MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

January 11, 2022

The Marion County Quorum Court held their monthly meeting beginning at 6 p.m.

County Judge Massey presided over the meeting. All Justices were present. Justice Brigham gave the invocation and Justice Madden led the pledge.

The minutes and all reports were approved. During the Treasurer's report, Justice Brigham asked if all sick and vacation time was being tracked in the office. Treasurer Purdome replied that yes it was. During the Assessor's report, it was discovered that the report from the packet was actually the November report. Assessor Eppes stated that she would email the correct report on Wednesday. Library Director Dana Scott announced that there were free COVID kits for the public at the library. Judge Massey stated that the plumbers were going to be at the Library on Monday to fix the sewer.

Judge Massey asked the court to consider reading the ordinances by title only for the rest of the year. Justice Nickels made the motion and Justice McCalla seconded. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote. There will be an ordinance drawn up to this effect, and it will be reviewed by the Procedures Committee.

Old Business:

Ordinance 2021-118 – Assessor's Office – Contract – Sponsored by Justices Scrima, White and Nickels. This ordinance requests \$9210.00 from the County General Fund to pay half of the end of contract reappraisal fee. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice Vancuren. The motion passed unanimously.

New Business:

Ordinance 2022-1 – Sheriff's Office – Sponsored by Justice Madden. This ordinance moves the funds in the amount of \$13683.54 from fund 3406 Corp of Engineer Fund into fund 1800 Sales Tax Law Enforcement. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Resolution 2022-1 – Sheriff's Office – Income Tax Credit – This resolution shows that Marion County is in support of the establishment of an income tax credit for

full time law enforcement officers in the state of Arkansas. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Resolution 2022-2 – Collector’s Office – Filling Vacancy – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This resolution appoints Anthony Todaro to fill the vacancy in the Collector’s office created when Cathy Brightwell retired. This appointment will end on December 31, 2022. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Scrima. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Resolution 2022-3 – Coroner’s Office – Filling Vacancy – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. The resolution appoints Leanne Rudolph to fill the vacancy in the Coroner’s office created with the retirement of Keith Barnes. This appointment will end on December 31, 2022. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Judge Massey announced appointments to several boards. Stephanie Hutcheson and Ryan See were reappointed to the Marion County Fair and Livestock Show Board of Directors; Doug Starkey was reappointed to the Marion County Regional Airport Board of Directors; Ken Green was reappointed to the Rea Valley Fire Protection district; and Daniel Doshier was reappointed to the Marion County Planning Board. All positions were ratified unanimously.

Justice Rick White was elected to be the Quorum Court delegate to the Quorum Court Association.

Judge Massey mentioned that the Baker building on the south side of the square was for sale and had been offered to the county. He suggested that it could be used for office space. Justice Scrima suggested that the county put out bids to see what the cost would be to refurbish the old jail building.

The meeting was adjourned.

Staffing: We are currently staffed with 7 full time and 0 part time staff. This leaves us down 1 full time and 2 part time positions. We are currently working on interviewing to fill the 8th spot.

Training: We are actively working on training and continued education for all staff. 2 of our new hires are enrolled to attend the ACIC basic training certification. 2 of our dispatchers are enrolled to take the ACIC advanced training certification.

Technical Issues: We had the A&W personnel here on January 28th to work on updating and fixing our consoles. One of the previous issues we have been experiencing is when dispatch pages out Auto Aides for Structure Fires, some of the Fire Districts are not receiving their tones. As of now our Auto Aide buttons have been fixed with a few minor issues with the programming of the fire departments being assigned on the wrong Auto Aide. We are working on fixing this.

Operations: Our call volume went up this month compared to last month. We are working on merging to headsets instead of 911 phone handhelds. This will ensure ease for our dispatchers being to multitask in answering 911 calls and answering the law enforcement all while being able to be mobile in the room. Our biggest focus is ensuring the training for our new hires and working together as a family to ensure our communication center is the best. I am very proud of the team that Marion County 911 has to serve our county!

AMERICAN RESCUE FUNDS

We continue to attend meetings and receive information about the American Rescue Funds. We are waiting for a final rule from the Treasury Department give further clarification of projects for which funds can be used. Treasury has revised the deadline for the submission of the first Project and Expenditure Report. Metropolitan counties and cities with a population lower than 250,000 and awards less than \$10 million- the report will now be due on April 30, 2022 and will cover the period between March 3 and March 31, 2022. The report will be due annually by the end of April.

COURT SECURITY

I have an Ordinance to transfer funds from the Court Security funds and additional funds from the Building improvement fund to pay for the installation of equipment and wiring for the tv monitors in the annex and courthouse.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE

This is for systems to be placed 14 vehicles. I have prepared an Ordinance to set up a fund for this grant. County will be reimbursed for 90% of expenses. Ordinance states reimbursed funds will be returned to Coronavirus Relief Fund 1005.**

Wal-Mart - \$2,500 – this is a grant for Shop with a Cop. We were notified that Marion County Sheriff's Office would received \$1,500.

