## 2025: A Rare Year to Feast! (And Honor)

2025 has been special for numerous reasons!

We began this year inaugurating the Jubilee of Hope, the first Jubilee in 25 years of the ordinary cycle since the Great Jubilee of 2000 (and first in 9 years since the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy in 2016).

Months later, our Holy Father Pope Francis passed away unexpectedly on Easter Monday, after he seemed to be slowly recovering from recent health struggles. (Born Jorge Mario Bergolio, Francis' 2013 papal election was historic: first Pope born in the Americas, particularly Argentina, South America, and first from a religious order, in his case, a Jesuit.) Weeks later, history was made when the first Pope born in North America and the USA, and second from a religious order, was elected: Robert Francis Cardinal Prevost, an Augustinian, who is now named Leo XIV!

We just concluded the Easter season on Pentecost, the Church's birthday, which celebrates the Holy Spirit coming to those first apostles of the Risen Christ. We are in the longest season of the year, part 2 of Ordinary Time, when we live out our faith in everyday life.

Yet, we look forward to more events this year: the 2025th birthday of our Lord (Christmas) and the canonization of Blessed Carlos Acutis! (Acutis will be the first Saint born in the 3rd millennium; he was devoted to the Eucharist and used his computer skills to evangelize Eucharistic miracles! He passed away young from leukemia.) We celebrated in May the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea, from which we were given the Nicene Creed, which we say in the profession of faith!

One thing we may overlook, though, is the rare opportunity to feast (and honor) on certain Sundays of Ordinary Time! Every year, some feasts with fixed dates are celebrated over the Ordinary Time liturgy. It is rare for them to fall on a Sunday; this year graces us with 5 of these feasts! In order, they are:

1. February 2, Presentation of the Lord: celebrates the Infant Jesus being consecrated to God in the temple 40 days after His birth. It is also called Candlemas because candles are traditionally lighted at Mass, symbolizing Jesus being a light to the nations, and foretelling His Passion, Death, and Resurrection.

2. June 29, Saints Peter and Paul: June 2025 has the rarity of a feast every Sunday: our Lord's Ascension to Heaven, Pentecost, Holy Trinity, Corpus Christi (Body and Blood of Christ), and those two Saints! Peter and Paul were the most important of the apostles. Their lives were different yet similar: they walked different paths to Christ, established in Rome the Church's first diocese, spread the faith to different parts of the world, and were martyred in Rome on (tradition has it) the same day.

3. September 14, Exaltation of the Holy Cross: celebrated on the anniversary of the dedication of the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher (site of our Lord's burial and Resurrection), it recalls when fragments of the Cross our Divine Savior was crucified on were found by Saint Helena during the basilica's construction. (Helena was the mother of Roman emperor Constantine, who first allowed Christianity to be practiced freely.)

4. November 2, All Souls Day: honors our dearly departed, to whom we commend them to God in Heaven.

November 9, Dedication of the Lateran Basilica: celebrates the most important church in the world: the Basilica of Saint John Lateran (not St. Peter's) in Rome. It is the Cathedral, and therefore home church, of the Bishop of Rome, who is none other than the Pope. (Cathedral comes from the Greek word cathedra, meaning chair; a cathedral has the bishop's chair, symbolizing his role.)

How blessed we are to live out our faith in this special year!

#### Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

What do you call brothers who are born on the same day? Twins, of course. That is what we celebrate today in the inestimable saints, Peter and Paul. Wait: twins? Yes. The early Church believed that Peter and Paul were martyred in Rome on the same day. Since the day of martyrdom is celebrated as a saints' birth into eternal life, the result is striking: Peter and Paul are twins in God's family, the Church.

Who should care about this? Well, anyone who longs to live in a world marked by love and peace. Remember, the Romans believed that twins, Romulus and Remus, founded their city through an act of fratricide, the former murdering the latter. Sadly, the structures of this fallen world emerge through violence between those who should love each other. But in the Church, a new city has been founded upon this new set of twins, embodying the non-violent power of Jesus' cross and resurrection.

That's why traditional icons represent Peter and Paul in a fraternal and warm embrace. Contrasted with the violence of Rome's founders, it challenges us with a bold claim: do we believe that structures of merciful love are more powerful and lasting than those based on power, violence, and domination? Am I willing to see others in my life as my "twin," with whom I am called to give my life for Christ, or as my rival? Am I committed to living what is embodied in Romulus and Remus, or in Peter and Paul?


