
Y6 enjoyed making tomato soup in their Design and Technology lesson.

# AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS



#### Podcast Club - Year 4-6 - Wednesday

The Podoast Club is open to all Year 4, 5, and 6 students who love talking, storytelling, or discovering and sharing interesting new things. In this club, they'll get the chance to create their very own podoasts, whether that means sharing fun stories, interviewing friends or teachers, or talking about cool topics!

#### Mad Science KS1 (Tue), KS2 (Thur)

Particle Physics & Astrophysics
In this module, pupils will learn how matter works
on a microscopic level, exploring atoms,
molecules and particles through hands-on
experiments with balloons, bubbles and slime.
They will also investigate the wonders of space,
including black holes, the solar system and human
space exploration, developing a strong
understanding of both the tiny building blocks of
our world and the vast universe and beyond

#### Coding Year 182 - Monday

KS1 – Tynker Adventures

Young coders set off on exciting journeys through mystical worlds while learning the core foundations of programming, sequences, events, loops, conditionals, and booleans. Through interactive games and problem-solving challenges, pupils build creativity, logical thinking, and resilience as they bring their code to life one adventure at a time.

#### Coding Year 3-6 - Tue & Fri

KS2 – JavaScript Explorers
As pupils advance, they dive into one of the world's most powerful and widely used coding languages, JavaScript. They'll learn to write real lines of code, explore complex syntax, and create interactive digital projects that mirror what real programmers do.

### Creative Me - Reception Year 182 - Mon

Our Creative Me club is aimed at younger children who want to have fun and get creative. We'll be mainly doing Baker Ross style arts & crafts and mixing in some drama, fine art and computational creative

art.
