GOSPEL READING

Luke 14:25-33

²⁵ Now large crowds were traveling with him, and he turned and said to them, ²⁶ "Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple. ²⁷ Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. ²⁸ For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it? ²⁹ Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, ³⁰ saying, 'This fellow began to build and was not able to finish.' ³¹ Or what king, going out to wage war against another king, will not sit down first and consider whether he is able with ten thousand to oppose the one who comes against him with twenty thousand? ³² If he cannot, then while the other is still far away, he sends a delegation and asks for the terms of peace. ³³ So therefore, none of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions."

NOTES ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC

As the anniversary of 9/11 nears, today's special music offers a look to the past, to the present, and to the future. No matter where we were that day, we still live with the memory and endure the effects of that day.

The handbell music, "Parting," was written following the attack on the Twin Towers. As the composer slept on the West Coast, she was unaware that her father was dving in the impact zone on the East Coast. Sleeping, she didn't know that a parting was taking place. The song begins peacefully, becomes agitated, and resolves quietly.

The anthem "This Is My Song" speaks to the love we feel for our country and to the dreams we share. In these divided days, however, it reminds us that others around the globe also love their lands and dream just as we do, that we have much more in common than we have in differences.

The anthem "I Believe" sets to music a poem by an anonymous Jewish prisoner in a German concentration camp. Found written on the wall in the camp, its simple words are a consummate statement of hope and faith. Even in the darkest times, the sun still shines, love still lives, and God is still present. His spirit is heard in the quietness of the ending.
