Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a lively and inspiring week at Selwyn Primary School, filled with learning, creativity, and opportunities to connect as a community. You may have noticed our new attendance poster displayed at the school gates, showing just how much learning time can be lost when children miss even a few days of school. For example, an attendance rate of 90% means a child misses around 19 days of learning in a year — almost a full month of school!

At Selwyn Primary School, we are committed to ensuring every child achieves their very best, and regular attendance is key to this. Please help by making sure your child attends school every day, arrives on time, and only stays home when they are genuinely unwell. Our focus will be how we can work together to further improve attendance, and one simple but effective idea is to create consistent morning routines at home—preparing school bags, uniforms and lunches the night before can make mornings calmer and help children arrive at school ready to learn and on time. Every lesson really does matter — together we can make every day count for our children.

Our Year 2 classes visited St Paul's Cathedral, exploring its fascinating history and architecture, while Year 5 Beech and Aspen classes enjoyed a visit to the British Museum, enriching their learning about the Ancient Greeks. We also welcomed parents for our new Reception Open Day for the 2026 intake—thank you to everyone who attended and took the time to learn more about life at Selwyn.

Our Nursery parents' coffee morning was another lovely opportunity to meet families and share ideas on supporting children through the early stages of their learning journey. Meanwhile, pupils from Years 3, 4, 5, and 6 took part in the interschool athletics competition on Friday 10th October, demonstrating great effort, sportsmanship, and competitive spirit throughout the day.

Looking ahead, next week we will begin collecting dry goods as part of our Harvest collection, supporting local food banks and soup kitchens. This initiative will be led by our Charity Leaders from the 13th October. On Monday the 13th October, Friends of Selwyn School (FOSS) will also be running their Spooky Costume Swap event, helping families prepare for Halloween in a sustainable and fun way. On 17th October, we look forward to hosting our general coffee morning at 9am—an informal chance to meet, share ideas, and discuss a range of school matters. Later that day, the children will enjoy their Halloween disco, always a highlight of the term! A huge thank you to our Friends of Selwyn members (FOSS) for organising this for the children and Selwyn community.

As always, thank you for your continued support and encouragement. Working together, we can ensure that every child feels valued, inspired, and ready to make the most of every learning opportunity here at Selwyn.
