The Marion County Quorum Court held their monthly meeting beginning at 5:30 p.m. on July 14, 2026.

Judge Stumph presided over the meeting and all Justices were present. The invocation was delivered by Mr. Glen Stumph and the Pledge was led by Judge Stumph.

During Old Business Justice Johnson made a presentation regarding the "New Land Acquisition". Specifically, the purchase of new property to expand the existing quarry and eventually for a new road shop. Justice Johnson stated that he did not feel that enough information was shared to the Court. He shared several questions that he had regarding the quarry. A copy of his questions are attached to these minutes.

New Business:

The motion to read by title only was made by Justice Dorsey and seconded by Justice Kerwood. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2026-33 – Judge's Office – County Road Sales Tax – Sponsored by Justices Van Velkinburgh, Kerwood and Dorsey. This ordinance appropriates monies from settlement proceeds which were received from Witcher Auctions in the amount of \$6,360.00 from the sale of outdated and retired county road vehicles and equipment that could no longer being utilized by the Road Department. These monies were appropriated into the line item of Sales Tax County Road Fund – Vehicles. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Dorsey and seconded by Justice Kerwood. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2026-34 – Judge's Office – Court Security - Sponsored by Justices Van Velkinburgh, Kerwood and Dorsey. This ordinance addresses a check for a grant that was received for Court Security from the Arkansas Administrative Office of the Courts in the amount \$18,699.99 for the purchase of security camera, doors, door lock/release system for courtroom, juvenile services and rear entry to Court

Complex. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Dorsey and seconded by Justice Van Velkinburgh. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2026-35 – Judge’s Office – Motor Fuel Tax - Sponsored by Justices Van Velkinburgh, Kerwood and Dorsey. This ordinance appropriates \$26,584.02 to the Road Department line item for Pave Road Maintenance for the payment of restriping county roads MC 4010, MC 4052, MC 5002, MC 7001 and MC 8001. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Lee and seconded by Justice Dorsey. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2026-36 – Elections - Sponsored by Justices Van Velkinburgh, Kerwood and Dorsey. This ordinance appropriates \$900 received from the State Board of Election Commissioners as a stipend for Election Commission for serving in the Primary and Primary Runoff Elections. These monies were appropriated into the Part-Time line item in the Election’s Budget. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Dorsey and seconded by Justice Jensen. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2026-37 – Clerk’s Office – Jury Per Diem - Sponsored by Justices Van Velkinburgh, Kerwood and Dorsey. This ordinance appropriates \$1,112.89 received from the state for reimbursement for the first quarter of 2026 Jury Costs. These monies will be appropriated into the Jury Per Diem line item. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Johnson and seconded by Justice Dorsey. The motion passed unanimously.

The 2024 audit report has been received by all the Justices with the exception of Justice Johnson. He will come to the Clerk’s office and receive a copy of it.

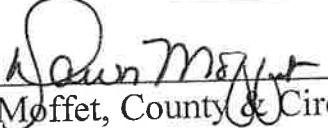
Justice Reed asked that an Ordinance he had presented regarding Interfund Transfers to the Court be considered as a Post Agenda item. This Ordinance was sponsored by Justices Reed, Johnson and Lee. Judge Stumph called for a “Point of Order” stating that the County Attorney considered this Ordinance unconstitutional. Judge Stumph also pointed out that this ordinance was not considered at the budget meeting. Judge then called for a motion for Object to Consideration. There is no second required for this type of motion. The vote on this motion will decide whether or not the Court will consider the Ordinance. He went on to explain that if a Justice voted Yes they agreed to the objection and that the Ordinance would not be considered by the Court and a No vote would allow the Ordinance to be considered. The roll call vote was taken and the motion passed with Justices Van Velkinburgh, Hopson, Jensen, Kerwood, Shipman and

Dorsey voted in favor of the motion. Justices Lee, Reed and Johnson voted against it.

The meeting was adjourned.

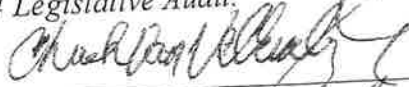

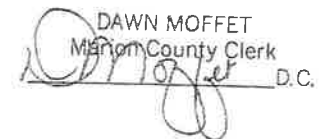

RESOLUTION 2026- 1

Be it resolved by the Quorum Court of Marion County, State of Arkansas, a resolution authorizing Marion County Judge to explore financing options for the 20% required contribution of the Federal Highway Administration's Emergency Relief Program in the amount of \$2,638,800.

Whereas, currently Marion County has sustained damages to five (5) bridges or low water crossings, located on MC 8060-Mocassin Creek and Jimmie Creek Bridges, MC 6075-Blue John and Clabber Creek crossings, and MC 7024-Fallen Ash Creek crossing, during the July 17, 2024, flooding event and these locations need full replacement.

Whereas, the Quorum Court would consider the 20% cost share to complete replacement of the five (5) bridges damaged during the July 17, 2024, flooding event. The total National Highway Administration's Emergency Relief project cost for these replacements is \$13,194,000. Federal share is 80% equaling \$10,555,200, making the 20% county responsibility total \$2,638,800.

Whereas, the Quorum Court authorizes the County Judge of Marion County, Arkansas to explore financing options in the amount of \$2,638,800.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Quorum court of Marion County, Arkansas:

Section 1. That the Quorum Court feels it is in the best interest of the county to explore financing options.

Section 2. That the Marion County Judge is hereby authorized to explore financing options for the replacement of these crossings to meet the total cost-share requirement for the projects in the amount of \$2,638,800.
