RECONCILIATION

Reconciliation is celebrated daily Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday from **7:30am-7:45am**.

On Wednesday from **5:30pm-5:45pm**. Saturday from **3 to 3:45pm** in the Church's Chapel or by a prearranged appointment with the Priest in the Parish Office. *Schedule may vary during Holy Days of Obligation.*

BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is a serious obligation. **Parents must be registered, active members of the parish for <u>three</u> <u>months prior</u> to the Baptism.** Call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

CONFIRMATION

Confirmation is celebrated annually for the ninth grade students who have completed a two-year preparation program. Adults who wish to be confirmed should call the Parish Office for more information.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements must be made at least six months in advance. The Catholic party must be registered, active member of our parish. Weddings are usually celebrated on Saturdays at 11am and 1pm. Call the Parish Office before setting any dates.

My Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate Corpus Christi – the most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Jesus gives us his body and blood as a gift. The Catechism lists names for this sacrament that highlight different aspects of it. It is called Eucharist, or thanksgiving. It is also called the Lord's Supper, the Breaking of Bread, the Memorial of the Lord's Passion and Resurrection, the Holy Sacrifice, the Sacred Mysteries, the Most Blessed Sacrament, Holy Communion, the Bread of Angels, Bread from Heaven and Holy Mass. (CCC 1328-32)

It is impossible to capture the richness of the sacrament by simply naming it, and so we look to God's word for further meaning and understanding. In the reading from Genesis, the priest Melchizedek brings bread and wine to celebrate Abraham's victory. He invokes God's blessing on Abraham and blesses God for his works.

The church sees in this celebration feast a figuration of her own offering of bread and wine in the Eucharist. Jesus the priest and king who offers the sacrifice on our behalf through the ordained minister. Because we need this offering of sacrifice for sin, one that will finally reconcile us once again to the Father, the one offering and being offered Jesus Christ must be sinless. In this way there is one sacrifice sufficient for all time, and through our participation in it the Eucharist and its merits are extended.

How does this take place? In his writing to the Corinthians, St. Paul realized all that Jesus did on the night He was handed over – taking bread and wine, giving thanks, breaking it and sharing. St. Paul concludes, "as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim death of the Lord until He comes."

In the Gospel Jesus feeds a crowd of 5,000. After speaking to them about the kingdom of God and healing those who need to be cured, Jesus takes 5 loaves and 2 fish, blesses them, breaks them, and gives them to the disciples to distribute to the crowd. These actions call to mind His institution of the Eucharist and the Last Supper.

Brothers and sisters from these readings, we see that the Eucharist is far more than a celebration meal during which we hear about the Kingdom of God and give thanks for the salvation that Jesus performed for us on the cross. It is a participation in Christ's redemptive work, in which the bread and wine are taken up, alone with our works and prayers, to be transformed into the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ.

His body is blessed and broken for us and given to us to share, so that we might be blessed and broken for others, becoming what we receive and proclaiming the death and resurrection of Christ until He comes again in glory.

Please remember to pray for the Holy Father, Leo XIV, and pray for peace in the world and pray for each other.
