MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES 28 2023

January 10, 2023

The Marion County Quorum Court held their monthly meeting beginning at 6 p.m

Judge Stumph presided over the meeting and all Justices were present. Justice Hutching gave the invocation and Justice Reed led the pledge.

All reports were read and accepted. During the Treasurer's Report, Treasurer Susann Crespino stated that she did not have any confidence in the numbers that her reports were generating and that she had a call into the software company for assistance in this matter. The Law Enforcement report was made vocally by Sheriff Gregg Alexander. He stated that the old vehicles were in the process of being stripped by the 309 inmates. He continued to state that he anticipated that sometime in February those vehicles would be disposed of. Justice Scrima stated that he has asked several times for a report that showed which vehicles were assigned to which officer. He also requested an updated report of the current inventory for the Sheriff's office. There was no vote on the library report as no one representing the library was in attendance. Sandy Evans, secretary to the Fire Board, announced that the towers were up and they were waiting for the licenses, and hope to have the tower up and running by February.

Justice Vancuren made the motion to read the ordinance by title only. Justice Nicekls seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

Judge Stumph had requested that a procedural ordinance that he prepared be placed on the agenda for this meeting. He did not have any sponsored for said ordinance. Justice Hutching agreed to sponsor the ordinance, but the current procedural ordinance states that after the packets are sent out, three Justices must sponsor an ordinance in order for it to be placed on the agenda. Therefore, this ordinance was not presented.

Ordinance 2023-1 – Procedural Ordinance – Sponsored by Justices Vancuren, Brigham, White, and Scrima. This ordinance outlines the Procedural guidelines for the Quorum Court for each meeting. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Brigham. During the discussion, Justice Scrima suggested that the court go through this ordinance carefully to make sure everyone understood what the proper procedures were. Judge Stumph, in the ordinance he had presented had requested a change in the time and date of the regular meeting. He stated that he had gotten some feedback from citizens that changing the meeting time to 4 p.m. was beneficial to some people so that they did not have to

go home and come back at 5:30. Justices McCalla, Scrima, and Brigham all stated that they had spoken to some of their constituents and overwhelmingly they wanted the time and date to remain the same. Justice Hutching offered that the Librarian had stated that someone would be there to give the report if the meeting was during the day. Another point of discussion was that if the elected official cannot attend a meeting and has an ordinance before the court, the proposed ordinance would be tabled until the next meeting. Also, addressed was that the public has the opportunity to voice their opinion of any ordinance before the court as a whole votes on said ordinance. However, their Justice must be a sponsor to the ordinance and the person requesting the time to address the court must be on the agenda. Clerk Dawn Moffet asked if this ordinance can be amended. She would like to see that there be a deadline as to when reports and ordinances can be placed on the agenda. She will present an ordinance to the procedural committee at their next meeting to reflect this change. The motion to adopt passed unanimously.

Linda McKeon representing the Oakland Community was advised to make an appointment with Sheriff Alexander and if necessary ask to be placed on the February agenda.

Justice White was nominated by Justice Scrima to be the delegate to the Arkansas Association of Quorum Courts. Justice Brigham seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

ORDINANCE	NO.	2023	2

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUOURM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF MARION, STATE OF D.C. ARKANSAS, AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE OT BE ENTITLED:

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES FOR THE MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT FOR FISCAL YEARS 2023 AND 2024.

Whereas, the Marion County Quorum Court is required by Arkansas Code Annotated 14-14-904 to determine its rules of procedure in order to properly conduct the business of county government.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IF ORDAINED BY THE QUOURM COURT OF MARION COUNTY, ARKANSAS THAT:

Section 1.

A The Quorum Court of Marion County, Arkansas adopts in its entirety the rules of procedure as stated in the Procedural Guide for Arkansas County Quorum Court Meetings, published by the Association of Arkansas Counties. In those instances where this guide does not explicitly address the situation, Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised (RONR) shall be the standard procedural guide for all meetings.

Section 2. Meeting Dates

- A. (1) The regular monthly meetings of the Marion County Quorum Court shall be held on the second Tuesday of each month, beginning at 6 p.m., in the 2nd floor courtroom of the Marion County Courthouse.
- (2) If the date of the regular meeting falls on a holiday, the County Judge is authorized and empowered to choose another date for the Quorum Court to meet. The County Judge shall notify the County Clerk of the date, and the County Clerk shall notify all members of the Quorum Court not less than four (4) days prior to the new meeting date.
- **B.** (1) The County Judge or a majority of the elected Justices of the Peace may call Special Meetings upon at least twenty-four (24) hour notice. The notice of said meeting shall specify the Subjects, Date, Time and Designated Location of the special meeting. Only such business as was included in the notice may be considered.
- (2) All special meetings of the Quorum Court and any of its committees shall be in conformance with the Arkansas Freedom of Information Act and all other Arkansas State laws.

