MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

December 14, 2021

The Marion County Quorum Court began its December meeting at 5 p.m., and immediately going into an executive session, to discuss and interview for a possible replacement of the Marion County Treasurer, who is retiring December 31, 2021. The executive session ended at 5:37.

The regular meeting was called to order at 6 p.m.

County Judge Massey presided over the meeting. All Justices were present. Justice Madden gave the invocation and Karen Carter led the pledge.

The minutes and all reports were approved.

Old Business:

New Business:

Ordinance 2021-113 – Library Board – Sponsored by Justice Brigham. This ordinance allows the Library Board to continue to administer and operate the library. However, the employees shall be considered to be county employees for the purposes of benefits and compensation, and shall be subject to the employee policy. Any employee compensation will be subject to the rules and regulations set forth by the Quorum Court and administered by the County Judge. Any contracts or leases shall be required to be review and approved by the County Judge. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-114 – Arkansas Economic Development Block Grant – Vexus – Sponsored by Justice Underwood. The motion to read by title only was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously. This ordinance appropriates the monies received from a grant in the amount of \$205220.00 in the line items of accounting and auditing (\$5220.00) and machinery and equipment (\$200000.00), in fund 3573 – Advanced Marine Performance. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-115 – Repealing Ordinance 2018-46 – Transfer Station – Sponsored by Justices White, Brigham and McCalla. The motion to read by title only was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Brigham. The motion

passed unanimously. This ordinance repeals ordinance 2018-46, which allowed the employees at the transfer station to receive a \$1000 bonus per year from the Waste Tire Fund (3051) if funding was available. These funds are received from the Ozark Mountain Solid Waste District for managing, monitoring and overseeing the added responsibility of the tire program. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-116 – Repealing Ordinance 2018-61 – Assessor's Office – Sponsored by Justices Vancuren, White, and Brigham. This ordinance repeals Ordinance 2018-61 which allowed the Assessor's office to give a \$400 a year bonus to four employees from fund 3004 – Assessors PTRF Amendment 79, if the money was available. The funds are received from the State of Arkansas for managing, monitoring and overseeing the responsibility of the Homestead credits. During the discussion, Justice White commented that an ordinance is in fact a county law, and he wanted to know how they could just repeal and existing law. He felt that this bonus should be paid for the year 2021. Assessor Tonya Eppes stated that she had sent in this request twice and it was denied both times. She also mentioned that this money was coming from a special fund and didn't affect the County General fund. Justice Scrima motioned to remove section five of the ordinance (which is the severability clause), Justice White seconded the motion and the motion passed with Justices Brigham and Vancuren voting against it. Justice Vancuren remarked that with the extra money that was received during COVID and the American Relief fund money was compensation enough. He also stated that he had an issue with elected officials not using their special funds to keep more money in County General. Justice Brigham replied that these special funds were not individual funds, but county funds, and reminded Assessor Eppes that her people were no better than anyone else. Justice Vancuren concurred that ordinances like these needed to be abolished. Justice White commented that an Ordinance was county law. Justice Vancuren said that the law says that the money can be used if available and he did not think that it was available. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Brigham and seconded by justice McCalla. The motion passed with Justices Scrima, White and Shipman voting against it.

Ordinance 2021-117 – Premium Pay Act – Repealing Ordinance 2021-103. Sponsored by Justices Vancuren, White and Brigham. The motion to read by title only was made by Justice Brigham and seconded by Justice McCalla. This ordinance repeals Ordinance 2021-103 which allowed the county to compensate eligible county employees continually employed by the County for any of the period between February 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020. The motion to

adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice Brigham. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-118 – Assessor's Office – End of Reappraisal Contract – Sponsored by Justices Scrima, White and Nickels. This ordinance would allow the request of \$9210.00 from County General and \$9210.00 from Fund 3004 PTRF Amendment 79 Fund to Fund 3011 Assessor Reappraisal Cost Fund. This money is needed to pay the end of contract for the reappraisal. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice White. During the discussion, Justice Vancuren suggested that this ordinance be reviewed by the Budget committee. Justice McCalla suggested that the money should come out of the special fund, leaving \$5000. Assessor Eppes stated that she had come to the budget meeting and before the Quorum Court but no money was transferred. She continued by stating that the money was in her budget request which was approved by the budget committee and ultimately by the Quorum Court when the budget passed. But the money was never physically transferred. Justice Vancuren made the motion to send this matter to the Budget Committee. Justice Brigham seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-119 – Sheriff's Department – American Rescue Plan – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. The motion to read by title only was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. This ordinance corrects the clerical errors in Ordinance 2021-103. Some errors were made in creating the ordinance allowing for the payment of the America Rescue Plan funds to the elected officials and employees of Marion County. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Underwood. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-120 – Personnel Policy Update – Sponsored by the Budget and Personnel Committees. This ordinance updates the Personnel Policy with the added requirements that all forms and documents must be submitted to the Comptroller prior to the new employees first scheduled work date. If the forms and documents are not received in time, the employee's paycheck will be held by the Comptroller. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-121 – Road Department – Appropriations – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. The motion to read by title only was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously. This ordinance transfers \$2725.00 from machinery and equipment to repair and parts in the road department budget. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Brigham and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-122 – Law Enforcement – Payroll Raises – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. Justice Vancuren made the motion to read the ordinance by title only. Justice McCalla seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. This ordinance allows for the Laws Enforcement personnel to receive raises. Justice Vancuren made the motion to strike articles 3 and 4 which pertained to the Metro division of the Sheriff's department. He later rescinded that motion. Judge Massey and Justice McCalla both made it clear that this ordinance had been presented to the budget committee and approved. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed with Justices Scrima, Vancuren and White voting against it.

Ordinance 2021-123 – Courthouse and Annex – Building Improvements – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. This ordinance appropriates \$31021.25 from the building improvement fund (3403) to pay the invoices for the new furniture in the breakroom at the courthouse and the new furniture and remodel of the courtroom at the annex. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Two resolutions were read but were not voted on as they will be presented to the Court at the January meeting. The first resolution was supporting the establishment of an income tax credit for full time law enforcement officers. The second was to remove Carl McBee, Jr. from the Library Board.

The Crooked Creek Conservation District gave a report regarding their contributions to the county. They encouraged all residents to take advantage of their services.

The meeting was adjourned.

Staffing: We are currently staffed with 8 (YAY) full time and 0 part time staff. This leaves us down 0 full time and 2 part time positions. I am super excited about the amount of service and coverage Marion County 911 will now be able to provide to the citizens of Marion County.

Training: We are actively working on training and continued education for all staff. 2 of our new hires are enrolled to the ACIC level 3 Security and ACIC Basic Certification.

Technical Issues: We had no major technical issues for the month. One of the previous issues we have been experiencing is when dispatch pages out Auto Aides for Structure Fires, some of the Fire Districts are not receiving their tones. For this reason, we have a new system in place to page out each district by the tower they are set up to operate from. In other words, if there is a need to page out Auto Aide and there are departments under each of the 3 towers. An example would be we would page out the appropriate departments assigned to North Tower, then in a separate page for the departments assigned to Central Tower, and then another page for the departments assigned to South Tower. This process will take a little more time to do but I believe this will be a good temporary fix until Zetron comes in to make the necessary repairs to the dispatch console.

Operations: I am very proud of the team work the 911 staff have shown, training and supporting each other. We are striving the one of the best 911/Communications Centers in the Nation.

