MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

January 12, 2021

The Marion County Quorum Court held its regular meeting, on January 12, 2021 at 6 p.m., at the Marion County Courthouse.

In compliance with the ADH guidelines, the audience for this meeting was limited to 22 people besides elected officials. Screening was completed before the meeting began.

Judge John Massey presided over the meeting. All Justices were present.

Justice Brigham offer the invocation, and Justice Madden led the Pledge.

The minutes were approved as were all reports given.

New Business

Before the business meeting began, Justice Scrima made a motion to move the Sales Tax ordinance before the budget ordinance. Justice Vancuren seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

A motion to read all the ordinances by title only was made by Justice Madded and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-1 – Procedure Ordinance – Sponsored by Justices McCalla and Brigham. This ordinance outlines the procedures for the Quorum Court for the fiscal years of 2021 and 2022. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice Vancuren. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-2 – Transfer of Funds – Sponsored by Justices McCalla and Brigham. This ordinance allows for all funds in 3009 Transfer Station Fees and 3036 Recycling fund to be transferred into 1802 Sales Tax fund. Fund 3036 will become a dormant fund. Fund 3009 will remain active. These funds will then be transferred at the beginning of the following year into the 1802 operating budget for the transfer station. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Brigham and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-3 – Amending 2020-37 – Sponsored by Justices Madden and McCalla. This ordinance will amend ordinance 2020-37 Article 2. It will take five percent of the total sales tax collect from 1801-200 Marion County Road and be transferred to 1803 Volunteer Fire Departments. Then these monies will be

transferred to 3020-0501 E-911 fund to pay for the volunteer fire department part of dispatchers. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-4 – 2021 Budget & Numbers and Compensation – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. This Ordinance adopts the 2021 Budget beginning January 1, 2021 and ending December 31, 2021. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice Vancuren. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-5 – Road Department Hiring Freeze – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance lifts the hiring freeze for the road department so that open positions can be filled immediately. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-6 – Clean Up Ordinance – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This is simply cleaning up the 2020 Budget. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Underwood and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Judge Massey made several appointments to some of the various boards that serve in Marion County. Benjamin Crombie and Stephanie Hutcheson were appointed to the Marion County Fair and Livestock Show Board. Crombie's term will end on December 31, 2022 and Hutcheson will expire on December 2021. John Yates was appointed to the Marion County Regional Airport Board, this term will end December 31, 2026. Eddie White was appointed to the Marion County Planning Board along with Tia Davies. Their terms will expire on December 31, 2024. Carl McBee, Jr. was appointed to the Marion County Library Board with the term expiring on December 31, 2025.

Bull Shoals Mayor, David Nixon had asked to be placed on the agenda to discuss the 9-11 dispatching.

Before he began, Judge Massey presented some history on what he had presented to the cities of Bull Shoals and Flippin. Judge stated that at this time the county dispatchers were doing all the clerical work for the cities (entering warrants, running plates ect.). He had gone to their Council meetings with a request that each city pay \$21000.00 to help pay for two part time dispatchers. He stated that the county was \$300000 short to provide proper services. He continue to state that cities with their own departments and police chiefs by law can help with 911. Massey continued by saying that if the cities and the county didn't come up with a compromise, services would end for the cities on February 1, 2021.

Mayor Nixon began by apologizing to the Court for having to present a paper of what the duties of the Quorum Court are. Nixon continued to state that the cities are already paying their share through taxation, dedicated telephone service levies and contributions to state and federal funding provided to Marion County. Nixon presented numbers showing that Bull Shoals is 12% of the population of Marion County. Flippin is 8% of the population. He felt that the money asked for should perhaps be funded by population. He contended that there was no statutory basis for this request.

At the end of Mayor Nixon's presentation, Judge Massey offered to hold a meeting to resolve this problem.

Another member of the audience asked to speak, but because he was not on the agenda, that request was denied.

The meeting was adjourned.

ORDINANCE 2021 - I

JAN 14 2021

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF THE COUNTY OF MARION, STATE OF ARKANSAS AN EMERGENCENCY ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES FOR THE Marion County Quorum Court for fiscal years 2021 and 2022.

