

MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

August 9, 2022

The Marion County Quorum Court held their monthly meeting beginning at 6 p.m.

County Judge Massey presided over the meeting. All Justices were present.

Justice Brigham gave the invocation and Justice Madden led the pledge.

The minutes and all reports were approved.

Old Business:

New Business:

The motion to read by title only was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-45 – Boat Safety Fund – Sponsored by Justice Shipman. This motion moves \$14000.00 from the Boat Safety Emergency Fund (3019-0400) to a new fund, Boat Safety Emergency Fund – Office of Emergency Management (OEM) (3019-0500), in compliance with Arkansas Code 27-101-111. Currently this fund be being overseen by the Sheriff's office. However, the Sheriff Department does not patrol waterways within the county. This fund was established in 1989 as a rescue fund. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice Nickels. During the discussion, Justice Shipman stated that the money was only being moved under a different office but would be spent in the same way. Sheriff Evans stated that he was against this change and continued to state that he had not been aware of the budget meetings when this was discussed. Justice Scrima commented that this change is just where the money is appropriated. And that he felt that there was a need for this money to be used by an established waterway patrol and rescue team. Justice Shipman continued that it was easier for the rescue team with this change, because the team is now paying for equipment out of their own pockets. He continued that Game and Fish had used some of the money for ghillie suits. He said that unless they were hiding for the people they were trying to rescue, that wasn't a good use of the money. There is a difference between enforcement and rescue. Justice Brigham called for the question. A vote was taken on the adoption of the ordinance with Justices Scrima, Nickels, Underwood, Shipman, Brigham and McCalla voting for the ordinance. Justices Vancuren and White voted against the ordinance and Justice Madden abstained. The motion passed. After the vote, Justice Vancuren stated that he thought that he was voting on "calling the question." Justice Brigham pointed out

that she did not make a motion, she had simply called for the question to end the discussion. Prosecuting Attorney, David Ethredge, (standing in for County Attorney, John Russo) was consulted and he stated that the correct procedure was followed.

Ordinance 2022-46 – Road Department – Truck Purchase – Sponsored by Justice Madden. This ordinance allow the County Judge to purchase a 2011 Ford F150 pickup truck S/N 1FTFX1EF0BFC12857 for the purpose of transporting the equipment and materials necessary for installing county road signs. The amount of \$18,000 will be appropriated from the County Road Fund (2000) to the Road Department Fund (2000-0200) vehicles line item. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Brigham. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-47 – Juvenile Services – Other Professional Services, Small Equipment – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. This ordinance allows for the appropriation of \$52,435.87 from County General (Fund 1000) to The Juvenile Services budget. \$50,000 will be appropriated into the Other Professional Services line item, for the purpose of paying detention fees and \$2,435.87 into the Machinery and Equipment line item for the purpose of putting a cage in the back of their transport vehicle. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-48 – Sheriff's Department – Equipping Van – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. This ordinance appropriates \$4260.00 from Fund 1005 Coronavirus Relief Fund to the Sheriff's Fund (1005-0400), \$240 goes into the Parts and Repair line item and \$4020.00 is appropriated to the Other Professional Services line item. These monies will be used to equip a van for prisoner transportation. The motion to adopt was made by Justice McCalla and seconded by Justice Madden. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-49 – Election Commission – Reimbursement – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. This ordinance appropriates the reimbursement from the State for Election Commission Training and Election Coordinator Training in the amount of \$1536.24. The money will be appropriated into the Election Services – Part Time (\$1400) and Meals, Miles & Lodging (\$136.24). The motion to adopt was made by Justice Nickels and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-50 – Appropriation – Payment for Federal Audit of Fund 3046 – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. This ordinance allows for the appropriation

of \$10000.00 from fund 3046 America Rescue to 3046-0100-3001 American Rescue Fund – County Judge Full Time Accounting & Auditing for the purpose of paying for a Federal audit of this fund. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-51 – Appropriation – Payment for Federal Audit of Fund 1005 – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. This ordinance allows for the appropriation of \$5000.00 from fund 1005 Coronavirus Relief to 1005-0500-3001 Corona Virus Relief Fund– County Judge Full Time Accounting & Auditing for the purpose of paying for a Federal audit of this fund. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-52 – District Court – Appropriation – Sponsored by Justices McCalla, Nickels, Brigham, Scrima and Vancuren. This ordinance appropriates \$7173.00 from County General to District Court 1000-0409-1004 Contract Labor. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.


Ordinance 2022-53 – Law Enforcement – Stipend – No sponsor was listed. This ordinance appropriates \$59,207.50 from the state for the purpose of authorizing a \$5000 to each eligible full-time law enforcement officer as defined by Act 224 or the 2022 Fiscal Session of the Arkansas Legislature. The motion to approve was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice Underwood. The motion passed unanimously.

