Uley Parish Council

Parking

Parking in the village is ever more difficult - The Parish Council would respectfully ask residents and visitors to park with consideration throughout the village.

Uley has become increasingly busy in recent years whilst available parking remains limited, particularly during school drop-off and pick-up times along South Street where congestion can become significant. Parking opposite South Street on The Street can be particularly dangerous due to restricted road widths and poor visibility; it is also illegal to park opposite a junction. Woodstock Terrace is a narrow dead-end road where parking and turning space are extremely limited, resulting in difficult and potentially hazardous manoeuvring at times.

The Parish Council would ask that care is taken not to obstruct access, pavements, driveways or visibility for pedestrians and other road users.

The Knoll

The long-awaited Housing Committee meeting when the Knoll is to be discussed is billed for 7pm on 9th June 2026 in the Council Chamber at Ebley Mill (Ebley Wharf, Stroud, GL5 4UB)

You will remember that the report of our public meeting, voicing villagers' concerns about the proposed development, prompted this committee to demand that the matter be brought back to committee once all the infrastructure queries raised in that report had been addressed.

Anyone may attend this meeting and ask up to three questions or present a petition. If you wish to ask a question you should inform democratic.services@stroud.gov.uk by email by midday, four clear working days before the meeting. Please see the SDC website 'Get involved in Council Decisions'. Members of the Parish Council will attend this meeting. From the Churchwardens

Greetings from the Church Wardens. We (David and Nikki) are delighted to be serving a second year in our roles and look forward to the year ahead. The annual church meeting on the 10th of May was followed this year by a service of celebration, giving a chance to look back at the year past - both the successes and the areas where there is room for improvement - and to look forward to the year ahead. We especially thanked those who have stepped down from the PCC after many years of service - Moya Wallis and Liz Rymer - and welcomed Roland McCormack, Sue Scott and Malcolm Trigg as they join our PCC. We give thanks also to all who contribute to the life of the church within our communities, both inside and outside of our buildings, serving our neighbours and welcoming visitors.

We wrote last month about the failure of the St Giles clock chiming mechanism. We have now received the report of the required repairs, which will entail dismantling the clock and removing it to the clockmaker's workshop, manufacturing two replacement gear wheels, re-assembling and testing

it at works before returning it to the church. A costly operation, but we hope that the Friends of St Giles will consider contributing generously to this project to get our clock telling the village the time once more.

There is much to look forward to in these summer months, with regular Sunday Evensong at Holy Cross, the return of the popular rounders match organised by the Friends of St Giles, and an exhibition in St Giles of paintings of local views by Anna Summers. Please do pop in and see her work from 14th -20th June

Church Letter

Uley Church of England Voluntary Controlled (VC) Primary School has its origins deeply rooted in the generosity of the people of Uley, the imaginative fund-raising efforts of some artistic local women and, I presume, the willingness of a rather handsome methodist preacher to pose for his portrait! Thanks to the funds raised, and the land gifted, the working- class children of Uley had their own village school, way back in the 1820's.

*The two eldest daughters (Fanny and Caroline) of Edward Sheppard of Sheppard's Mill started raising funds for the new school in about 1823, in part by persuading local families (and their father's customers) to subscribe for prints of a portrait which Fanny had painted of Rowland Hill, a fashionable local Methodist preacher. Their efforts facilitated the opening of the initial school building in 1828 and an extension in 1833. The school was known as the "National School" as it came under the aegis of the National Society for Promoting Religious Education (in accordance with Church of England doctrine).**

So, here we are 200 years on, with a school that continues to live out its Christian foundation with

a vision for children, staff and the wider community to Live, Learn and Flourish – like a tree planted by streams of water, created, transformed and sustained: bearing fruit, being a nurturing environment, putting down deep roots for stability, drawing in water for life. At a time when violence and hatred are saturating our screens and newspapers, we must continue to work together to be this different kind of community.

As school we've been reflecting on how our vision is connected to its Christian Foundation and are finding ourselves talking about God as the One who creates, transforms, and sustains – I wonder how you experience these movements in your life? I've been thinking a lot about how, in prayer, we can offer memories to God, the One who made us, knows us and loves us, and receive them back in unexpected ways. Situations that were painful or regretful not simply left to fester but offered, and returned somehow redeemed. I suspect we will all have examples of these moments of grace.

