# MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

July 12, 2022

The Marion County Quorum Court held their monthly meeting beginning at 6 p.m.

County Judge Massey presided over the meeting. All Justices were present with the exception of Justice Shipman. Officer Heith Hogan gave the invocation and Justice Madden led the pledge.

The minutes and all reports were approved. During the E-911 report, Cassie Foster reported that they were fully staffed. Justice Madden asked why the turnover was so heavy. Foster replied that employees were going to different counties, where the pay was better. She reported that Baxter County is starting out at \$15 per hour. The longest employee in the E-911 department has been there for five years and is making \$15.50 which includes the recent raises. She also commented that the new system will probably help.

## Old Business:

Assessor Tonya Eppes, asked to speak to the court regarding her ordinance concerning the payment the DataScout. County Attorney, John Russo, addressed the court on this matter. Russo stated that he had spoken with the legal department at the Arkansas Assessment Coordination Division. The original contracts were sent out in September 2021 and included the amendment which stated that the county was now responsible for paying 50% of the contract. DataScout had previously paid 100% of the contract. The contract was signed in January. However, the signed contract had unauthorized changes and the commission would not accept the changes. Russo continued by stating that the county had an obligation to pay the DataScout bill and move on. He also stated that this could be done by a court order rather than an ordinance. Justice Vancuren asked what would happen if the bill wasn't paid, Russo responded that the vendor could sue the county. Judge Massey stated that he would sign a court order in the morning.

## New Business:

The motion to read by title only was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-40 – Judge Putman – Personal Services – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. This ordinance appropriation \$488.78 from County General to the Retirement Matching line items in the personal services group for Judge

Putman. This is to pay his office's part-time help. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-41 – Oakland/Promiseland Fire Protection District – Grant Money – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. This ordinance appropriates \$12232.61 of grant money received into the small equipment line item for the purchase of extraction equipment. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice Vancuren. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-42 – Establish General Sub Fund ARPA Revenue Replacement Fund – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. This ordinance establishes a County General Sub-Fund to be called the ARPA Revenue Replacement Fund. The fund number will be 1006 as assigned by Arkansas Legislative Audit. These funds may be used for government services traditionally provided by county government to include, but not limited to: construction and maintenance of roads and bridges; other infrastructure projects; provision of public safety; purchase of government vehicles and equipment and county administrative costs. The funds cannot be used to make an extraordinary contribution to a pension fund; for debt services; for replenishing county financial reserves; for settlements or judgments of for a project that conflicts with or contravenes the purpose of the American Rescue Plan Act. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-43 – Numbers and Compensation – Road Department – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. This ordinance corrects a clerical error in ordinance 2021-124 and ordinance 2022-13. It changes the Equipment Operator II from two full time to one full time. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2022-44 – E-911 – Appropriate for New Equipment – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. This ordinance appropriates \$408245.22 from the American Rescue Fund to E-911 for the purchase of new equipment. This will be a complete new system with a five year contract. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

Before adjourning, Justice Madden asked how the overtime was coming on MC 4018. Judge Massey stated that the road was completed and the overtime was over. However, he continued by stating that the overtime money would stay in the County Road budget in case of emergencies.

The meeting was adjourned.

Marion County Budget  
and Personnel Meeting  
July 28, 2022

Chairperson Justice Joyce McCalla called the meeting to order at 5:30 pm. Justice Scrima, Justice Brigham, Justice McCalla and Justice Nickels were all in attendance. Judge Massey spoke that he had relieved Justice Vancuren of his committee appointments and that Justice White would assume the duties.

Item #1: representing the Marion County Juvenile services was Cheryl Green. She spoke about the funding of her department and the placement of juveniles in specific housing. Presently, it costs \$90.00 per day to house these juveniles and that presently there is one that will require an extended stay. It was requested that line 1000-0415-3009 would need a \$50,000.00 transfer. Ms. Green offered the committee a spread sheet of the costs to house juveniles for the previous 5 years. Justice Brigham questioned if the state reimburses for juveniles. The answer was "no". Anticipated revenues go back into the line. The state will reimburse up to 50% up to \$40,000.00 for your detention officer. An additional cost was also discussed as there is a need to buy a security cage for the recently- purchased transport vehicle, a 2020 Durango, for \$2,435.87. The committee agreed that these items need to be accepted.

Item #2: Marion County Clerk Dawn Moffit presented an ordinance to reimburse \$1,536.24 from the state election services, meals, miles and lodging. The committee agreed to sponsor the appropriation ordinance.

Item # 3: an ordinance transferring from the sheriff's office to the OEM, the boat safety line 3019-0500 in the amount of \$14,000.00. OEM director Dwayne McFarland said he would write up the ordinance. This was discussed at our last meeting.

Item #4 an appropriation ordinance for the fire department sales tax. The transfer to all Marion County Departments will be \$70,950.00 and there should be \$40,000.00 remaining in the account. Each department should receive \$6,000.00 for a total pay-out of \$160,000.00

Item #5: the ARPA payout. Written to reward each full- time employee who served from January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021 a total of \$2.00 per hour as a premium payback. Justice Brigham offered that she had contacted other counties and some had used this ARPA account for payroll. It was added that the previously- discussed storm shelters will cost \$7,500.00. Justice Scrima and Justice Nickels agreed that we have employees that salary- wise, could use the funds such as paying our jailers and dispatchers more.