Section 3. Order of Business

A The following order of business shall apply to regular and special called meetings of the Quorum Court.

- 1. Call to Order and Roll Call
- 2. Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance
- 3. Disposition of Minutes from Previous Meeting

- 4. Committee Reports
- 5. Unfinished Business
- 6. New Business
- 7. Comments/Questions from the Public

Any individual may be recognized by the presiding officer for comment, however, an individual shall not have more than three (3) minutes to speak on any one issue. If a member of the Quorum Court asks a question of an individual who has been recognized for comment, that individual shall have not more than one (1) minute to respond. A two-thirds vote of the total membership of the Quorum Court shall be required to override this rule.

- 8. Announcements
- 9. Adjournment

B The office of the County Clerk shall distribute, via electronic or US Mail, the Quorum Court agenda and supporting documentation at least seven (7) days prior to the Quorum Court meeting. Any reports, Ordinances or other documents needing to be presented to the Justices must be turned in to the Clerk's office no later than 3:30 p.m. seven (7) days priors to the meeting.

C Three (3) members of the Quorum Court may submit items after the agenda closes, if it is considered to be in the best interest of the county or that important.

D The ordinance shall have the Elected Official Name(s) on the Ordinance, who it effects, and, the name(s) of 3 Justice(s) or the committee sponsoring the ordinance to be submitted for passage.

E. If the ordinance being presented increases the annual budget for the elected official(s) the Elected Official or their delegate shall give a presentation on the proposed ordinance. The presentation shall include the need and justification for the Ordinance, the estimated cost and the annual reoccurring cost. The presentation shall also include where the funds will come from to complete the project.

Note: If the elected official, or their delegate, for whatever reason cannot attend the meeting the proposed ordinance shall be tabled until the next scheduled Quorum Court meeting.

F. Public input prior to the vote of an ordinance.

The public shall be allowed their input prior to a vote on any ordinance being presented providing:

- 1. They have the JP in their district as a sponsor.
- 2. They are on the agenda to speak on this issue.
- 3. They will be allowed 5 minutes to present their views at the Quorum Court or Committee meetings.

Section 4. Committee Appointments

A The following standing committees have been established and are to be comprised of at least three (3) members and not to exceed five (5) members each.

- 1. Budget Committee
- 2. Law Enforcement Committee
- 3. Personnel Committee
- 4. Solid Waste Committee
- 5. Procedure Management Committee

B The County Judge shall appoint members to the standing committees and to the ad hoc committees from the members of the Quorum Court. Appointments shall be made at the beginning of the Quorums Court's new term and before the February meeting of that term.

Section 5. Per Diem

A All Justices of the Peace of the Quorum Court shall receive a per diem of \$250.00 for each regular scheduled meeting and any special meeting.

B All Justices of the Peace who attend their assigned committee meetings shall receive a per diem of \$70.00 per meeting.

C In the event a member of the Quorum Court incurs expenses in the pursuit of official county business, he/she may request reimbursement for such expenses. To receive reimbursement, the member must submit to the County Judge the original, itemized receipts for all expenses and provide a description and explanation of the county business conducted. Approval for overnight expense reimbursement must be obtained from the County Judge in advance of the activity.

Section 6. The Rules of Decorum for the Quorum Court include:

A Members of the Quorum Court shall not use or make inappropriate, vulgar, or contemptuous words or offensive comments. Members shall maintain a civil and courteous manner and tone.

B Members of the Quorum Court shall only speak about the matter currently under consideration by the Quorum Court.

C During presentations, discussions, or debates, members of the Quorum Court shall refrain from communicating with each other, giving attention and due respect to the speaker or Quorum Court member addressing the body.

D While a member of the Quorum Court has the floor, members of the Quorum Court and members of the public shall not interrupt the speaker unless the speaker is ruled out of order.

E Justices violating any rules of decorum may be ruled out of order by the County Judge. An individual violating rules of decorum may be removed from the meeting by a majority vote of the Quorum Court or by order of the county judge.

