MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

March 8, 2022

The Marion County Quorum Court held their monthly meeting beginning at 6 p.m.

County Judge Massey presided over the meeting. All Justices were present. Justice Brigham gave the invocation and Justice Madden led the pledge.

The minutes and all reports were approved. During the Collector's report, Collector Tony Todaro reported that since he has been appointed to office in January, there have been significant changes made. Tax payers will now have the ability to pay their taxes on line beginning in April, also, the outdated ledger books are now on Excell sheets, plus the office now has three phone lines. During the Library report, Director Dana Scott reported that the Library's Book, Bake, and Yard sale will take place on March 17, 18 and 19 at the American Legion Hut in Yellville. Justice White asked to speak and commented that he had been to the last Library Board meeting. He noted that the Library Board was under the same rules as the Quorum Court and have to have their meetings be public, not Zoom. Director Scott commented that the Zoom meetings were public and could be accessed by anyone who wanted to attend. Justice White continued by stating that a public meeting was when everyone was in the same room, just like the Quorum Court. He asked if the next meeting would have the board all in the same room, Ms. Scott's response was no. Judge Massey intervene and stated that this situation would be addressed by the County Attorney. During the Fair Board report, the dates for the Fair were given as August 23 through August 27. Justice Massey reported that he would like a motion to accept a bid from Arvest bank to purchase a 2017 Sany grader with 5000 hours on it for \$195000.00 at an interest rate of 2.57 percent. Justice Vancuren made the motion and Justice McCalla seconded it, the motion passed unanimously.

Old Business:

New Business:

Justice Vancuren motioned to read the ordinances by title only. Justice McCalla seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-9 – Assessor's Office – Building Inspector Fund – Sponsored by Justice White. This ordinance would add an Other Professional Services line item to fund 3407. It directs the Comptroller to deposit all funds in fund 3407 twice a year into Other Professional Services (3407-0110-3009). These funds would then

be used to pay the building inspector. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. During the discussion, Justice Vancuren stated that he had several questions that he wanted to ask Assessor Tonya Eppes. Ms. Eppes was not present at the meeting. Justice McCalla then made the motion to table this ordinance until the April meeting. Justice Brigham seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-10 – Health Department – Building Repairs – Sponsored by Justices McCalla, Brigham and Scrima. This ordinance allows for \$26635.00 to be appropriated from 1005 Coronavirus Relief Fund. These funds will be used to cover the cost of purchase and installation of concrete walkway, exterior lighting, new entry doors, canopy, gutters and downspouts and signage for the health department. This will provide protection from the weather while conducting various vaccination clinics and testing. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice Vancuren. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-11 – Personnel Policy – Library Work Hours – Sponsored by Justices McCalla, Brigham and Nickels. This ordinance amends the Personnel policy to reflect the normal working hours for the Marion County Library. These hours are 9 a.m. to 5:30 Monday through Friday and 10 to 2 on Saturday. The amendment also states that any changes to these hours will be posted on the Library website and social media. The motion to adopt (first reading) was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-12 – Generators – Sponsored by Justices McCalla, Vancuren and Nickels. This ordinance appropriates \$42566.00 from fund 1005 Coronavirus Relief Fund to pay for the installation and equipment of two generators. The motion to adopt was made by Justice McCalla and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-13 – Amended Budget – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. This ordinance amends Ordinance 2021-124. This ordinance correct and updates changes in projected revenue and expenditures. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-14 – Clean Up Ordinance – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance cleans up the 2021 budget after paying all the bills for 2021. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Resolution 2022-4 – Oakland Promise Land Fire Protection District – Sponsored by Justices Vancuren, White, Underwood, Madden, Shipman, Brigham and McCalla. This resolution allows Judge Massey to apply for a grant on behalf of the Oakland Promise Land Fire Protection District for the purchase of Jaw of Life extraction equipment. The Oakland Promise Land Community has raised \$12232.62. The county will match those funds. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Before the meeting adjourned, Judge Massey reminded all that were there that employees who have not filled out all their paperwork prior to being officially employed would not be paid, until such paperwork had been received by the Human Resources department. He continued by stating that the time clocks were back on board.

Judge Massey also stated that cypersecurity was beginning to be a problem. He has been to some meetings regarding this and a group that wants to help prevent such problems, would like to come and give about a 15 minutes presentation to the Quorum Court.

The meeting was adjourned.

Marion County Budget
and Personnel Meeting
March 31, 2022

Chairperson Joyce McCalla called the meeting to order at 5:30 pm. Justice Vancuren, Justice Scrima, Justice Brigham, Justice McCalla and Justice Nickels were in attendance.

Item #1. A zoom call with daZZee IT services out of Springfield, Mo., on cyber security. Up first was the 3 top security items most organizations miss. First, ransom ware software that started the Colonial Pipeline network issue: it attacked the business network and did not affect the delivery of fuel. This attack originated from the Russian dark side where there are no penalties for such actions. The ransom was 5 million dollars. The average time an attacker is on a victim's network before detection is 19 days. The average cost to remediate a ransom ware attack is \$761,000. A firewall and antivirus are not enough. 70% of people reuse passwords across multiple sites and that includes proper password maintenance. How can you address it? Threat hunting cyber security software protects against malware; you need a policy to enforce MFA {Monthly vulnerability agreement}. The company will come and give a comprehensive security assessment for an intro plan for \$3,750.00. A short question and answer session followed with audience participation.

Item #2 An appropriation for the payment to Futility IT. Inc. for computer software for the office of Emergency Management for the amount of \$3,400.00; after the first year the cost would be \$1'900.00. The committee agreed to the request by OEM director Dwayne McFarland.

Item #3 Director Cheryl Greene with Juvenile Services requested a change for one employee that no longer needs insurance and would request that that amount of \$4,716.70 be placed into overtime.

Item #4 Computer services for the Comptroller. The committee approved a purchase for the office for another computer. Financial Intelligence will be on one unit and the other will hold the apprentice program. The committee approved the appropriation.

Item #5 An appropriation to pay for a new refrigerator for the courthouse of \$756.71. The committee approved the purchase.

Item # 6 A presentation for the Marion County airport with a request of an appropriation of \$2,000.00. It was at first discussed that the funds would repair the older floors in the terminal building but the talk traveled from that issue to general repairs. The committee agreed to the appropriation of \$2,000.00.

Item #7 an appropriation for security at the transfer station; there has been a great deal of security added to the county buildings. The committee agreed to accept the ordinance.

Item #8 An appropriation of \$3,079.96 for security in the county annex. The committee accepted the request.

Item #9 A letter of credit to be signed for the operation for the transfer station
Item #10 An ordinance to correct the budget for the Clerk's office for overtime in personal services. The committee agreed to have one clean-up ordinance for all departments.

Item # 11 A question presented by Comptroller Crespino on the recorder's budget.

Item #12 As stated by Assessor Tonya Eppes, the problem is the transfer of building permit funds and she needs to transfer those funds perhaps twice a year. Justice Vancuren questioned what he had received from Treasurer Purdome, The discussion went back and forth over having 2 ordinances to also create a new line item 3407, but it was agreed to just do the business with on ordinance.

Item#13 Justice Nickels questioned why our radio communications haven't all been transferred to digital? Justice Scrima added that the old analog system is 15 years behind times. The discussion went back and forth between Justice Vancuren and Justice Nickels with many phrases being repeated
The meeting adjourned at 7:50 pm.


