, and received an honorable discharge.

He has presented lectures on community development at Cornell University, Arizona State University Law School, the University of Maryland, Tufts University, India University, Mayo Clinic, and numerous other venues. He is also a skilled photographer who eventually hopes to publish a book of his photographs. Charlie is the coord the Cherokee Holiday annual pow-wow and has been a fancy war dancer for over thirty years. He loves the outdoors and is an avid golfer and loves to ride horses when chance. Charlie Soap resides in rural Adair County Oklahoma with his wife, Wilma Mankiller.

Stilwell High School Outstanding Female Alumni Allene M. Watkins

Allene was the oldest of five children born to Thomas and Cora Means. She grew up in the Spade Mountain Community and began her education at the small country school of Rabbit Trap. After graduating from the eighth grade there, she attended Stilwell High School. Because of a lack of transportation, she stayed with an elderly woman who lived in town so she could more easily attend school. In the spring of 1945, she graduated from Stilwell, and in the following fall, entered Northeastern State College (now University). Gaining experience in perseverance and independence, she stayed in the dormitory and worked in the cafeteria to pay expenses. Allene was the first in her family to attend college and paved the way for her brothers and sister.

After a full year and a summer at Northeastern, she obtained an emergency certificate to teach in 1946. Because of World War II, teachers were scarce. She went back to her home community to teach at Rabbit Trap for sixty-five dollars a month. She transported students to school in her own vehicle. Besides her regular duties of providing instruction and being a classroom custodian, some of her other "duties" as a teacher were trimming hair and pulling baby teeth. She spent nineteen years at Rabbit Trap. Some of her previous students still call to visit or check on her because of her influence on their lives.

Country schools were consolidated and many schools were left empty, so she took a position at Cave Springs Elementary for two years. She then went to Stilwell, working in a special reading program. From there, she went to Maryetta where she remained until retirement in 1983, which gave her a total of thirty-six years as an educator.

Allene had attended Northeastern during much of her teaching career, receiving a B.S. and Master's Degree and later a certificate in learning disabilities. In 1973, she was honored as "Adair County Teacher of the Year" and also received a certificate for "Outstanding Teacher of the Year." When asked about her accomplishments, she replied, "My greatest honor was having taught the children and seeing many of them go on to higher fields in education and have successful careers."

In 1950, Allene married Waco Watkins. He drove a butane truck for many years, and together they worked on their small farm, raising chickens. They had three daughters, Rhonda, Rita and Mary Ann. Rhonda and Rita are teachers and Mary Ann has a position at a local bank.

Grandchildren and great-grandchildren complete the picture. Because of various health problems, including Alzheimer's disease, Waco lived the last four years of his life in a nursing home. Allene was faithful to spend time with him every day until he passed away in 1997.



Up until the last few years, she stayed very active as a volunteer in the Stilwell Memorial Hospital Auxiliary, shopping and helping to stock the gift shop as well as working as the shop clerk at least one day a week. She has also held various offices in her community Home Extension Club and the Retired Teachers Organization. She has been active in her church work, and to this day, if a church member receives a birthday, anniversary, or get-well card, her distinctive penmanship is recognized.

Greatness may often be measured by a person's bank account, the amount of material possessions acquired, or objects named for that person. However, the real strength of a family, a community, or a country is measured by the quality and integrity of the every-day person who gets the job done to the best of his/her ability; who contributes in such a way to make the world a better place. Allene has no great wealth or possessions; she doesn't even have a street or special day named for her, but her true greatness is in her dedication and compassion to her students, her family, her friends, and her community. It has only been in the past several years that her pace has significantly slowed. This is due to a battle with cancer. However, though some days may be particularly difficult and her outlook may get a little cloudy, Allene's overall resolution holds on. She still enjoys a witty sense of humor; she still takes pleasure in the grand and great-grandchildren; she still makes delicious cornbread; she still helps wherever and whenever she can. She perseveres.
