## MEALS ON WHEELS...THE MINISTRY

If you are anything like me, you ask yourself, “What can I do to further give back?” Well, though I would always say I don’t do enough, one avenue of giving back I have found very satisfying is volunteering for Meals on Wheels. Afterall, I am delivering food and social contact to people yearning for both. It might just be an outreach you would enjoy too. A number of you, at our church are already engaged in Meals on Wheels, and know the ropes better than I do. But if you are curious, let me tell you all about it.

Our church does a route for an entire month, every third month. We deliver Monday through Friday, on a volunteer basis. Generally, we do the same route, the blue route, every time. Though some of the names change, most remain the same. That is nice, as we can develop rapport with those we serve, a bond, if you will. We pick up our meals at the back door (it’s marked Meals on Wheels) Guardian Angels, on Evans, off of Main Street about 10:30. Generally, we deliver 6-10 meals, and it takes about an hour.

There are hot and cold bags. We have a directory with addresses. I use my GPS on my phone or my car dashboard to help me find directions and go about my route. They must have a slick program for routing us, as goes in a logical manner. When you have delivered all of your meals drop your bags back off. Simple as that.

An added benefit is that you might find someone who would like to ride along with you. Pastor Nora rode along with me last week and we had a great time, and our clients loved meeting her. It is a great time to get to know someone better, and that is always a good deal. I deliver every month our church is assigned. If anyone would like to ride along with me to get to know what it is all about, I would be happy to pick you up at the church for a ride along. If you do Meals on Wheels, your clients smile is thanks enough. If you haven’t tried it, you should.

With SNAP benefits reduced for many in our community, Congregational Life has begun imagining ways Union UCC could respond. From partnering with local restaurants to exploring a recurring community meal, the discussion has been full of energy and hope, a reminder that service and fellowship are intertwined. Research will begin to connect with local businesses, explore safe redistribution of perishable food, and envision the next steps in supporting those who are hungry or marginalized.



Jingle Bingo, brought a festive luncheon of pasta, salads, desserts, and laughter, with M&Ms for bingo markers and holiday prizes generously donated by the congregation.

Congregational Life is planning spring events and ongoing service opportunities. A Spring Garage Sale on March 21 will invite neighbors to linger at our church, while monthly volunteer sessions at CAER will provide hands-on support to children in need.

Inside the church, the rollout of updated name tags is in the works, to ensure that everyone can display their name and pronouns if they wish, as well as including our new church logo, helping to reinforce our commitment to welcome and inclusion.



Caring for each other is at the heart of our work. Whether coordinating a meal, organizing a holiday event, or preparing to serve the wider community, these efforts reflect a living faith. A faith that values hospitality, service, and connection. In Congregational Life, small acts of planning, generosity, and collaboration ripple outward, shaping a community that is compassionate, joyful, and ready to meet the world with open hands.

## Housing for Homeless Youth: Open Doors and Union Church Parsonage

The Housing Implementation team of Open Doors has been meeting at Union since September to plan for the July (hopefully) opening of the parsonage as a residence for homeless youth, 18-24 years old. Each member of the team has generated a list of tasks to be carried out in the coming months. This task list can be viewed on the wall of the Chorister room downstairs in the church. In October, a meeting with neighborhood residents addressed plans and concerns, allowing neighbors to ask questions and become more informed about the project. Since then, meetings of the Implementation team have centered on discussions of core values and goals for the project, staffing schedules, and plans for donations. Much more work has yet to be done, but there is much excitement mixed with the strong desire to make this project succeed.

Our silent auction featured a variety of donated items, all of which found new homes, raising over \$2,000 to support the church's capital campaign.

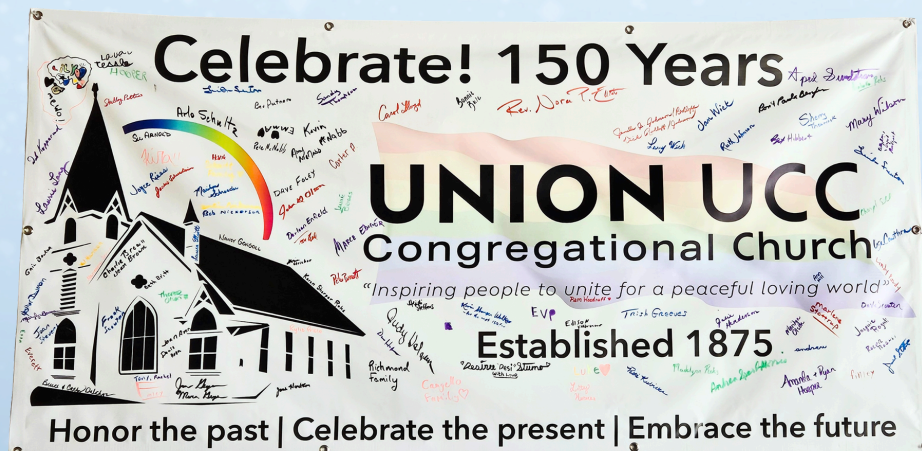


## Sunday Worship
