# **MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES**

December 8, 2020

The Marion County Quorum Court held its regular meeting, on December 8, 2020 at 6 p.m., at the Marion County Courthouse.

Judge John Massey presided over the meeting. All Justices were present with the exception of Justice Madden.

Justice Brigham offer the invocation, and Justice Mayo led the Pledge.

The minutes were approved as were all reports given.

After all the reports were given the Court took a short recess to honor outgoing Justice Raymond Mayo for his service to the County.

## **New Business**

Ordinance 2020-76 – Judge’s Office – Transfer Funds – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance transfers \$2000.00 from 3009 Other Professional Services into 2001 General Office Supplies, in the Judge’s office. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-77 – Treasurer’s Office – Excess Commission – Sponsored by Justice Scrima. This ordinance transfers the Amended Excess Commission from the Treasurer’s office from all entities in County General. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice Mayo. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-78 – Elections – Clean Up – Sponsored by – Justice White, Mayo, Madden. This ordinance simply cleans up the Election budget after the reimbursement was distributed. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-79 – Assessor’s Office – Building Inspector Fees – Sponsored by Justice McCalla – This ordinance was going to allow for the creation of a special fund 3407 – Building Inspector Fees 2021 with the line item 3407-0110-3009 Other Professional Services. Beginning January, 2021, \$75 of each Development and Occupancy permit would go into this fund, with the other \$25 continuing to go into County General. This would allow for the pay for the building inspector to come out of this fund rather than being paid out of County General. Justice

Vancuren made the motion for this ordinance to be tabled until Assessor Tonya Eppes could more clearly explain what the intent is, at the Budget meeting scheduled for Thursday, December 10. Justice Scrima seconded the motion. The motion to table the ordinance passed with Justice Mayo voting against it.

Ordinance 2020-80 – Sheriff’s Department – Jailer Positions – Sponsored by Justice Madden. The intent of this ordinance was to lift the hiring freeze in all departments that jailers are paid from. So that when an employee quits, or is terminated the office is able to fill that position. Also, it was to amend Ordinance 2020-48 to rename the part time transport officer in 3018 to part time jailer and cap the salary at \$13.75. Justice Mayo asked if in Article 1 was meant to say “department” rather than “funds”. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Mayo. The motion failed. Justice Scrima, Nickels, Vancuren, Shipman and McCalla for the motion, and Justices White, Mayo and Brigham voted against it.

Ordinance 2020-81 – Judge’s Office – Transfer Funds – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance transfers the monies needed to pay off five Kenworth dump trucks purchases through Arvest Bank. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice Scrima. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-82 – Collector’s Office – Transfer Funds – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance transfers \$5000.00 in the Collector’s Automation Fund from Machinery & Equipment to Small Equipment. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-83 – Recorder’s Fund – Transfer Funds – Sponsored by Justices White, Madden and Mayo. This ordinance transfers funds in order to cover payroll until the end of the year for the Clerk and three deputies. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Nickels and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Fire Chief Ron Everoad of the Oakland/Promiseland Fire Department was allowed to speak. He said that this area of Marion County has a problem. There is no police presence in this area and it takes a very long time to get an officer on the scene of an accident. He continued by saying that this has been an ongoing problem to many years. He suggested that perhaps the county could get an agreement with Baxter County to speed up the process. He said that it usually takes over an hour to get a response. He asked that the court find a suggestion.

The meeting was adjourned.

**GRANT REPORT**  
**QUORUM COURT, TUESDAY, JANUARY 12, 2021**

**COUNTY**

Cares Act Grant – Initial report of what various departments have spent on Covid but since that time more items have been added to the list.

**ELECTION COMMISSION**

Cares Act Reimbursements – The application for funds were submitted in the amount of \$2,674.73 and that amount was received in full on January 4, 2021.

