MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

February 9, 2021

The Marion County Quorum Court held its regular meeting, on February 9, 2021 at 6 p.m., at the Marion County Courthouse.

In compliance with the ADH guidelines, the audience for this meeting was limited to 22 people besides elected officials. Screening was completed before the meeting began.

Judge John Massey was out of town, so his assistant Karen Carter started the meeting. Justice Brigham offered the invocation and Justice Shipman led the prayer. All Justices were present. Clerk Moffet read the statute 14-14-904 regarding the procedure in the case of the County Judge absence. "In the absence of the county judge, a quorum of the justices by majority vote shall elect one (1) of their number to preside but without the power to veto". Justices Madden, Vancuren and Shipman were all nominated. Justice Madden received the nod to preside.

Justice Scrima made a motion to suspend the rules and allow Brent Mitchell of the Bull Shoals Fire Department. Justice Vancuren seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

The minutes were approved as were all reports given. During the Law Enforcement report, it was requested that all the Law Enforcement reports be placed in the packet along with the Metro report. Sheriff Evans vocally gave the Metro report. There were some questions regarding the moving of monies in the commissary. Justice White responded that 75% of the money must be moved. He continued by stating that mistakes made in the past were being corrected so we can move forward. Justice Madden questioned by the chair of the committee did not call the meeting. Also, he requested that his notices of meetings come through phone calls or texts messages as he does not have an email account.

Unfinished Business

Justice Vancuren asked County Attorney Sam Pasting if there had been any response to the letter stating that the court had no confidence in the office of the Prosecuting Attorney. Mr. Pasting replied that he would follow up with Mr. Ethredge. Justice Vancuren requested that a copy of such letter would be sent to the state.

New Business

Ordinance 2021-7 - Postage Ordinance – Various Offices – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance reimburses the County Collector's office from the budgets of the Clerk, Jury, Election Commission, Assessor, Equalization Board, Child Support and the Quorum Court for the amount of postage used in the last quarter of 2020. The motion to adopt was made by Justice McCalla and seconded by Justice Scrima and passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-8 – Amend Ordinance 2021-6 – Clerical Errors – Sponsored by Justices McCalla and White. This ordinance simply corrects clerical errors in the line items numbers in Ordinance 2021-6. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Nickels and seconded by Justice McCall. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-9 – Refund – Property Taxes – Collector's Office – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance issued a refund in Property Taxes to Teresa Stuart in Pyatt, Arkansas, in the amount of \$334.15. This motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-10 – Postage – Treasurer's Office – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance appropriates \$9.00 from the Treasurer's special fund into the County General Fund. To cover the increase in the Postage Box rental. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

The motion to read Ordinance 2021-11 by title only was made by Justice Underwood and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-11 – 2020 Clean Up Ordinance – Various Offices – Sponsored by Justices McCalla and White. This ordinance simply cleans up the 2020 Budget, until the books get closed. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

The motion to read Ordinance 2021-12 by title only was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Scrima. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-12 - Amending Ordinance 2021-4 – Correcting Fund Numbers – Sponsored by Justice White and McCalla. This ordinance was necessary because during the first pay period and first payment of 2021 claims, the wrong fund numbers were used on the claims and the timesheets. The motion to adopt was

made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-13 – Transfer Station Sales Tax – Sponsored by Justice Madden. This ordinance allows for creating the line in the Transfer Station Sales Tax fund to be labeled 1802-0700-3090 Dues and Memberships and appropriate \$500 out of fund 1802, and to create line item 3559-0800-2001 General Office Supplies and appropriate \$5000 from fund 3559, Transfer Station Electronic Grant fund. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2021-14 – Pay for Stay – Sponsored by Justices Scrima, Brigham and White. This ordinance amends Ordinance 2005-17, which established reasonable rates of compensation for the care and housing of city prisoners who are lodged in the Marion County Jail. This new ordinance charges \$50.00 per day per prisoner from the various cities in Marion County. During the discussion the question was posed if this applies to only felons or if it would also apply to misdemeanor offenders. Justice White said that this would cause each of the cities to pay for all the prisoner's in all the cities with a law enforcement office, and the Sheriff's office would bill each city every month. Sheriff Evans mentioned that the Maintenance and Operating tax had brought in approximately \$40,000 and the DOC inmates brought in approximately \$27,500 in the month of January. He stated that the expenses for the jail for the same time frame was approximately \$43,000. Mayor Nixon, from Bull Shoals stated that this was the first time any of the cities were hearing about it. He felt that the rural residents were going to be charged a double taxation, since they are paying on bond issue already. Mayor Nixon feels that this is discriminatory against the urban residents. Attorney Sam Pasting stated that the County has a facility and we as a county are required to house prisoners. The statute does state that the county can issue a few.

Justice Brigham called the question, the motion passed unanimously.

The motion to adopt the ordinance was made by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed, however, Justice Nickels, Shipman, and McCalla, voted against it.