GRANT REPORT QUORUM COURT, TUESDAY, JANUARY 13, 2022

AMERICAN RESCUE FUNDS

We continue to attend meetings and receive information about the American Rescue Funds. We are waiting for a final rule from the Treasury Department give further clarification of projects for which funds can be used. Treasury has revised the deadline for the submission of the first Project and Expenditure Report. Metropolitan counties and cities with a population lower than 250,000 and awards less than \$10 million- the report will now be due on April 30, 2022 and will cover the period between March 3 and March 31, 2022. The report will be due annually by the end of April.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Oakland Promise Land Fire Protection District - Arkansas Rural Community Grant Program - Applicants with an eligible project may apply for up to \$15,000 in state matching funds toward a project for community development or fire protection projects. Oakland Promise Land Fire Protection District has presented plans to purchase 24 tankers for Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBAs). Total cost is 16,980.00. OPLFPD has plans to provide \$8,490.00 and is seeking matching grant funds in the amount of \$8,490.00. This property has been submitted. They received their requested amount of funds. Equipment had been purchased. I am closing this grant out.

A RESOLUTION OF THE QUORUM COURT OF _____ COUNTY, ARKANSAS, SUPPORTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN INCOME TAX CREDIT FOR FULLTIME LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS IN THE STATE OF ARKANSAS

Whereas, the Governor's Task Force to Advance the State of Law Enforcement in Arkansas recommended legislation that eases the state income tax burden on our active full-time law enforcement officers and recommended ensuring that entry level salaries for law enforcement officers be equivalent to or above the average annual wage in Arkansas;

Whereas, the average annual wage for full-time law enforcement officers in Arkansas ranks 49th in the nation and averages \$40,750 annually, below the average statewide wage in Arkansas of \$42,690; and the average entry level wage for law enforcement officers in Arkansas is \$28,610, barely above the yearly earnings of a minimum wage worker.

Whereas, law enforcement officers in the State of Arkansas risk their lives every day, working long hours for subpar wages, while Arkansas has one of the highest violent crime rates in the US and ranks as the 4th most dangerous state in the nation;

Whereas, the Governor's Task Force to Advance the State of Law Enforcement in Arkansas identified the incredibly low salaries and limited agency funding to be the biggest barriers to law enforcement retention, recruitment, and hiring;

Whereas, the Governor's Task Force to Advance the State of Law Enforcement recommended a state income tax credit for full-time law enforcement officers in order to substantially promote retention, recruitment, hiring, a boost in morale, and greater economic security for full-time law enforcement officers and their families;

Whereas, the 93rd General Assembly of the State of Arkansas was duly presented legislation, SB 304 of 2021, during the 2021 regular session of the General Assembly which sought to establish a \$3,000 non-refundable state income tax to full-time law enforcement officers, however, SB 304 was not voted upon, passed or adopted into law;

Whereas, the State of Arkansas now has unprecedented record surpluses, and the Governor of the State of Arkansas intends to call a special session of the General

Assembly to consider and adopt numerous state income tax credits and rate reduction measures which in the aggregate in will total hundreds of millions of dollars;

Whereas, the sponsors of SB304 have expressed an intent to file legislation seeking to establish a refundable state income tax credit for all full-time law enforcement officers in the sum of \$3,000 to be duly considered by the members of General Assembly of the State of Arkansas for their deliberation and to be adopted during the anticipated special session of the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas;

Now Therefore, the QUORUM COURT OF ______ COUNTY, ARKANSAS, hereby resolves to fully and robustly support full-time law enforcement officers in Arkansas, to "Back the Blue", and to advocate our members of the General Assembly, the Governor and the members of the General Assembly as a whole, for the due consideration and adoption by the General Assembly and signing by the Governor of Arkansas, of legislation creating: a state income tax credit for full-time law enforcement officers; that the full-time law enforcement income tax credit legislation include signed verification requirements before a full-time law enforcement officer may qualify for the state income tax credit; and respectfully encourage the full-time law enforcement state income tax credit legislation to be a legislative priority of the General Assembly and the Governor of the State of Arkansas. A copy of this resolution should be provided to your legislators requesting them to co-sponsor the proposed legislation.