**FAIR BOARD**

The County Fair Building Grant Program is designed to assist rural county fairs with the construction and improvement of buildings through incentive grants on a matching basis. County Fairs located in counties with a population of less than 55,000 are eligible for up \$4,000 per fiscal year on a 50/50 matching basis. County fair organizations wishing to apply for a grant under the County Fair Building Grant Program are required to apply through their county judge's office. To be considered eligible, all applications must be signed by the county judge and approved by the quorum court. Grant funds may not be used to reimburse any part of the project already purchased or constructed. No part of the project may begin until after the community has received their grant check. This grant is due March 11, 2021.

**LIBRARY**

Grant for shelving – Shelving to arrive after first of year.  
Library has been looking into other grants.

**ROAD DEPARTMENT**

Unpaved Road Grant – Grant in the amount of \$75,000, matching grant. Focuses on improvement of unpaved road while reducing sediment bodies of water. Due March 1, 2021

**SHERIFF'S OFFICE**

eCrash/ecite System Grant by the Arkansas State Police – This is a Federal Program. The application was due December 22, 2020. The Sheriff's Office applied to equip 14 vehicles with laptops, printers, scanners, etc. so they could electronically input information regarding accidents or issue citations. They currently have none in their cars. All is done manually. This would help provide the state with more accurate and immediate information for their records and statistics. The total amount was \$51,133.12. There is a 10% local match requirement which would be \$5,133.51. Federal funds requested would be (90%) \$46,201.61. The benefits to our county, region, and state would be helpful in accident reporting, insurance claims, and statistical information in determining safety projects. I believe this is one of those projects that would be good to use some of our COVID grant money on. In the big scheme of things, if the government is going to give us \$46,201.61 we as a county should be ready, willing and able to provide \$5,133.51 to equip 14 vehicles with equipment from which our citizens can benefit.

Mini Step Grant by the Arkansas State Police - The purpose of the Mini-STEP Subgrant program is to provide funds to law enforcement agencies for highly visible overtime selective traffic enforcement during national/state mobilizations. The applicant must participate in public information and education activities that alert the public to the mobilizations. These could include:

National Distracted Driving mobilization  
National Seat Belt Mobilization  
National Winter DWI Mobilization  
Distracted Driving Mobilization  
National Memorial Day Seat Belt Mobilization  
State July 4<sup>th</sup> Holiday DWI Mobilization  
State Speed Mobilization  
National Labor Day DWI Mobilization

This should include but not limited to a minimum of two media exposures (including a pre-news and post news release for each mobilization). The agency will be required to conduct observational seat belt surveys before and after the seat belt mobilization for evaluation purposes.

There are other reimbursements that they could be eligible for as well. Grant is due August 18, 2021. The sooner we can submit the grant the better our chances will be to receive it.

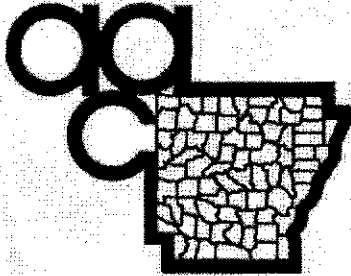

Marion County Budget Committee  
December 17, 2020

The meeting was called to order by Justice McCalla at 5:33 pm. Justice Scrima took the floor with his update of projected revenue for County General worksheets for each committee member. County Clerk Moffet spoke about filling an open position in the Clerks office that would be paid out of County General funds. Three proposals were offered to the committee. Justice Brigham suggested that the Clerk assemble an ordinance for the open position. Clerk Moffet responded that she was just coming to the committee for a sponsor. Assessor Eppes took the floor to discuss an open position in her office. The general consensus of the committee was to wait till the first quarter of year 2021 to look at filling open positions. Payroll Clerk Susan Crespino questioned the numbers and comps and that 35% of the salaries go above the numbers for benefits. To Law Enforcement: a short discussion followed on the exact number of openings there are; including a CID officer and a captain. Sheriff Evans offered that he was not going to fill the captains position and all he would request was to fill the CID officer and a deputy. That would give the county a total of 11 deputies including the Sheriff and to 3018, jail staffing; 12 full time jailers and 2 part-time. The previous Quorum Court meeting we did not support a 13<sup>th</sup> jailer. The mentioned ordinance on the additional jailer need to be reviewed. A short discussion followed concerning the transport officer and that he is now working in the jail and with sex offenders. Justice White spoke on the 75% collected of jailer fees and where the revenue is going? Justice White also added a catalog of funds. Judge Massey was questioned about the Grant Administrator position. E911 coordinator Story joined the conversation as to how many dispatchers are needed. Sheriff Evans was asked should the cities be paying for the use of the jail. Another discussion spawned of communities not paying for not paying for county services: dispatching and law enforcement. Attorney Chris Carter offered a script that he hands to every defendant stating what costs there are. Justice Brigham added there is an ordinance from year 2005 that states cities should pay for Marion County undertakings. E911 Coordinator Story was questioned about staffing: 6 full time, part-time and we need to add 2 positions. The question is the 2 positions going to be paid from PSAP? Judge Massey added that we need 2 part-time instead at \$25,000 each. The meeting was adjourned at 7:50pm.

