RECONCILIATION

Reconciliation is celebrated daily Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday from **7:30am-7:45am**.

On Wednesday from **5:30pm-5:45pm**. Saturday from **3 to 3:45pm** in the Church's Chapel or by a prearranged appointment with the Priest in the Parish Office. *Schedule may vary during Holy Days of Obligation.*

BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is a serious obligation. **Parents must be registered, active members of the parish for three months prior to the Baptism.** Call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

CONFIRMATION

Confirmation is celebrated annually for the ninth grade students who have completed a two-year preparation program. Adults who wish to be confirmed should call the Parish Office for more information.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements must be made at least **six months in advance. The Catholic party must be a registered active member of our parish for at least 4 months.** Weddings are usually celebrated on Saturdays at 11am and 1pm. Call the Parish Office before setting any dates.

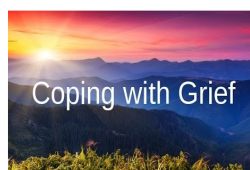

Wellness tips for surviving a heat wave

Prepare your home

- Install an air conditioner if possible, regular maintenance for optimal efficiency
- Seal any gaps in windows to block hot air
- Use curtains/drapes/shades to reduce heat indoors.

Cook with countertop appliances

- A microwave or air fryer.
- Prepare no-cook meals like sandwiches and salads.

Limit time outside

- Temperatures above 90 degrees, limit outdoor activities,
- Wear loose, lightweight clothing made of breathable fabrics like cotton or linen,
- Stay hydrated, especially before going outside.
- Identify cool community spaces, i.e. libraries, malls, etc. where you can seek relief.

Recognize the signs of heat-related illnesses

The [CDC](#) says heat exhaustion is the body's response to an excessive loss of water and salt, usually through sweating.

Symptoms of heat exhaustion:

- tiredness or weakness
- heavy sweating
- clammy skin

Heatstroke, the most serious heat-related illness, occurs when the body can no longer control its temperature.

Symptoms of heatstroke:

- confusion,
- headaches,
- nausea
- body temperature of 103 F or higher.

Seek medical attention immediately.

From Tarps to Generators, Residents Can Now Buy Disaster Supplies Tax-Free Year-Round

VOLUSIA COUNTY, FLORIDA – A permanent statewide sales tax exemption is now in effect for a wide range of disaster preparedness supplies, allowing residents to save money while preparing for hurricanes, wildfires, and other emergency events. The new law helps Floridians offset the cost of essential items and encourages early preparation for emergencies.

The exemption applies to many commonly used emergency supplies, including batteries, portable generators, fire extinguishers, and waterproof tarps, among others. By removing the sales tax burden, the measure supports families looking to build or replenish their disaster supply kits, not just during hurricane season, but year-round for any emergency situations that may arise.

The list of tax-exempt items includes:

- Batteries (AA-cell, AAA-cell, C-cell, D-cell, 6-volt or 9-volt)
- Fire extinguishers
- Insect repellent
- Life jackets
- Portable gas or diesel cans (5 gallons or less)
- Portable generators
- Smoke detection devices and carbon monoxide alarms
- Waterproof tarps (1,000 square feet or less)
- Sunscreen
- Ground anchor systems and tie-down kits

Residents are strongly encouraged to prepare well in advance, before a storm is on the horizon or another unexpected emergency occurs. High-demand items like gas cans, tarps, batteries, and generators often sell out quickly, leaving many scrambling in the final days leading up to a hurricane. By taking advantage of the sales tax exemption early, families can avoid last-minute stress and ensure they have the critical supplies needed to stay safe and self-sufficient during and after a storm.
