#### RECONCILIATION

Reconciliation is celebrated daily Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday from 7:30am-7:45am.

On Wednesday from 5:30pm-5:45pm.
Saturday from 3 to 3:45pm in the Church's Chapel or by a prearranged appointment with the Priest in the Parish Office.
Schedule may vary during Holy Days of Obligation.

#### **BAPTISM**

The Sacrament of Baptism is a serious obligation. Parents must be registered, active members of the parish for three months prior to the Baptism. Call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

#### **CONFIRMATION**

Confirmation is celebrated annually for the ninth grade students who have completed a two-year preparation program. Adults who wish to be confirmed should call the Parish Office for more information.

#### **MARRIAGE**

Arrangements must be made at least six months in advance. The Catholic party must be a registered active member of our parish for at least 4 months. Weddings are usually celebrated on Saturdays at 11am and 1pm. Call the Parish Office before setting any dates.

#### My Dear Parishioners,

Each year on November 2 we celebrate The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed- All Souls Day. It is not uncommon to find photos and memories of our loved ones around our homes. They serve to remind us of those family members and friends, who are dear to our hearts. Pictures of our deceased relatives help to bring back memories of our life with them. Even though they have died, we believe that we are somehow still connected with them- and we are, through Jesus Christ. In Baptism we were joined to Christ and to one another in what we refer to as the Communion of Saints, which includes the pilgrim Church on earth, those who have died and are being purified, and those who have attained glory in heaven.

The Catechism of Catholic Church tells us, "After that nearly everyone needs to undergo a period of purification before they can enter the glory of heaven."

Todays' Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed offers us the opportunity to pray for those who are in this state of purification. Our reading from the Book of Wisdom reminds us that death is not the last word and that there is life after death. Although we are unable to see or fully understand this, we believe that the dead are in the hands of God. Our journey of Faith leads us beyond death, to the new and eternal Jerusalem where God will comfort us and wipe away every tear.

In today's second reading, Paul says clearly – that it is through the death and Resurrection of Jesus, that we have the promise of everlasting life. Paul says, "while we were still sinners Christ died for us. How much more than, since we are now justified by his Blood, will we be saved through Him." This is the fulfillment of God's promise of eternal life in heaven.

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus reveals that God's will is that everyone who believes in and follows Jesus may have eternal life.

Brothers and Sisters,

Our goal as Christians is to live in eternal glory in the full presence of God. So especially on this day, let us pray for all the faithful departed who have died in Christ. We pray that God will one day bring them-and each of us-into that place where we will see Him in His full glory, in the new and eternal Jerusalem.

Brothers and Sisters, please continue to pray for our deceased members of family, parishioners and friends not only today but during the month of November which according to the Catholic Tradition is dedicated to the prayer for all the Faithfully Departed.

Please continue to pray for peace in the world, stop the violence and wars.