Section 7. The Rules of Decorum for the Public include:

A Each speaker will direct comments to the members of the Quorum Court and not to any individual member or another individual present unless a question is directed to them by a member of the governing body.

B Each speaker will refrain from personal attacks and foul or abusive language and will maintain a civil and courteous manner and tone.

C Members of the audience will respect the rights of others and will not create noise or other disturbances that will disrupt or disturb the meeting.

D Language in the ordinance would establish that individuals violating any rules of decorum may be ruled out of order by the county judge. An individual violating the rules of decorum may be removed from the meeting by a majority vote of the Quorum Court or by order of the county judge.

Section 8. Sergeant-At-Arms

A The ordinance should provide for a sergeant-at-arms that would be responsible for ensuring that rules of procedure and order are not violated and for keeping order at all meetings of the Quorum Court and its committees. The sergeant-at-arms may be the Sheriff or a deputy sheriff provided by the Sheriff or, if not provided by the Sheriff, the sergeant-at-arms may be employed by the county judge to perform the functions of the position.

Section 9. Repeal

This ordinance shall repeal that part of any previous procedural ordinances with which it conflicts.

Section 10. Emergency Clause.

This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage by the Quorum Court.

Be it enacted by the Quorum Court of Marion County, Arkansas; An Ordinance to be entitled:

An Ordinance Amending Ordinance 22-98 entitled the Annual Budget and Numbers and Compensation for 2023.

Whereas, by Section 14-14-1204, Ark. Code Ann., the elected officials (Judge, Sheriff, Collector, Clerk, Assessor, Treasurer and Coroner) are to receive a 3% Cost of Living wage increase. However, in the passage of Ordinance 22-98, the numbers and compensation portion was not adjusted to reflect the increase. Therefore, the following adjustments need to be made to Ordinance 22-98 retroactive to January 1, 2023.

Whereas, the Quorum Court voted on a raise for their regular meetings (Ordinance 22-100) to \$250 per meeting, as such, the numbers and compensation portion of the budget ordinance needs to be amended to reflect this change.

Whereas, the numbers and compensation portion of Ordinance 22-98 was actually a spreadsheet from Human Resources and did show the current wages for each position, however, the spreadsheet does not accurately reflect actual budget line items.

Article 1: Numbers and Compensation shall be amended as follows:

As Amended: See Exhibit 2, which is incorporated herein by reference.

Article 2. This Ordinance herein enacted is an appropriation ordinance and therefore it is effective immediately.





6. HIRING AND PROMOTING

The at-will employment policy applies equally to hiring and promoting. Nothing herein shall ereate a property right in employment, an entitlement to be hired or promoted, or an expectancy of continued employment. Nothing herein establishes grounds upon which hiring or promoting must be based.

Effective upon passage of this Ordinance employees rehired after more than a sixty (60) day separation from employment shall be treated as new employees. If the employee left for medical reason (personal or family) and the gap in employment is less than six (6) months, the employee may be reinstated as if there had been no lapse at the discretion of their supervisor.

ARTICLE 2. Severability Clause: If any provision or article of this Ordinance is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions and articles of this Ordinance, and to such end the provisions and articles of the Ordinance are declared severable.



POLICY STATEMENT MARION COUNTY SHERIFF

POLICY ESTABLISHING EMERGENCY VACANCY LINE OF SUCCESSION FOR THE MARION COUNTY SHERIFF

l, Gregg L. Alexander, Marion County Sheriff, acting under the authority vested in me by law and pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 14-14-1310, do hereby order and direct as follows:

WHEREAS, Ark. Code Ann. § 14-14-1310 requires that during an emergency or circumstances that warrant a declaration of any emergency, a vacancy in the office of county sheriff due to death or disability to the degree of inability to perform the duties of office shall be temporarily filled by a policy statement of the sheriff issued prior to the incapacity of the sheriff, designating three (3) persons in succession to fill the vacancy of the office of county sheriff on an interim basis until such time as the vacancy is filled by the quorum court as provided by law or the disability of the county sheriff is abated.

THEREFORE, the line of succession for the Marion County Sheriff is hereby established in order of succession as follows:

- 1) Chief Deputy Mark Hollingsworth
- 2) Patrol Sergeant Zeb Gilley
- 3) Administrative Assistant Jacqueline Wallace

A copy of this policy statement shall be filed in the office of the Marion County Clerk and a file-marked copy shall be provided to the Marion County Quorum Court and the Director of the Arkansas Department of Emergency Management.
