- The concessions team is getting ready for the cheer comp at the high school next weekend – the biggest concessions event of the year. Just two weeks later, we will also be hosting districts for Girls Wrestling.
- Winter sports are wrapping up. The concessions team is building out the spring sports volunteer sign-up and preparing the outside stand to reopen for spring sports.
- Donations to the away concessions stand in the stadium have all been put to great use – thank you! Donated flooring is also in the works.
- A question re: food licensing levels was asked. Concessions falls under the school’s licensing (Level 3).
- Middle School concessions have reported a good winter of events and are also preparing to move back outside for the spring sports season.

Football: Coach Crager gave an update on the loan from BWAB to the team. They are now in a good position to pay back the loan and authorized the treasurer to move those funds at her earliest convenience.

Cindy Erndt from Big Walnut Civic Association joined us to share that 1) applications for the Big Walnut Education Foundation scholarships are at the end of the month; please pay close attention to the directions; and 2) the greater Sunbury area is an America 250 city for the nation’s 250th anniversary this year, which will create many local celebratory events. The Civic Association encourages our high school teams to take advantage of the fundraising opportunities those events create through team volunteerism, including things like cleaning up after the July 4th parade or doing something creative at Sunbury Sizzle & Sound. Reeb raised the idea of the Boosters taking over the spring mulch fundraiser from football, who has traditionally held that event but has declined to do so in recent years. A hearty



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discussion followed about the logistics for such an event, what would be offered in terms of delivery to homes, and potential issues. Two possible dates were floated: March 21/22 and April 11/12. The minimum commitment for ordering the mulch is 3,500 bags. The discussion led to the conclusion that a survey would be sent to teams in the coming weeks to determine their interest and/or availability.

New BWAB board members were introduced. Brooke Skinner will be joining as Secretary, Aaron Mix as Fundraiser, and Michael Colvin as Vice President. Whitney Hoge and Nick Paeden will also be joining the board and look forward to meeting everyone.
