**ARTICLE 1.** The Marion County Personnel Policy is amended as follows:

As Reads:

**16. WORK REQUIREMENTS**

The normal working hours for administrative offices of the government of Marion County are from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, exclusive of authorized holidays. Normal business will be conducted during these hours, with the exception of those offices with less than two employees. They will be allowed to close for thirty minutes for an employee's lunch break.

Amend to Read:

**16. WORK REQUIREMENTS**

The normal working hours for administrative offices of the government of Marion County are from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, exclusive of authorized holidays. Normal business will be conducted during these hours, with the exception of those offices with less than two employees. They will be allowed to close for thirty minutes for an employee's lunch break. The normal working hours for the Marion County Library are 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday. Any changes to normal hours, such as afterhours events and programs, will be posted on the Library Website and the social media.

**ARTICLE 2.** Severability Clause: If any provision or article of this Ordinance is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions and articles of this Ordinance, and to such end the provisions and articles of the Ordinance are declared severable.

**Article III. TRANSFERS.** Transfers will be increased or decreased with the changes as follows:

.As Reads:

**Article 6. TRANSFERS.** Included in this budget are two (2) conditional transfers of County General Funds. The first one is a conditional transfer by the Treasurer of up to \$418,000.00 from County General Fund to the Department of the Sheriff's Law Enforcement Fund on a "As Needed Basis" condition and Comptroller to appropriate into various line items. The Second transfer of County General Funds is the conditional transfer by the Treasurer of up

to \$82,000.00 to the County Judge's E911 Department Fund on a "As Needed Basis" condition and Comptroller to appropriate into various line items. Other than these two conditional transfers of funds any transfers of monies between various funds of the County or between the major categories of expenditures -Personal Services, Supplies, Other Services and Charges, Capital Outlay, and Debt Service – shall be made only with prior approval of the Marion County Quorum Court. Provided, however all transfers budgeted for in the annual budget shall be exempt from the provisions of this section.

As Amended:

**Article 6. TRANSFERS.** Included in this budget are three (3) conditional transfers of County General Funds. The first one is a conditional transfer by the Treasurer of up to \$507,170.60 from County General Fund to the Department of the Sheriff's Law Enforcement Fund on a "As Needed Basis" condition and Comptroller to appropriate into various line items. The Second transfer of County General Funds is the conditional transfer by the Treasurer of up to \$48,080.22 to the County Judge's E911 Department Fund on a "As Needed Basis" condition and Comptroller to appropriate into various line items. The third one is a conditional transfer by the Treasurer of up to \$301,572.67 from County General Fund to the Department of the Sheriff's Jail Maintenance Fund on a "As Needed Basis" condition and Comptroller to appropriate into various line items. Other than these three conditional transfers of funds any transfers of monies between various funds of the County or between the major categories of expenditures -Personal Services, Supplies, Other Services and Charges, Capital Outlay, and Debt Service – shall be made only with prior approval of the Marion County Quorum Court. Provided, however all transfers budgeted for in the annual budget shall be exempt from the provisions of this section.

**Article IV. SEVERABILITY.** If any provisions of this Ordinance or the application thereof any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

**Article V.** This ordinance being necessary for the protection and preservation of public health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in force and shall take effect upon passage and publication.

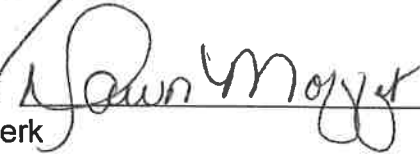

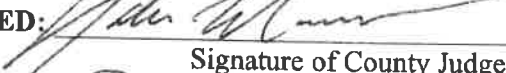
