MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

May 11, 2021

The Marion County Quorum Court held its regular meeting, on May 11, 2021 at 6 p.m., at the Marion County Courthouse.

County Judge presided over the meeting. All Justices were present.

Justice Shipman gave the invocation and Justice McCalla led the pledge.

The minutes and all reports were approved.

Unfinished business:

Ordinance 21-29 – Amending Ordinance 2012-17 – Second Reading – Sponsored by Justices Scrima, Shipman, Madden and White. This ordinance will amend the Standards and Regulation for the Development and Subdivision of Land. To motion to approve the second reading was made by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice Vancuren. The motion passed unanimously.

New business:

Judge Massey asked County Attorney Sam Pasting to give a report on the Ozark Mountain Solid Waste case. Pasting announced that there had been a hearing in Little Rock on May 10. The monies collected in the amount of \$2.4 million are being held by the receiver. The question is when this money is going to be returned to the tax payers. The Judge in Little Rock has stated that this money will not be returned unless the Supreme Courts states that it should be done. The Judge has 15 days to make a decision on how to proceed. Then there will probably be another trial and that decision will most likely be appealed.

Judge Massey announced that he notified the residents of Pine Hollow Road that this was not a closed private road, but actually MC 175. Also it was announced that Thousand Oaks is now MC 6012.

Discussion of the 2019 Legislative Audit was next on the agenda. The Judge's office was written up regarding the fixed asset records that were not properly maintained. Judge Massey stated that his office was working very hard on remedying this situation.

The next item was the discussion of the Sheriff's audit. His office was written up for the Commissary bank account not being identified, not handing over the funds

to the treasurer in a timely manner, and notes regarding the deposits into the Commissary Account. Justice Scrima asked the Sheriff what the plan was to do something with the system to address the issue of the collection of fines and fees. Sheriff Evans stated that he would get together with the prosecutor and see what they could come up with to solve this problem. Justice White stated that there is a state law that specifically says that the law enforcement funds much be turned over to the treasurer in a timely manner. The Sheriff said that the lack of manpower was making it difficult to get everything done on time. He also announced that Joan Vickers was volunteering her time to assist with the accounting duties. Justice Brigham pointed out that these were the same problems from years past. Especially on the Commissary account. Sheriff Evans said that they were having an issue with their Commissary vendor regarding the accounting and were having a difficult time getting it resolved. Sheriff Evans continued by saying that Sam Pasting had drafted a letter to the vendor in order to get this matter behind them. He continued by stating that when it was resolved, then he would be searching for another vendor.

Judge Massey said that he had met with the representative from Apprentice and they were going to help the county to set up electronic time sheets. And that electronic time clocks would be placed in each office. He also asked the Quorum Court to consider swapping banks as they have been having issues with the current one. Also, he continued that direct deposit would also be looked into. He announced that the comptroller would be getting a new program called Beagle to assist in the reporting aspect of Apprentice.

Ordinance 2021-31 – Clerk’s Office – Lifting Hiring Freeze – Sponsored by the Personnel Committee. This ordinance lifts the hiring freeze in the Clerk’s office in order to hire two deputies to replace two employees who are retiring on June 30, 2021. It also amends the Number and Compensation portion of Ordinance 2021-4, to reflect the changes of this ordinance and the ordinance regarding the comptroller. The motion to adopt was made by Justice McCalla and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed with Justice Vancuren voting against it.

Ordinance 2021-32 – Treasurer’s Office – Transfer of Treasurer’s Commission – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance appropriates \$163,378.43 from the Treasurer’s Commission into the various funds that are entitled to the reimbursement. The motion to adopt was made by Justice McCalla and seconded by Justice Scrima. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-33 – Administration of Justice Fund – Sponsored by Justice Scrima. This ordinance transfer \$1617.14 from fund 6009 – Administration of