Two hundred years ago, families benefited from the grace and generosity of people who had the

vision for the working people of Uley to have free provision for their children.

We are invited once again to be part of something life-giving. With support from the Department of Education, Uley Primary School has plans to build a nursery to expand its provision for pre-school children. I really hope that we will enjoy supporting this venture in whatever way we can, having fun raising money, or simply putting our hand in our pocket to give generously.

Are there any artists who would like to put on an exhibition? Perhaps we could even find someone willing to pose for a portrait – but not a local preacher this time!

What are your ideas?

What graces will we discover as we work on this together?

I now have access to 6 raised loo seats, 2 frames for the loo, several pairs of crutches, walking sticks, indoor Rollator with tray and cup holder (no seat), substantial adjustable shower seat, lightweight folding wheelchair, more substantial folding wheelchair, fancy posh commode, a very good firm chair, high backed with wings, *several very good firm seat cushions, and grabbers. It's amazing how many times you drop something, frustratingly not able to bend down to pick up!!!

No costs, this is not a charity, just people's goodwill.

Garden Notes

June has got to be a gardeners 'happy month'. Stand still and you can almost see the plants growing - that includes the weeds of course! The days are at their longest giving 18 hours to photosynthesis and GROW.

Watering

As the temperature rises so do the watering needs of plants. Most vulnerable are those in pots. Don't be a sprinkler.. give each big pot a watering can full. If you planted a tree or shrubs last year don't forget to keep them hydrated this year too. Creating a doughnut depression around the stem allow the water to focus on the rootball, not running off and also encouraging the roots to go down to find water rather than staying at the surface.

Hopefully you have a water butt or two (sounds obvious but make sure to elevate it to fit your can underneath the tap) It's amazing how much water is collected off even a small roof and the plants love rainwater. For those with a bit more horizontal space, a dipping or dunk tank is a brilliant option. Visit our local agricultural store and get a galvanised trough in whatever size you fancy. I love them for planting too.

Extra Hungry Plants

Plants that are expected to produce an extravaganza of fruits or flowers.. think -

- Tomatoes
- Sweet peas
- Roses

All like rich soil, a feed of nitrogen (tomato feed) and water. Tomatoes and Sweet peas weekly, Roses monthly with good rose food.

Remember No Mow May!?

I hope you're still embracing some form of this if you have a lawn. Here are some options now :-

- Continue to let it grow
- Let a section keep growing (this can get the creative juices flowing)
- Mow with blades set at highest and reduce gradually

Shopping online? Beware of retail scams

Buying something online and finding that it looks nothing like the images shown is very frustrating. Retail scams where sellers deliberately mislead people and make refunds difficult to obtain are becoming increasingly common.

Some companies convince people they're based in the UK by using **deceiving brand names, UK websites or postal addresses**. Low-quality items are then shipped from overseas and look nothing like the images advertised. Refunds require costly international return shipping fees, which puts many people off - the sellers count on it.

If you've been caught out and paid by debit or credit card, you may be able to get a refund using the chargeback scheme. Credit card purchases between £100 - £30,000 may be covered by section 75. For help with online shopping problems or other consumer issues, call the national **Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline 0808 233133**.

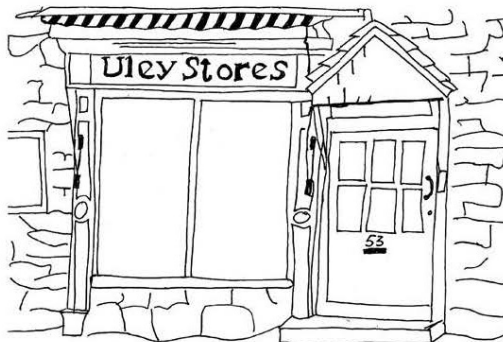

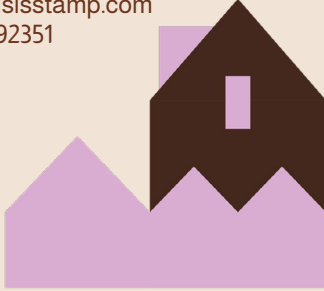