Resolution 2022-10 – Promise Land Sport Court – Sponsored by Justice Scrima. This resolution allows for the appropriation of \$14707.70 to complete the local match money requirement and to authorize the County Judge to submit an application of formal request to the Arkansas Rural Development Commission for the purpose of securing the grant. The resolution was adopted by an unanimous voice vote.


Judge Massey asked the court to ratify two members to the Marion County Equalization Board. Emily Smith, appointed by the Quorum Court and Tommy Dorsey, appointed by the Cities and Incorporated Towns. Their terms will expire on May 31, 2026. The voice vote was unanimous.

Judge Massey also announced that the following roads would now be considered county roads. Emily Lane Road, Robinwood Lane Road, Blue Jay Way, Jeb Road, Blackbird Circle, Yesterday Circle, Ob La Di Circle, and Elly Lane.

The meeting was adjourned.







AN APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR FULL-TIME LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER SALARY STIPENDS IN ACCORDANCE WITH ACT 224 OF THE 2022 FISCAL SESSION OF THE ARKANSAS LEGISLATURE; AND TO AMEND THE ANNUAL OPERATING BUDGET AND NUMBERS AND COMPENSATION ORDINANCE 2021-124 AND ORDINANCE 2022-13 FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2022 FOR MARION COUNTY, ARKANSAS.

NOW THEREFORE, be it enacted by the Quorum Court of Marion County.

Article 1: WHEREAS, Act 224 of the 2022 Fiscal Session of the Arkansas Legislature appropriated funds for Law Enforcement Stipend Grants for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023.

Article 2: WHEREAS, Act 224 authorizes the payment of a \$5,000.00 stipend to each eligible full-time law enforcement officer as defined in the Act; acknowledged by the county sheriff [law enforcement agency]; acknowledged by each eligible officer; and verified by the Division of Law Enforcement Standards and Training.

Article 3: WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Quorum Court of Marion County, Arkansas, to appropriate the necessary funding to provide each full-time law enforcement officer, as defined in Act 224, a one-time stipend payment of \$5,000.00 less all appropriate employee deductions. Said stipend shall not be incorporated into the base pay of an employee for future salary adjustments. In the instance of a one-time stipend payment to an eligible elected County Sheriff the payment shall not be construed to be part of the county officer's compensation as defined in Amendment 55, § 5 of the Arkansas Constitution or Arkansas Code Annotated § 14-14-1203(d).

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Quorum Court of Marion County, Arkansas, that:

Ordinance No. 2021-124 and Ordinance No. 2022-13, the 2022 county budget ordinance is hereby amended, and the sum of \$59,207.50 is hereby appropriated from *Fund 1000 County General*, to the following department and line item(s) in the amounts and in the manner set forth below.

<u>Appropriate From</u>	<u>Amount</u>

<u>Appropriate To Law Enforcement (1000-0400)</u>	<u>Amount</u>
1000-0400-1005 Overtime & Other Premium Compensation	\$59,207.50

This amendment increases the amount appropriated for the Law Enforcement Department budget by \$59,207.50; and thereby increases the County General Fund #1000 appropriation by \$59,207.50 making the total 2022 County General Fund appropriation \$59,207.50.

Article 4: It is the intent of the Marion County Quorum Court that the appropriations contained herein are to be used only for stipend pay for full-time law enforcement officers and associated payroll expenses. This ordinance is only an amendment to the 2022 county operating budget established by Marion County Ordinance No. 2021-124 and Ordinance No. 2022-13 and other amendments thereto. All other appropriations and policy statements of Ordinance No. 2021-124 and Ordinance No. 20220-13 shall remain in full force.

It is also the intent of this Court that the County Treasurer amend the County General revenue projection to include the grant funding received from the State of Arkansas for the aforementioned stipends and that this funding may be appropriated at the 100% level as allowed for state grants pursuant to § 14-20-103(b)(1).

Article 5: Under the general laws of the State of Arkansas, specifically § 14-14-907(d)(e)(f), appropriation ordinances are enacted without separate readings upon a two-thirds vote of the Quorum Court and shall be effective immediately upon passage and approval.

Be it further resolved, that County Judge of Marion County is hereby authorized to submit an application of formal request to the Arkansas Rural Development Commission for purpose of securing state grant funds in the amount of \$14,707.70 to aid and assist the Promise Land Community Organization (PLACO) in executing the proposed project described herein and that

the County Judge or Treasurer of Marion County is further authorized to administer the grant funds for the same project.