Justice to fund 3035 County Administration of Justice - Law Library. The motion to adopt was made by Justice McCalla and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-34 – Personnel Policy – Amendments – Sponsored by the Personnel Committee. This ordinance amends Ordinance 2018-4 The Personnel Policy. These amendments addresses children in the workplace and the used of County vehicles. No child or children under the age of 18 will be allowed in the workplace on a regular basis unless the elected official is notified, who then in turn notifies the County Judge. The Judge will determine if the child or children will be allowed in the workplace. No vehicle owned by Marion County will be allowed to transport a non-Marion County employee for a non-Marion County government benefit for a non emergency event. This does not prohibit law enforcement from doing their day to day activities. The motion to adopt was made by Justice McCalla and seconded by Justice Scrima. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-35 – Collector's Office – Refund to Well's Fargo – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance was to refund \$1290.59 back to Wells fargo Real Estate Tax Service. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Nickels and seconded by Justice McCalla. During discussion, Justice Brigham had a question for the Collector, concerning why this refund needed to be made. With the absence of Collector Cathy Brightwell, Justice Vancuren motioned to table the ordinance until the June meeting. Justice Brigham seconded that motion and it passed unanimously by voice vote.

Ordinance 2021-36 – Various Offices – Postage Distribution – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance transfers the amount of postage used by the courthouse offices and committees back to the Collector. The motion to adopt was made by Justice McCalla and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-37 – Amending Ordinance 2016-12 – Sponsored by Justices Scrima, White and Brigham. This ordinance updates the vehicle emblem policy, and the requirements of the asset numbers and their placement. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice Scrima. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-38 – Sheriff's Department – Vehicle Purchases – Sponsored by Justices McCalla, Madden and Shipman. This ordinance allows for the Sheriff's Department to purchase three Dodge Ram 1500 Crew Cab 4x4 trucks for the cost of \$92877.00. This money will be transferred from the 1005 Coronavirus Relief

Fund to the 1800 Sales Tax Law Enforcement. During discussion, the Sheriff was asked for a plan for the department to be able to purchase their own vehicles without assistance from other funds. Sheriff Evans stated that he was working on a system that would use the Commissary funds for such a venture. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice Underwood. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-39 – Clerk’s Office – Compensation Time – Sponsored by Justices White, Nickels and Madden. This ordinance was created in order for the Clerk to pay one her deputies her compensation time in cash. The time was earned during early voting during the primary election. Money needed to be moved from the full time line item into the overtime line item. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Underwood and seconded by Justice Shipman. During the discussion Justice Brigham pointed out that Personnel Policy is clear that compensation time must be used by March 31 if the time is carried over from the previous year. The motion failed by unanimous vote.

Ordinance 2021-40 – Road Department – Transfers – Sponsored by Justices Scrima, White and Brigham. This ordinance transfers the money from the Small Equipment line item (2000-0200-2002) to the Capital Outlay line item (2000-0200-4004), for the purchase of a Bush Whacker and a Rock Breaker. The motion to adopt was made by Justice McCalla and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-41 – Sheriff’s Office – Grant – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, Madden and Shipman. This ordinance appropriates \$2,550.00 from the Local Law Enforcement Block Grant (Sheriff) into the funds small equipment line item. The motion to adopt was made by Justice McCalla and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-42 - Judge’s Office – Capital Outlay Line Items – Sponsored by Justices Scrima, White and Brigham. This ordinance appropriates \$8500.00 from County General (1000) to the Judge’s office line items for the expenditures of the Comptroller’s office. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Judge Massey asked for and received the ratification of David Humphrey and Tyler Garrison to the Rea Valley Fire Protection District.

The meeting was adjourned.

Training: All staff are continuing to complete their virtual training requirements. In-class training is scheduled for ACIC/NCIC later this year.

Staffing: As of May 28th, we are down another person which left us at 5 full time staff. Our 1 part time staff has slid over to fill the vacant full time slot, leaving us currently with "no" part-time staff. This leaves us at 6 full time and 0 part time. 1 of the full time staff is still out on maternity/vacation and due to return to work at the end of July. The staffing shortage has this department where we have no room for anyone to take sick or vacation time. Staff and myself are stepping up to cover the areas where we are short but please be aware, we will be having overtime/comp. time as a result of this.