WHEREAS, The Marion County Quorum Court is required by Arkansas Code Annotated §14-14-904 to determine its rules of procedure in order to properly conduct the business of county government.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF MARION COUNTY ARKANSAS THAT:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Quorum Court of Marion County, Arkansas adopts in its entirety the rules of procedure as stated in the Procedural Guide for Arkansas County Quorum Court Meetings, published by the Association of Arkansas Counties. In these instances where this guide does not explicitly address the situation, Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised (RONR) shall be the standard procedural guide for all meetings.

Section 2. Meeting Dates

- A (1) The regular meetings of the Marion County Quorum Court shall be held on the Second Tuesday of each month, beginning at 6:00 pm, in the 2nd floor courtroom of the Marion county Courthouse.
- (2) If the date of the regular meeting date falls on a holiday, the County Judge is Authorized and empowered to choose another date for the Quorum Court to meet. The county Judge shall notify the county Clerk of the date, and the County Clerk shall notify all members of the Quorum Court not less than four (4) days prior to the new meeting date.
- B (1) The county Judge or a majority of the elected Justices of the Peace may call Special meetings upon at least twenty-four (24) hour notice. The notice of said meeting shall specify the SUBJECTS, DATE, TIME and DESIGNATED LOCATION of the special meeting. Only such business as was included in the notice may be considered.
- (2) All special meetings of the Quorum Court and any of its committees shall be in Conformance with the Arkansas Freedom of Information Act and all other Arkansas State laws.

Section 3. Order of Business

- (a) The following Order of Business shall apply to regular and special called meetings of the Quorum Court.
 - 1. Call to Order and Roll Call
 - 2. Pledge of Allegiance and Invocation

- 3. Disposition of Minutes from Previous Meeting
- 4. Committee Reports
- 5. Unfinished Business
- 6. New Business
- 7. Comments/Questions from the Public
- 8. Announcements
- 9. Adjournment
- (b) The office of the County Clerk shall distribute, via electronic or US Mail, the Quorum Court agenda and supporting documentation at least seven (7) days prior to the Quorum Court Meeting
- (c) Three (3) of the Quorum Court and the county Judge may jointly submit items after the Agenda Closes, if it is considered to be in the best interest of the county. This submission may be added by three of the Justices, if the matter is determined to be that important.
- (d) Have the name(s) of Justice(s) sponsoring the emergency Ordinance to be submitted for passage.

Section 4. Committee Appointments

- (a) The following standing committees have been established and are to be comprised of at least three (3) members and not to exceed five (5) members each.
 - (1) Budget Committee
 - (2) Law Enforcement committee
 - (3) Personnel Committee
 - (4) Solid Waste Committee
 - (5) Procedures Management Committee
- (b) The County Judge shall appoint members to the standing committees and to the ad hoc committees from the members of the Quorum Court. Appointments shall be made at the beginning of the Quorum Court's new term and before the February meeting of that term.

Section 5. Per Diem

- (a) All Justices of the Peace of the Quorum Court shall receive a per diem of \$200 for a regular scheduled meeting and any Special meeting.
- (b) All Justices of the peace who attend their assigned committee meetings shall receive a per diem of \$70 per meeting.
- (c) In the event a member of the Quorum Court incurs expenses in the pursuit of official county business, he/she may request reimbursement for such expenses. To receive reimbursement, the member must submit to the County Judge the original, itemized receipts for all expenses and provide a description and explanation of the county business conducted. Approval for the overnight expense reimbursement must be obtained from the County Judge in advance of the activity.

<u>Section 6. Repealer.</u> This ordinance shall repeal that part of any Previous ordinance with which conflicts.

Section 7. Emergency Clause. This Ordinance shall be effective Immediately upon passage by the Quorum Court.

ORDINANCE 2021- 2

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF MARION COUNTY, ARKANSAS, AND AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

AN ORDINANCE THAT WILL TRANSFER ALL FUNDS FROM 3009 TRANSFER STATION FEE'S AND 3036 RECYCLING FUNDS TO 1802 SALES TAX TRANSFER STATION, AND MAKE 3036 A DORMANT FUND.

ARTICLE 1. All funds in 3009 Transfer Station Fee's and 3036 Recycling funds will be transferred to the 1802 Sales Tax Fund upon passage of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE 2. Fund 3036 was created by an ordinance to receive revenues generated by the recycling operation of the County. Therefore, it can be put dormant by an ordinance. 3009 will remain an active fund and will receive monies throughout the year. These funds will be transferred at the beginning of the following year into the 1802 Operating budget for the Transfer Station.

