RECONCILIATION

Reconciliation is celebrated daily Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday from **7:30am-7:45am**.

On Wednesday from **5:30pm-5:45pm**. Saturday from **3 to 3:45pm** in the Church's Chapel or by a prearranged appointment with the Priest in the Parish Office. *Schedule may vary during Holy Days of Obligation.*

BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is a serious obligation. **Parents must be registered, active members of the parish for three months prior to the Baptism.** Call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

CONFIRMATION

Confirmation is celebrated annually for the ninth grade students who have completed a two-year preparation program. Adults who wish to be confirmed should call the Parish Office for more information.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements must be made at least **six months in advance. The Catholic party must be a registered active member of our parish for at least 4 months.** Weddings are usually celebrated on Saturdays at 11am and 1pm. Call the Parish Office before setting any dates.

My Dear Parishioners,

Going up a mountain can be a special occasion for anyone who has the opportunity. Jesus often taught His disciples and others on mountains, so they were already special places for Him. But something even more special happened when Jesus took His more intimate disciples - Peter, James, and John - up the mountain with Him. Jesus “was transfigured before them, His face shone like a sun and His clothes became white like a light.” Even more, the prophets Moses and Elijah spoke with Him. But Peter jumped in with plans to do something for Jesus, Elijah, and Moses. But God the father has plans too. He interrupted Peter with words that provided clarity about the vocation Jesus has accepted, and the full identity of who Jesus is “this is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased, listen to Him.”

Upon hearing God’s voice, the disciples prostrated themselves in fear, but Jesus touched them and told them not to be afraid. He has received His vocation and was even more ready to teach. The disciples vocation was to listen.

What about us today? What are we to learn? What are we to do? What is our vocation as adults, as teenagers, and as children?

The first step is obvious and comes straight from our heavenly Father - we are to listen to His beloved Son. Our vocation right now, at whatever age, is to listen to Jesus by being loving and self-giving. But how do we do that?

We might think that Peter, James, John, and the rest of the disciples were the lucky or blessed ones because they lived and worked with Jesus. They heard Him speak and teach. What about us? We are in a different place, a different world. We do not see Jesus in the flesh as His disciples did. But we are equally Jesus disciples, equally called to listen, equally called to respond to the gift of our salvation by being loving and self-giving. How are we going to do that?

Perhaps one way of listening is looking at how Jesus lived, at how He taught His disciples to be loving and self-giving. What do those words mean to us today?

To be loving and self-giving is not necessarily strongly heroic, though it can be difficult at times. Look at the situation you find yourself in and see if there is some little thing you can do such as offering a smile, a kind word, a helping hand with heavy package. Right at the moment you find yourself in how can you be loving or self-giving? Even a simple act or word can shine God’s loving light on you because you, too, are God’s beloved.



Fast and Abstinence Guidelines

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the Parish Priest should be consulted. Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent.

The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Baptism or renewal of Baptism at Easter.