## ORDINANCE 2021

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF MARION, STATE OF ARKANSAS AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES FOR THE Marion County Quorum Court for fiscal years 2021 and 2022.

WHEREAS, The Marion County Quorum Court is required by Arkansas Code Annotated §14-14-904 to determine its rules of procedure in order to properly conduct the business of county government.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF MARION COUNTY ARKANSAS THAT:

Section 1. The Quorum Court of Marion County, Arkansas adopts in its entirety the rules of procedure as stated in the Procedural Guide for Arkansas County Quorum Court Meetings, published by the Association of Arkansas Counties. In these instances where this guide does not explicitly address the situation, Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised (RONR) shall be the standard procedural guide for all meetings.

### Section 2. Meeting Dates

A (1) The regular meetings of the Marion County Quorum Court shall be held on the Second Tuesday of each month, beginning at 6:00 pm, in the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor courtroom of the Marion county Courthouse.

(2) If the date of the regular meeting date falls on a holiday, the County Judge is Authorized and empowered to choose another date for the Quorum Court to meet. The county Judge shall notify the county Clerk of the date, and the County Clerk shall notify all members of the Quorum Court not less than four (4) days prior to the new meeting date.

B (1) The county Judge or a majority of the elected Justices of the Peace may call Special meetings upon at least twenty-four (24) hour notice. The notice of said meeting shall specify the SUBJECTS, DATE, TIME and DESIGNATED LOCATION of the special meeting. Only such business as was included in the notice may be considered.

(2) All special meetings of the Quorum Court and any of its committees shall be in Conformance with the Arkansas Freedom of Information Act and all other Arkansas State laws.

### Section 3. Order of Business

- (a) The following Order of Business shall apply to regular and special called meetings of the Quorum Court.
  - 1. Call to Order and Roll Call
  - 2. Pledge of Allegiance and Invocation

3. Disposition of Minutes from Previous Meeting
  4. Committee Reports
  5. Unfinished Business
  6. New Business
  7. Comments/Questions from the Public
  8. Announcements
  9. Adjournment
- (b) The office of the County Clerk shall distribute, via electronic or US Mail, the Quorum Court agenda and supporting documentation at least seven (7) days prior to the Quorum Court Meeting
- (c) Three (3) of the Quorum Court and the county Judge may jointly submit items after the Agenda Closes, if it is considered to be in the best interest of the county. This submission may be added by three of the Justices, if the matter is determined to be that important.
- (d) Have the name(s) of Justice(s) sponsoring the emergency Ordinance to be submitted for passage.

#### Section 4. Committee Appointments

- (a) The following standing committees have been established and are to be comprised of at least three (3) members and not to exceed five (5) members each.
- (1) Budget Committee
  - (2) Law Enforcement committee
  - (3) Personnel Committee
  - (4) Solid Waste Committee
  - (5) Procedures Management Committee
- (b) The County Judge shall appoint members to the standing committees and to the ad hoc committees from the members of the Quorum Court. Appointments shall be made at the beginning of the Quorum Court's new term and before the February meeting of that term.