Technical Issues:

On 5/10/21 at approximately 7:00 am, dispatch notified me about loss of radio service. I advised dispatch to swap over to handheld until service is restored. Sheriff Evans drove to all of the towers in the county and reset them. Service was then restored. (Tower Issue)

On 5/14/2021 at approximately 12:30 pm, we lost 911 service. I called SOLACOM to trouble shoot but it was discovered that the issue was with our service provider. I then called the service tech for Yelcot to re-route the 911 phones to a cell phone in our office. He then advised that a fiber optic had been cut in Green Briar. Service was restored later that evening. (Fiber Optic line was cut)

5/18/2021 dispatch called me at 3:15 am to advise that all of our radios were down. I advised dispatch to call the on-duty officers by cell phone to advise them the radios were down and I came into the office to trouble shoot. Test calls were made to 911 which seemed to be working as it should. We reached out to BRMC who advised that they were getting alerts that the Lee Mtn. tower was causing their radios to squeal. When we arrived at the Lee Mtn. tower that morning at daylight, we discovered that the transformer blew, due to a buzzard landing on some wires. The generator was also not functioning and the battery backup had gone out. Entergy came out immediately to repair the transformer. We called Arkansas Valley Communications and they came out on 5/19/2021 to do their repairs. On 5/19/2021, a new generator was installed to replace the old one, which was 20 plus years old.

5/21/2021 at 8:57 pm, dispatch called me to report that the secondary dispatch console was not recording 911 calls. I instructed dispatch to call SOLACOM for a trouble shoot ticket. The system was rebooted and fully operational after that.

5/27/2021 at approximately 4:45 pm, dispatch called me to report that they were experiencing total power outage and partial phone outage. Entergy was contacted and we were told that a transfer switch was flipped. For some reason, the generator failed to supply dispatch with necessary power to provide radio/911 service. Entergy power was restored quickly, thankfully. I understand that the generator will be serviced, to prevent another outage in the 911 Center.

Operations:

We are currently doing regular radio checks for our Fire Departments. I have set up a spread sheet to track where some of the radio problems are and will be contacting the Fire Chiefs when we are not getting good responses on the radio checks. I think this will help us to identify some of the issues and will help us to resolve them.

Association of Arkansas Counties Automated Records Systems Fund. Application is due August 31, 2021.

COVID REIMBURSABLE

Ralph-Caney Fire Department - has a reimbursement for \$30.17 for covid supplies. These were purchased April 20, 2020. Ordinance will follow. Waiting for clarification to submit the ordinance.

Marion County Coroner - We have asked Keith Barnes if he had any expenses that he needed to be reimbursed. He needs to be reimbursed for blue FEMA Disaster Pouches /body bags. They sell them at \$15/bag. There are 10 bags to a case. He needs to be reimbursed for 2 cases. Reimbursement should be approximately \$300.00. Waiting for clarification to submit the ordinance.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Lakeway Fire Department - Reviewing and advising Lakeway Fire Department on application for Entergy grant. This grant is to repair large leak in water tanker. They are seeking funds in the amount of \$6,500.00.

Oakland Promise Land Fire Protection District - Arkansas Rural Community Grant Program - Applicants with an eligible project may apply for up to \$15,000 in state matching funds toward a project for community development or fire protection projects. Oakland Promise Land Fire Protection District has presented plans to purchase 24 tankers for Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBAs). Total cost is 16,980.00. OPLFPD has plans to provide \$8,490.00 and is seeking matching grant funds in the amount of \$8,490.00. This property has been submitted. **There has been no notification one way or another to the fire department or to the county as to the outcome of this application.**

LIBRARY

Grant for shelving - Shelving has arrived. I was preparing the affidavit for the payment of shelving bill and have run into an issue.

Ordinance 2020-55 was passed to set up the fund and line item (3569-0600-2001) for the grant in the amount of \$2,000.00. An affidavit was prepared on October 30, 2020 and check in the amount of \$874.29 was disbursed. That left a remaining balance of \$1,125.71.

I looked back and the information was shown on the End Of Month report for December 2020. I went ahead and checked the January 2021 End of Month Report and discovered the fund was not even listed anywhere. I also checked February 2021 End Of Month report and the fund was there but no money was in it. I then checked for April EOM and saw same thing. I reviewed the most recent General Ledger of funds from the Treasurer and it shows a balance of \$1,125.71 in fund 3569.

I have another bill that needs to be paid from the grant in the amount of \$3,497.13. The remaining balance of grant funds in addition to other funds from the Library Director will pay the left over balance of \$2,371.42.

An Ordinance is included in packet

SHERIFF'S OFFICE

eCrash/ecite System Grant by the Arkansas State Police – This grant is re-imburseable from the Arkansas State Police. All receipts must be uploaded into their system before they will reimburse county.

