MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

The Marion County Quorum Court held their monthly meeting beginning at 6 p.m.

County Judge Massey presided over the meeting. All Justices were present. Justice Brigham gave the invocation and Justice Madden led the pledge.

The minutes and all reports were approved. During the Treasurer's report, Justice Brigham asked when the jail was going to be paid off. Treasurer Purdome did not know the answer to the question, but Judge Massey stated that he would find out and let the Justices know.

Justice Madden made a motion to read the ordinances by title only, Justice McCalla seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

Old Business:

Ordinance 2022-11 – Library – Personnel Policy – Sponsored by Justices McCalla, Brigham and Nickels. This was the third reading of this ordinance which will amend the Personnel Policy to include the normal working hours for the Marion County Library. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

New Business:

Ordinance 2022-28 – 2021 Budget – Clerical Errors – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance correct two clerical errors in the 2021 operation budget. Receipt #28059 was entered into the County Library fund (3008) in the amount of \$10368.00. This amount should have been put into the Library State Aid fund (3088). In addition, \$115.50 was moved from the Property Tax Relief fund (6003) to County General fund (1000). The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-29 – Treasurer's Commission – Sponsored by Justice Scrima. This ordinance is an appropriation ordinance to transfer Treasurer's Commission from fund 6000 for the expenses of the Treasurer's office for the year 2021. This ordinance will transfer \$172045.49 to the various funds entitled to the reimbursement. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Scrima. However, an error was pointed out by Treasurer Purdome and so the ordinance needed to be amended for the correct amount of \$172941.75.

County Attorney John Russo noted that in the motion to amend it should also state who was responsible for making the amendment. The motion to amend the ordinance and for the Treasurer to make the change was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-30 – Road Department – Appropriation – Sponsored by Justice Shipman. This ordinance appropriates \$20000.00 from the County Road fund (2000) to the line items of 2000-0200-5005 – Note Principal (\$16266.30) and 2000-0200-5006 Note Interest (\$3733.70). These funds will be used to make the payments on a 2022 Sany Roiad Grander (SMG2000C-8, S/N PY1120CA0385 through Arvest Bank. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-31 – Sales Tax – Percentage Breakdown – Eventually sponsored by Justices Brigham, Madden and McCalla. This ordinance did not have sponsors before the beginning of the meeting. Justices Brigham, Madden and McCalla agreed to sponsor. This ordinance adopts Ordinances 82-15 and 84-1 and incorporates them as the distribution of Sales Tax funds. Therefore, the distribution listed in Ordinance 2021-112 as amended to read as follows:

45.00%	County Road Improvements
21.00%	Law Enforcement
21.00%	Solid Waste (Transfer Station)
13.00%	Rural Fire Departments

This ordinance is necessary to satisfy a request from the auditors to be in compliance with Ark. Code Ann. 14-14-905(b)(B)(2). The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

In other business, Assessor Tonya Eppes asked to be placed on the agenda to discuss a court order. Eppes had presented Judge Massey with a court order to move the money in her Machinery and Equipment line item into her Computer Software line item and Judge Massey declined to sign it. The software is to pay for the services of Datascout, which is part of the mapping program. She stated that she was not asking for any more money, and therefore was staying within the budget amount she was given. Judge Massey stated that he would not sign a court order, and wanted there to be an ordinance presented to the Quorum Court. When asked, Eppes stated that the amount to be moved was \$7677.52. Justice Vancuren stated that he thought that the ordinance should be presented to the budget committee before it was placed on the next agenda.

County Attorney Russo commented that his office and the Sheriff's office had been working together and have gotten the automated fine payment program up and running. He stated that the delinquent fines would be tracked by this program and each month letters would be generated to those who need to pay their fines.

The meeting was adjourned.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF MARION COUNTY, ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING 2018-4, IDENTIFIED AS THE MARION COUNTY PERSONNL POLICY.

ARTICLE 1. The Marion County Personnel Policy is amended as follows:

16. WORK REQUIREMENTS

Unless specified in the Numbers and Compensation ordinance the county's standard work week for each employee is forty (40) hours, consisting of five (5) standard eight (8) hour workdays. Each employee is allowed two (2) fifteen minute breaks a day. One in the morning and one in the afternoon. In addition, each employee shall be allowed a 30 minute lunch break. Employee shall clock out and in for their lunch break. All offices that serve the public directly, must leave their work area. Breaks cannot be an extension of an employee's lunch break.

Unless specified in the Numbers and Compensation ordinance the county's standard work week for each employee is forty (40) hours, consisting of five (5) standard eight (8) hour workdays. Law enforcement personnel and road department work schedules will be determined by the appropriate county official.

Employee shall be in attendance at their work in accordance with the rules and hours established by the elected official or department head. All administrative offices will have at least one employee on duty during the hours outlined in A. above.

Each elected official or department head shall keep attendance records on each county employee. These records will be reviewed and signed by both the elected official/department head and the employee as to correctness prior to submittal of the time sheet to the payroll section.

Absence of an employee from work, including any absence for a single or part of a day that is not authorized by the elected official or department head, shall be deemed to be an absence without leave. Any such absence maybe without pay and the employee who is absent two (2) consecutive days without approved leave may result in discharge.

No outside employment of a continual nature will be allowed, unless it is approved by the elected official and/or department head. Under no circumstances will a person be allowed to work at a job which conflicts in any way with duties as a county employee.

No employee shall engage in any private business in the activities of a profession during those hours for which he or she is being compensated by the county.

A personnel file shall be maintained on each employee by elected officials and/or department heads.

County employees may be recommended for promotion and/or salary increases by their immediate supervisor subject to approval/disapproval by the elected official.

Employees are requested to give the elected official and/or department head at least two (2) weeks written notice. The resignation should contain reason for leaving the employment of the county. The employee's resignation shall be documented in the employee's personnel file.

Amend to Read:

16. WORK REQUIREMENTS

The normal working hours for administrative offices of the government of Marion County are from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, exclusive of authorized holidays. Normal business will be conducted during these hours, with the exception of those offices with less than two employees. They will be allowed to close for thirty minutes for an employee's lunch break. The normal working hours for the Marion County Library are 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday. Any changes to normal hours, such as afterhours events and programs, will be posted on the Library Website and the social media.

Unless specified in the Numbers and Compensation ordinance the county's standard work week for each employee is forty (40) hours, consisting of five (5) standard eight (8) hour workdays. Each employee is allowed two (2) fifteen minute breaks a day. One in the morning and one in the afternoon. In addition, each employee shall be allowed a 30 minute lunch break. Employee shall clock out and in for their lunch break. All offices that serve the public directly, must leave their work area. Breaks cannot be an extension of an employee's lunch break.

Employees are requested to give the elected official and/or department head at least two (2) weeks written notice. The resignation should contain reason for leaving the employment of the county. The employee's resignation shall be documented in the employee's personnel file.

ARTICLE 2. Severability Clause: If any provision or article of this Ordinance is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions and articles of this Ordinance, and to such end the provisions and articles of the Ordinance are declared severable.


