FEE WAIVER INFORMATION

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Eligible students may apply for a fee waiver of "waivable fees" on this schedule. To apply for a waiver of all "waivable fees", complete and submit the School Fee Waiver Application (Grades 7-12) form found at the link below:

Students may apply for a fee waiver at any time during the year and may reapply multiple times during a single year. Once a fee waiver is granted, all fees will be waived retroactively beginning July 1st for the current school year. Income verification will be required to validate eligibility for a fee waiver.

2026-27 Individual Student Fee Waiver Annual Limit. The maximum total annual amount a student may receive for approved fee waivers is \$5,000 (excluding school meals). Any fees that a fee waiver approved student incurs above this amount will be charged to the student.

Limit of Trips with 2 or More Nights. Beginning in the 2026-27 school year, Utah law limits the number of trips covered by a fee waiver for trips that are for two or more nights (excluding athletic trips). The first non-athletics trip that is for two or more nights is automatically covered by an approved fee waiver. A student who qualifies for a fee waiver may request a waiver for the fee for a second trip for two or more nights if the student:

- (a) meets with the principal or an individual the principal assigns; and
- (b) develops an action plan with the principal that includes school-related contributions, including:
 - (i) performing custodial work;
 - (ii) participating in school-related service programs; or
 - (iii) completing other contributions that the principal, or an individual the principal assigns, approves.

The action plan shall:

- (a) match a student's abilities and availability;
- (b) consider a student's individual circumstances;
- (c) specify the type and duration of the contribution to the school or community; and
- (d) avoid interference with a student's academic or personal responsibilities.

Application Confidentiality: Emery County School District has put in place specific procedures to maintain fee waiver application confidentiality. School program leaders do not have access to fee waiver application information.

FEE WAIVER INFORMATION

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Right to Appeal. IF YOU DISAGREE WITH THIS DECISION, YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO APPEAL. To appeal, send a letter (or the Notice of Appeal form printed at the bottom of this page) to the principal/charter school director, explaining why you disagree with this decision. Include your name, your child's name, and the date. YOU MUST MAIL OR HAND DELIVER YOUR APPEAL WITHIN TEN SCHOOL DAYS OF RECEIVING THIS NOTICE. Keep a copy of the appeal for your records. A school representative will contact you within two weeks after receiving your appeal and schedule a meeting to discuss your concerns. 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Emery County School District Board of Education Public Hearings Proposed High School Fees

The Emery County School District Board of Education will conduct public hearings to consider annual proposed school fees that are developed with recommendations and input from local school administrators, faculty, and staff. The proposed fee schedules include spending plans that explain the anticipated types of uses for each school fee, a total amount that students may be charged for each school-sponsored course and activity, and a maximum total aggregate amount that a student may be charged annually. **Public hearings will be held during the regularly scheduled February and March meetings.**