Nothing has been ordered yet. This is a Federal Program. The Sheriff's Office applied to equip 14 vehicles with laptops, printers, scanners, etc. so they could electronically input information regarding accidents or issue citations. They currently have none in their cars. All is done manually. This would help provide the state with more accurate and immediate information for their records and statistics. The total amount was \$52,300.00. There is a 10% local match requirement which would be \$5,230.00. Federal funds requested would be (90%) \$47,000.00. The benefits to our county, region, and state would be helpful in accident reporting, insurance claims, and statistical information in determining safety projects.

Mini Step Grant by the Arkansas State Police – There are other grants that the Sheriff's Office would like to work on first. This has been put on the back burner as we have several months until due date. The purpose of the Mini-STEP Subgrant program is to provide funds to law enforcement agencies for highly visible overtime selective traffic enforcement during national/state mobilizations. The applicant must participate in public information and education activities that alert the public to the mobilizations. These could include:

- National Distracted Driving mobilization
- National Seat Belt Mobilization
- National Winter DWI Mobilization
- Distracted Driving Mobilization
- National Memorial Day Seat Belt Mobilization
- State July 4th Holiday DWI Mobilization
- State Speed Mobilization
- National Labor Day DWI Mobilization

This should include but not limited to a minimum of two media exposures (including a pre-news and post news release for each mobilization). The agency will be required to conduct observational seat belt surveys before and after the seat belt mobilization for evaluation purposes.

There are other reimbursements that they could be eligible for as well. **Grant is due August 18, 2021.** The sooner we can submit the grant the better our chances will be to receive it.

Entergy Open Grant – This is a type of grant for community improvement. It is one that can be written for the need.

Blue and You Regular Grants of \$5,000 to \$150,000, with a July 15 application deadline. Sheriff's Office is looking at this grant for bullet proof vests.

Local Law Enforcement Block Grant (LLEBG) – It has a maximum of \$2,550 and deadline for application is February 22, 2021. The Sheriff's Office is looking to purchase flashlights for all officers. This grant was approved for the total \$2,550.00 to purchase flashlights with safety features and jump boxes to jumpstart vehicles. Funds received and placed into fund and line items.

Ordinance 2021-29

Be it enacted by the Quorum Court of Marion County, Arkansas; an Ordinance to be entitled:

An ordinance amending Ordinance 2012-17 Standards and Regulations for the Development and Subdivision of Land. The Marion County Planning Board suggests the following revisions to provide a clearer definition of a subdivision, a disclosure of private roads and a reasonable time frame from Preliminary Plat review.

So, the following changes are provided.

Article 1: Amend Chapter II, Definitions, part 14 Subdivision to read as follows:

14. Subdivision. For the purpose of these regulations, a subdivision shall be defined as:

- a) The division of a tract of land or parcel, into three (3) or more lots, any one of which is less than five (5) acres and all the lots are intended to be developed for individual unit of ownership.
- b) The division of a tract of land or parcel into three (3) or more lots of five (5) acres or more which are located on existing State or county roads are not classified as a subdivision.
- c) The division of a tract of land or parcel into two (2) or more lots of ten (10) acres or less and all the lots are intended to be developed for individual unit ownership.

For any subdivision, a formal plat shall be submitted to the County Planning Board. This plat will clearly show the location, size, right-of-way, width, and easements or all new access, roads, and/or streets to be dedicated when submitted to the County Planning Board. A letter shall also accompany that plat agreeing to build new access, roads, and/or streets in accordance with Marion County's Road and Highway Specifications.

A formal plat need not be provided to the Marion County planning Board if the division of a tract of land or parcel a) does not meet the definition of a subdivision and/or b) when new access interior roads, and/or streets are not dedicated or classified as County roads.

When new access, interior roads, and/or streets are not dedicated or classified as County roads, a Declaration of Private Roads stating such shall be recorded with each individual unit of ownership. The Declaration of Private Roads cannot be rescinded, changed, or altered unless the new access, interior roads, and /or streets meet Marion County's road and Highway Specifications and written approval of the County Judge is obtained.