Item# 6: a disbursement of the Corona virus Relief Fund for elected officials. A great- deal of discussion followed. The total payout for the elected officials would be \$24,993.62. It was added that these funds need not be spent for 5 years

Item #7: a heads- up from Val Jackson at the Marion County Health Department, that she needs air conditioning repairs of \$2,298.80 and that should the funds be taken from the building fund, line 1000-0300-2020. The repair has already been completed.

Item #8: presented by Justice McCalla that we have 2 candidates for the equalization board

Item #9: an appropriation for \$171,105.30 to complete the fire communication project. To replace towers, repeaters and program the digital radios. It was stated that the FCC licensing may take some time. Chairperson Justice McCalla asked if OEM director McFarland would draw up an ordinance.

Item #10 a recommendation from Jimmy Lynch, that the Marion County Election Committee change its policies. There was charges of a lack of transparency and there are no recorded minutes from past meetings. Judge Massey offered that there hasn't been an hourly wage set by ordinance for the board. Justice McCalla suggested we get an opinion from Prosecutor Russo

The meeting adjourned at 7:15 pm.

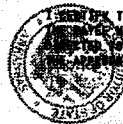

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF MARION COUNTY, ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

AN APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ANNUAL OPERATING BUDGET AND NUMBERS AND COMPENSATION ORDINANCE 2021-124 AND ORDINANCE 2022-13 FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2022 FOR MARION COUNTY, ARKANSAS; TO APPROPRIATE PREMIUM PAY FOR MARION COUNTY EMPLOYEES FROM ARPA FUNDING CONVERTED TO REVENUE REPLACEMENT FUNDS.

**Article 1. Affirmation.** This Court affirms that Premium Pay is a recommended use of ARPA funding and may be paid retroactive to January 1, 2021 in accordance with the Final rule issued by the U.S. Treasury; and that "premium pay" may be provided to eligible workers that are performing essential work in person. It is further recognized that all Marion County employees are eligible for premium pay in that the Final Rule confirms that "any work performed by an employee of county government involving regular in-person interactions or regular handling of items also handled by others" is premium pay eligible. This Court affirms that the Marion County Courthouse and other county buildings and operations remained open for business during the ongoing Covid pandemic and employees worked "in person: and not remotely. Therefore, this Court declares that premium pay be budgeted and paid to Marion County employees as set forth in this ordinance.

**Article 2. Premium Pay.** Premium Pay for Marion County employees will be a one-time lump sum payment and will not be incorporated into the base pay of an employee for future salary adjustments. Premium pay is subject to all applicable employee payroll deductions. Premium pay is set at \$2.00 per hours worked in 2021 for a full-time employee that has been employed full-time with Marion County from January 1, 2021 – December 31, 2021 and has remained employed up to and as of the date that premium pay is issued. Any county employee working part-time or hired after January 21, 2021 will be paid a prorated amount as calculated by the Comptroller's Office as long as they are currently in the same status as in 2021. To receive premium pay a person must be currently employed by Marion County. The calculation of all premium pay shall be filed in the office of the County Clerk and there kept for public use, inspection, and examination pursuant to § 14-14-907(b).

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF MARION COUNTY, ARKANSAS, AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

AN APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ANNUAL OPERATING BUDGET AND NUMBERS AND COMPENSATION ORDINANCE 2021-124 AND ORDINANCE 2022-13 FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2022 FOR MARION COUNTY, ARKANSAS; TO APPROPRIATE ELECTED OFFICIAL PANDEMIC COMPENSATION FOR COUNTY CONSTITUTIONAL OFFICERS.

**Article 1. Affirmation.** This Court acknowledges and affirms that the Marion County Constitutional Officers work on the front lines in supervising staff and continuing to provide services to the citizens of Marion County during the course of this ongoing Covid pandemic. Each of the seven constitutional officers: (1) County Judge; (2) County/Circuit Clerk; (3) Sheriff; (4) Treasurer; (5) Assessor; (6) Tax Collector; and (7) Coroner have been on the job working in person and providing hands-on supervision of employees, service to constituents, and superintending safety measures. Therefore, this Court declares that "elected official pandemic compensation" be paid to the constitutional offices as set forth in this ordinance.

**Article 2. Elected Official Pandemic Compensation.** Elected Official Pandemic Compensation will be a one-time lump sum payment and shall not be incorporated into the base pay of a constitutional officer for future salary adjustments. This one-time lump sum payment is subject to all applicable payroll deductions and shall not be construed to be part of a county officer's compensation as defined in Amendment 55, § 5 of the Arkansas Constitution or Arkansas Code Annotated § 14-14-1203(d). Elected Official Pandemic Compensation is set at \$3,984.00 for each county constitutional officer for 2021, payable in 2022. To receive the full Elected Official Pandemic Compensation a county constitutional officer must have been either an employee or officer of Marion County from January 1, 2021 – December 31, 2021 and has remained in the elected position up to and including the day payment is made.