ARTICLE 3. There is a need to raise anticipated revenue in 1802 due to the funds being transferred from 3009 and 3036.

ARTICLE 4. This Ordinance herein enacted is an appropriation Ordinance and therefore, it is effective immediately.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF MARION COUNTY, ARKANSAS AND AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2020-37 Article 2. Moving 5% from 1801-0200 and transferring to 3020 to cover the cost of 3 dispatchers. In order to be in compliance, there is a need to amend the use and transfer of this sales tax.

ARTICLE 1: There is a need to take the five-percent (5%) of the total of the sales tax collected, from 1801-0200 Marion County Road and transfer it to 1803 Volunteer Fire Departments.

ARTICLE 2: The five percent (5%) of the total sales tax that is being transferred from the road department 1801-0200 will be transferred to 3020-0501 to E-911 to pay for the volunteer fire departments part of dispatchers.

These monies shall only be used in fund 3020 for the payroll of dispatchers.

ARTICLE 3: Emergency Clause: It is hereby determined that this Ordinance is essential for the safety, health and welfare of the citizens of Marion County. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance being necessary to cover the cost of salaries and reflect actual budgeting will be effective immediately. All Ordinances not in conflict with this ordinance, shall remain in full force and effect.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF COUNTY MARION, ARKANSAS; AN ORDINANCE TO BE ENTITLED:

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AND ADOPTING A BUDGET FOR MARION COUNTY, ARKANSAS FOR THE PERIOD BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2021, AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2021

Article 1. ANNUAL BUDGET ADOPTED BY REFERENCE. The annual budget for calendar year 2021 identified as "ANNUAL BUDGET, MARION COUNTY, ARKANSAS" dated January 12, 2021 is hereby adopted by reference. A copy of said budget shall be filed in the office of the Circuit/County Clerk and shall be available for inspection and copying by any person during normal office hours.

Article 2. NONRESTRICTED EXPENDITURES CATEGORIES. Expenditure of funds appropriated by this Ordinance shall not be restricted to the line item expenditure codes comprising the major categories of expenditures – Personal Services, Supplies, Other Services and Charges, Capital Outlay, and Debt Service – but shall be restricted to office/departmental expenditures within the above enumerated major categories of expenditures except for funds appropriated for personal salaries and wages and related employee benefits. Personnel expenditures shall not exceed the dollar amounts, numbers of employees and salary or wage rates specified in the annual budget or an amendment thereof.

<u>Article 3.</u> PERSONAL SERVICE SCHEDULE AND WAGES. Wages for county employees are based on the various responsibilities, duties, licensing requirements and length of service. The Personal Service and Wage Schedule is attached. Each elected

Official is responsible for preparing the job descriptions for each position(s) within their department(s). In addition, each elected official is responsible for submitting whatever additional information requested by the Personnel Committee and Budget Committee before any new positions are added to this schedule. In addition, hiring employees due to vacancies or salary increases require approval from the budget committee. Note: During times of Public Emergencies effecting Marion County, employees classified as Public Safety Employees, are exempt from this Article. Public Safety Employees are defined as Law Enforcement Personnel, Office of Emergency Management (OEM), 911 Office, Road Department and any other department's personnel as determined by the Marion County Judge.

Article 4. EXPENDITURES RESTRICTED TO SPECIFIED FUND. No expenditures of appropriated funds shall be made from any fund other than the fund specified in this Ordinance or an amendment therein.

Article 5. REVENUES AND APPROPRIATIONS.

Article 6. TRANSFERS. Included in this budget are two (2) conditional transfers of County General Funds. The first one is a conditional transfer of up to \$418,000.00 from County General Fund to the Department of the Sheriff's Law Enforcement Fund on a "As Needed Basis" condition. The second transfer of County General Funds is the conditional transfer of up to \$82,000.00 to the County Judge's E911 Department Fund on a "As Needed Basis" condition. Other than these two conditional transfers of funds any transfers of monies between various funds of the County or between the major categories of expenditures – Personal Services, Supplies, Other Services and Charges, Capital Outlay, and Debt Service – shall be made only with prior approval of the Marion County Quorum Court. Provided, however all transfers budgeted for in the annual budget shall be exempt from the provisions of this section.

Article 7. SEVERABILITY. If any provisions of this Ordinance or the application thereof any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

Article 8. This ordinance being necessary for the protection and preservation of public health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in force and shall take effect upon passage and publication.