Article 2: Amend Chapter III, Procedure for plat Approval to read as follows:

Section 3. Preliminary Plat Approval Procedure

3. Action by Planning Board.

Within sixty (60) days after submission, the Planning Board shall indicate its approval, disapproval or conditional approval of the plat. The reasons for disapproval shall be stated in writing.

Article 3: Create a Declaration of Private Roads.

**Proposed Revisions of
Ordinance #2012-17
Standards and Regulations for the Development and Subdivision of Land**

Issue:

The definition of a subdivision within the current ordinance needs to better define a subdivision.

Background:

The Marion County Planning Board (MCPB) routinely answers questions from land owners/developers whether their proposed development needs to be submitted for approval to the MCPB. The current definition of a subdivision needlessly includes contracts to transfer interest in property. This often leads to confusion and concern from property owners looking to share property interest with family members.

Proposed Revision:

The MCPB suggests the verbiage "contract to transfer interest in" simply be removed from the County's definition for a subdivision. Additionally we have added "and all lots are intended to be developed for individual unit of ownership".

Issue:

Prospective buyers need to be informed of the use of private roads within a subdivision.

Background:

The MCPB has recognized that past developments have failed to properly inform buyers of the existence and responsibility of private roads. Buyers of property with private road access often do not understand the County will not provide road maintenance to their property. The County is often mistakenly blamed for the poor condition of these private roads.

In the past, buyers within some developments have mistakenly presumed the roads to their property were maintained by Marion County. Upon finding out they were responsible for the road maintenance; owners often take issue with the County

Proposed Revision:

The MCPB suggests a "Declaration of Private Roads" be required of any subdivision submitting a formal plat to the MCPB. This declaration shall be recorded with each individual unit of ownership.

**Proposed Revisions of
Ordinance #2012-17
Standards and Regulations for the Development and Subdivision of Land**

Issue:

The allowable time period for the MCPB to indicate approval, disapproval or conditional approval of a preliminary subdivision plat is limited to fifteen (15) days.

Background:

The current ordinance sets a limit of only fifteen (15) days for the MCPB to indicate approval, disapproval, or conditional approval. This time frame does not allow for weekends, holidays, or logistical issues that may take place. The MCPB has followed this time frame and found the submitting developers felt the time frame was too short for adequately responding to MCPB inquiries. Additionally, Board members find the current time frame to be too compressed for conducting a robust review of submitted preliminary plats.

Proposed Revision:

The MCPB suggests the current fifteen (15) days allowed for approval, disapproval, or conditional approval should be changed to a time period not to exceed sixty (60) days.

- a) The division of ~~or contract to transfer interest in~~ a tract of land or parcel, into three(3) or more lots, any one of which is less than five (5) acres and all the lots are intended to be developed for individual unit of ownership.
- b) The division of ~~or contract to transfer interest in~~ a tract of land or parcel into three (3) or more lots of five (5) acres or more which are located on existing State or county roads are not classified as a subdivision.
- c) ~~For~~ The division of or contract to transfer interest in a tract of land or parcel into two (2) or more lots of ten (10) acres or less and all the lots are intended to be developed for individual unit of ownership. where new accessor interior roads or streets are required a formal plat will be submitted to the County Planning Board. This plat will show clearly the location, size, right-of-way, width and easements of all roads and streets to be dedicated when submitted to the Planning Board. A letter will also accompany the plat agreeing to build roads and streets in Marion County's Road and Highway Specifications.

For any subdivision, a formal plat shall be submitted to the County Planning Board. This plat will clearly show the location, size, right-of-way, width, and easements of all new access, roads, and/or streets to be dedicated when submitted to the County Planning Board. A letter shall also accompany the plat agreeing to build new access, roads, and/or streets in accordance with Marion County's Road and Highway Specifications.

A formal plat need not be provided to the Marion County Planning Board if the division of a tract of land or parcel a) does not meet the definition of a subdivision and/or b) when new access, interior roads, and/or streets are not dedicated or classified as County roads.

When new access, interior roads, and/or streets are not dedicated or classified as County roads, a Declaration of Private Roads stating such shall be recorded with each individual unit of ownership. The Declaration of Private Roads cannot be rescinded, changed, or altered unless the new access, interior roads, and/or streets meet Marion County's Road and Highway Specifications and written approval of the County Judge is obtained.

Section 3. Preliminary Plat Approval Procedure

3. Action by Planning Board.


