



What Kind of King Is Christ? (And Why Is Saint Luke My Favorite Gospel Writer?) Ken Erguiza, Music Minister

The final Sunday of the Church year celebrates Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. We have had kings throughout history: Ramses of Egypt, Caesar of Rome, Herod of Judea, Alexander of Greece, Louis of France, Ferdinand of Spain, and currently Charles of England. Each had or will have a legacy following his reign. But Jesus still reigns today, and His legacy is enduring! But what kind of king was and is Christ, and what kind of king will He be?

This liturgical year, year C, we have been answering this question through the gospel of Saint Luke. Every liturgical year, we proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ from one of three evangelists: Luke, which we drew upon this liturgical year C; Saint Matthew, which we will reflect on in the coming year A; and Saint Mark for year B. Interspersed each year is the gospel of Saint John. The simple answer: Jesus is the king of love. It's no coincidence we have a hymn called The King of Love My Shepherd Is! In Luke's gospel, we recount events in our Lord's life to support that truth:

- His birth on Christmas. The Messiah who would save His people didn't come as a warrior king with physical might; rather, He came as a helpless, adorable child whose first throne was a stable.
- He healed numerous people spiritually and physically. Christ cured a leper, paralytic, a man possessed by demons, a woman with a hemorrhage, and a blind man. He even raised from death to life the daughter of a synagogue
- official
- He showed love and mercy in the face of sin and faithlessness. Our Lord, while at the house of a Pharisee,
- pardoned a sinful woman who anointed His feet with her tears. He forgave the disciples' lack of faith when they did
 not recognize Him on the road to Emmaus. But His greater act one of the reasons Luke's gospel is my favorite –
 was when He was dying on the throne of the cross: He forgave the repentant, good thief, who was crucified alongside Him. (Before this, He forgave those who crucified Him.)

(Another reason Luke's gospel is my favorite is he lets the lives of our Divine Savior and everyone around Him tell us who God is, which inspires us to hope, fittingly in this Jubilee year of Hope.)

In the psalm of Easter Sunday, we sang in thanksgiving of how the risen Jesus is the king of love: "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good, His mercy endures forever! Let the house of Israel say, His mercy endures forever!"

We are inspired to imitate His enduring love - the call to be saints - but how do we do this? Our Lord answers this question in numerous ways as we reflect on the gospels, but the one in Matthew's, which we reflect on a year from now on this feast, is striking: "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me. [...] Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me." The abovementioned kings can do or have done any of those deeds - the works of mercy - but their example and our own deeds, we hope, are rooted in Christ.

As we close one liturgical year and enter another, let us give thanks to God for His son Jesus Christ our sovereign king of love! And then, let us imitate our king's works of love, so that we may hear Him say: "Come, share your master's joy!", and be brought to the glory of heaven! Below is an image of the Santo Niño de Cebu, one of the titles given to Jesus venerated by Catholics in the Philippines. It shows the Christ child as a king.









In Sympathy Armido Vasari February 1938 - November 2025

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Not long ago, I was called to a hospital to anoint a woman in her early 80s. She was dying, and visibly in pain. But what struck me most wasn't her suffering — it was the atmosphere in the room. She had eight children and 30 foster kids, and many of them were gathered around her. You'd expect sorrow, fear, maybe even despair. But the room was filled with something else entirely — a quiet strength, a kind of sweetness. It was as if she was suffering not just with them, but for them. And they, in love, were suffering for her. The pain was real. But so was the peace. I didn't want to run. I felt as if I was in a little paradise, beeping machines and all.

I think of that moment when I hear today's Gospel. Jesus, hanging on the cross, doesn't look like a king. But one of the crucified, dying men beside him sees through the suffering and says, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom" (Luke 23:42). That word — remember — literally means to make someone a member again. He's asking to be joined to Christ, to become part of his Body. And Jesus says, "Today you will be with me in paradise."

He doesn't say, "I'll take your suffering away." He says, **"You will be with me."**

That's the strange power of Christ the King. He doesn't rule by avoiding suffering. He reigns by entering into it, and transforming it with love.

What are you suffering right now in your life? Likely you want it to stop. But if we are willing to suffer with him — paradise begins even today.