Resolution 2021-1 – This ordinance allows the county to apply for a grant on behalf of the Oakland Promiseland Fire Protection District, for the purpose of purchasing 24 tankers for Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus. The motion to ratified was passed unanimously.

Brent Mitchell, representing the Fire Chief's Association addressed the court stating that the Association was needing more radio coverage and that they were trying to update the protocols for the cities.

Linda Vincent of Have a Heart Pet Shelter gave her report. The statistics exceeded their expectations. They are particularly proud that they are a completely volunteer organization.

The meeting was adjourned.

COUNTY

Cares Act Grant – I presented a list of reimbursables for covid related expenses. I am preparing an ordinance for the budget committee to review.

FAIR BOARD

The County Fair Building Grant Program – This grant is designed to assist rural county fairs with the construction and improvement of buildings through incentive grants on a matching basis. County Fairs located in counties with a population of less than 55,000 are eligible for up to \$4,000 per fiscal year on a 50/50 matching basis. County fair organizations wishing to apply for a grant under the County Fair Building Grant Program are required to apply through their county judge's office. To be considered eligible, all applications must be signed by the county judge and approved by the quorum court. Grant funds may not be used to reimburse any part of the project already purchased or constructed. No part of the project may begin until after the community has received their grant check. This grant is due March 11, 2021. The Fair Board would like to apply for a grant for update the show barn. **They need to finish updating the lighting and replace some of the sill boards and metal.**

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Oakland Promise Land Fire Protection District - Arkansas Rural Community Grant Program - Applicants with an eligible project may apply for up to \$15,000 in state matching funds toward a project for community development or fire protection projects. Oakland Promise Land Fire Protection District has presented plans to purchase 24 tankers for Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBAs). Total cost is 16,980.00. OPLFPD has plans to provide \$8,490.00 and is seeking matching grant funds in the amount of \$8,490.00. **This property has been submitted.**

LIBRARY

Grant for shelving – **Shelving to arrive this month. The weather has delayed them.**
Library has been looking into other grants.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE

eCrash/ecite System Grant by the Arkansas State Police – **We are still in the reviewing process.** We will probably not receive a status report until March. This is a Federal Program. The Sheriff's Office applied to equip 14 vehicles with laptops, printers, scanners, etc. so they could electronically input information regarding accidents or issue citations. They currently have none in their cars. All is done manually. This would help provide the state with more accurate and immediate information for their records and statistics. The total amount was \$51,133.12. There is a 10% local match requirement which would be \$5,133.51. Federal funds requested would be (90%) \$46,201.61. The benefits to our county, region, and state would be helpful in accident reporting, insurance claims, and statistical information in determining safety projects.

Mini Step Grant by the Arkansas State Police – There are other grants that the Sheriff's Office would like to work on first. This has been put on the back burner as we have several months until due date. The purpose of the Mini-STEP Subgrant program is to provide funds to law enforcement agencies for highly visible overtime selective traffic enforcement during national/state mobilizations. The applicant must

participate in public information and education activities that alert the public to the mobilizations. These could include:

National Distracted Driving mobilization
National Seat Belt Mobilization
National Winter DWI Mobilization
Distracted Driving Mobilization
National Memorial Day Seat Belt Mobilization
State July 4th Holiday DWI Mobilization
State Speed Mobilization
National Labor Day DWI Mobilization

This should include but not limited to a minimum of two media exposures (including a pre-news and post news release for each mobilization). The agency will be required to conduct observational seat belt surveys before and after the seat belt mobilization for evaluation purposes.

There are other reimbursements that they could be eligible for as well. Grant is due August 18, 2021. The sooner we can submit the grant the better our chances will be to receive it.

Entergy Open Grant – This is a type of grant for community improvement. It is one that can be written for the need.

Blue and You Regular Grants of \$5,000 to \$150,000, with a July 15 application deadline. Sheriff's Office is looking at this grant for bullet proof vests.

Local Law Enforcement Block Grant (LLEBG) – It has a maximum of \$2,550 and deadline for application is February 22, 2021. The Sheriff's Office is looking to purchase flashlights for all officers. **This grant has been submitted and we are waiting on the status.**

Thinking Outside the Box Idea - I know there is a lot involved in upkeep, care, training for dog and partner and I thought of an out of the box idea to look into for your canine unit. The Twin Lakes Playhouse has in the past allowed non-profits to host an evening with funds (or portion thereof) going to the non-profit. Since Covid, I am not sure if they are still doing this or not but would not hurt to ask. Usually, they have one night before their regular performance starts that they will do this. It gives them a dress rehearsal in front of an audience. The non-profit promotes and sells tickets. Again, Covid has required changes be made so not sure if the non-profit would just push people to the Twin Lakes Playhouse website for ticket purchases. People love animals and could probably get a lot of participation. This would be just another way to help fund the canine unit. **UPDATE: Currently the Twin Lakes Playhouse is not having events at this time.**