#### Section 5. Per Diem

- (a) All Justices of the Peace of the Quorum Court shall receive a per diem of \$200 for a regular scheduled meeting and any Special meeting.
- (b) All Justices of the peace who attend their assigned committee meetings shall receive a per diem of \$70 per meeting.
- (c) In the event a member of the Quorum Court incurs expenses in the pursuit of official county business, he/she may request reimbursement for such expenses. To receive reimbursement, the member must submit to the County Judge the original, itemized receipts for all expenses and provide a description and explanation of the county business conducted. Approval for the overnight expense reimbursement must be obtained from the County Judge in advance of the activity.

Section 6. Repealer. This ordinance shall repeal that part of any  
Previous ordinance with which conflicts.

Section 7. Emergency Clause. This Ordinance shall be effective  
Immediately upon passage by the Quorum Court.

**ORDINANCE 2021 –**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF COUNTY MARION,  
ARKANSAS; AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:**

**AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AND ADOPTING A BUDGET FOR  
MARION COUNTY, ARKANSAS FOR THE PERIOD BEGINNING  
JANUARY 1, 2021, AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2021**

**Article 1. ANNUAL BUDGET ADOPTED BY REFERENCE.** The annual budget for calendar year 2021 identified as “ANNUAL BUDGET, MARION COUNTY, ARKANSAS” dated January 12, 2021 is hereby adopted by reference. A copy of said budget shall be filed in the office of the Circuit/County Clerk and shall be available for inspection and copying by any person during normal office hours.

**Article 2. NONRESTRICTED EXPENDITURES CATEGORIES.** Expenditure of funds appropriated by this Ordinance shall not be restricted to the line item expenditure codes comprising the major categories of expenditures – Personal Services, Supplies, Other Services and Charges, Capital Outlay, and Debt Service – but shall be restricted to office/departmental expenditures within the above enumerated major categories of expenditures except for funds appropriated for personal salaries and wages and related employee benefits. Personnel expenditures shall not exceed the dollar amounts, numbers of employees and salary or wage rates specified in the annual budget or an amendment thereof.

**Article 3. PERSONAL SERVICE SCHEDULE AND WAGES.** Wages for county employees are based on the various responsibilities, duties, licensing requirements and length of service. The Personal Service and Wage Schedule is attached. Each elected



Official is responsible for preparing the job descriptions for each position(s) within their department(s). In addition, each elected official is responsible for submitting whatever additional information requested by the Personnel Committee and Budget Committee before any new positions are added to this schedule. In addition, hiring employees due to vacancies or salary increases require approval from the budget committee. **Note: During times of Public Emergencies effecting Marion County, employees classified as Public Safety Employees, are exempt from this Article. Public Safety Employees are defined as Law Enforcement Personnel, Office of Emergency Management (OEM), 911 Office, Road Department and any other department's personnel as determined by the Marion County Judge.**

**Article 4. EXPENDITURES RESTRICTED TO SPECIFIED FUND.** No expenditures of appropriated funds shall be made from any fund other than the fund specified in this Ordinance or an amendment therein.

**Article 6. TRANSFERS.** Included in this budget are two (2) conditional transfers of County General Funds. The first one is a conditional transfer of up to \$418,000.00 from County General Fund to the Department of the Sheriff's Law Enforcement Fund on a "As Needed Basis" condition. The second transfer of County General Funds is the conditional transfer of up to \$100,000.00 to the County Judge's E911 Department Fund on a "As Needed Basis" condition. Other than these two conditional transfers of funds any transfers of monies between various funds of the County or between the major categories of expenditures – Personal Services, Supplies, Other Services and Charges, Capital Outlay, and Debt Service – shall be made only with prior approval of the Marion County Quorum Court. Provided, however all transfers budgeted for in the annual budget shall be exempt from the provisions of this section.

**Article 7. SEVERABILITY.** If any provisions of this Ordinance or the application thereof any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

**Article 8.** This ordinance being necessary for the protection and preservation of public health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in force and shall take effect upon passage and publication.
