


## Emery School District CSTAG Threat Assessment Response Plan



### **Purpose**

This plan establishes procedures for identifying, assessing, and managing threats of violence in compliance with CSTAG, Utah Code §53G-8, and Utah Administrative Rules R277-400 and R277-401.

### **Guiding Principles**

- Focus on behavior, not profiles
- Prevent violence before it occurs
- Team-based decision making
- Balance safety, support, and due process

### **Threat Assessment Team**

Principal or Designee (Lead)

School Counselor or Mental Health Professional

School Resource Officer / Law Enforcement Liaison

District Safety Specialist

School Safety Specialist

School Representative with the closest involvement to threat

Additional members as needed

### **Threat Classification**

Transient Threats: emotional, no sustained intent

Substantive Threats: credible intent, planning, or weapon access

## **Utah-Specific CSTAG Flowchart**

1. Threat reported
2. Administrator triage
  - If imminent: call 911, initiate SRP
  - If not imminent: convene TAT
3. Information gathering
4. Threat classification
5. Intervention plan
6. Documentation and follow-up