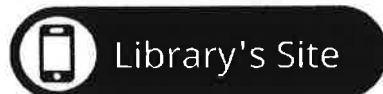

Marion County
Budget Committee Meeting
January 13, 2022

Chairperson Joyce McCalla called the meeting to order at 5:33 pm. Justice Brigham, Justice Underwood, Justice Scrima, Justice VanCuren and Justice Nickels were all in attendance. Up for discussion were the line items from the budget. Justice Scrima took the floor on what departments need to be looked at. The first department to be reviewed is the Judges office. Justice Scrima explained how the budget works and how funds are spent. Adding the Comptroller to the Judges office brings the personal services to \$157,692.39 in salaries; \$233,652.39 is the total for the office. Justice VanCuren explained that he'd already figured all the personnel into a copy of the 2022 budget. It was suggested that each department look at the 2021 budget in personal services; most changes would be in supplies. Juvenile Intake was used as an example at \$96,480.00. A request was made by the Director to add \$5,000.00 for a vehicle. If approved, that would bring the total for Juvenile Intake to \$101,480.00. Most of which comes from County General. Juvenile Intake is largely reimbursed for Personal Services by the State. It was estimated that the County has \$1,000,000 in unappropriated funds. Justice VanCuren stated we need to know every source of revenue.

Next up for discussion is Sales Tax Law Enforcement at \$891,170.60 and \$780,000.00 is appropriated. An accurate appropriation would be \$802,000.00. It was suggested that we need to add to Sales Tax Law Enforcement \$507,171.60 instead of \$418,000.00.

Clerk Moffit questioned the filling out of another worksheet. Her department uses special funds for salaries and can save the County \$8,000.00 from County General.

Library Director Dana Scott questioned raises in her department; more specifically, her own salary. It was added that, in the past, that request was tabled. She added that her salary does not come from County General. As of now, the Library Director is making \$41,535.00.

Next up is the proposed salary increases of elected officials. Justice VanCuren estimated the increases would add \$25,000.00 to \$30,000.00 to the bottom line.

Justice Van Curen tried entering all the increases into the master laptop as the discussion silentenced. Because it was taking so long to compute,

Justic VanCuren suggested we hold another meeting to give him time make all the entries. Another meeting was planned for Thursday, January 27, 2022.

Mr. Tim Bunch, Public Defender, presented the committee an amended budget for his office requesting a salary increase for the secretary from \$12.00 to \$13.00.

The meeting adjourned at 7:50 pm.

**Marion County Budget
Committee Meeting
January 27, 2022**

Chairperson Joyce McCalla called the meeting to order at 5:32 pm. Justice Claudia Brigham, Justice Mike Scrima, Justice VanCuren, Justice McCalla and Justice Nickels were in attendance. Justice VanCuren opened the discussion on the adjusted appropriated special funds and their relation to the projected revenues for county general, fund 1000. Next up for Justice VanCuren were the account 3018 account 3018, county detention account detention facility and the carry over of over of \$450,000.00 and \$310,000.00 which equals \$760,000.00. Next, for viewing was appropriated special funds fund 3018 jail maintenance and operations of \$1,041,013.47 which gives us a difference of \$280,000.00. Treasurer Carla Purdome went back to 2021 and sales tax paid \$531,000.00 which is .25 cents on the dollar from monthly sales tax. The difference with the inmates' imbursement would be \$20,000.00. Justice Brigham calculated that we should receive \$264,000.00. Treasurer Purdome stated that she'd correct the projected revenue in the morning. County Clerk Moffit questioned the 2022 new budget report she handed in versus the compensation sheet and the later was \$83,234.88; compared to \$81,774.50 in personal services. Justice Van Curen, offered how he had done the budget numbers and it should be easier next time around. As for the bottom line, County General revenues total \$3,497,500.00 with a 10% hold back of \$317,750.00. County road appropriations total total \$2,377,108.00. Justice White questioned the total budget worth roughly \$9,500,000.00. Justice Scrima questioned the 1801 carry-over and that we need another page on the schedule for sales tax. Justice Scrima also questioned the 1800-0400 sales of \$895,611.40. Clerk Moffit questioned projected revenue for 3006 county clerk recorder fund; which should be over \$100,000.00. Next up to question is sales tax law enforcement (projected revenue), which we would address later, and was \$820,000.00 in the 2021 budget which required a \$418,000.00 from county general. County collector Tony Todaro addressed the committee on his work sheets: not counting the automation fund. Director Cheryl Green, juvenile officer, asked for a dollar increase with the increase coming to \$103,000.00. Justice White, once again, questioned that in 2018, 2019 2020, and 2021, the budget showed \$8,400.00 as compared to now being close to 410,000,000.00. The new 911 coordinator requested a \$1.00 raise for 1 dispatcher who has worked longer than a new hire.

Next, Adm. Asst. Karen Carter presented an ordinance amending the E-Crash 1005-0421 corona virus relief fund for \$105, 905,00, which we must pay to collect funds. Mrs. Carter also submitted an ordinance for payout from the court security fund. Karen Carter also added that she'd e-mailed all on the recent equipment buyout. Sheriff Evans offered a clean-up ordinance for funds being transferred from one account to another. The sheriff also added that he was hiring a replacement for Adm. Dawn

Flippin who will leave the department. The sheriff also added that he's 5 jailers short and must cut his DOC inmates to 12 or 15. Justice VanCuren compared the sheriff's department to the federal government: that you must increase salaries. The submitted library raises were not discussed. The 2021 general fund was 1.8 million; it is 2.4 million for 2022. Departments like 911 were questioned as to staffing. It was generally agreed that we not give elected officials a raise in salary, til we find the \$800,000.00 increase. It was agreed to recess till next Monday, the 31 of January at 5:30. The meeting was adjourned at 8:00 pm.
