MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

September 12, 2023

The Marion County Quorum Court held their monthly meeting beginning at 6 p.m. on September 12, 2023.

Judge Stumph presided over the meeting and all Justices were present with the exception of Justice McCalla. Justice Hutching gave the invocation and Collector Carla Purdome led the Pledge.

The August minutes were approved.

The Treasurer's report and the Sheriff's report were verbally given. Justice Brigham inquired what the In/Out transaction in the 911 report consisted of. Justice Scrima requested to have a breakdown of all 911 calls. Also, the minutes from the Budget committee were presented.

Old Business:

New Business:

The motion read the ordinances by title only was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-97 – Judge's Office – Road Department – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance allows for the transfer of unappropriated funds from the County Road fund for the purchase of machinery and equipment in the amount of \$255,000.00. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Reed and seconded by Justice Hutching. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-98 – Coroner – Transfer – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance allows for the transfer from County General – County Coroner 1000-0419-3100 fund to ARPA Revenue Replacement – County Coroner 1006-0419-4005 fund for the purchase of a license plate for the coroner's vehicle in the amount of \$13.00. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Reed and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed with Justice Vancuren voting against it.

Ordinance 2023-99 – Have a Heart Pet Shelter – Transfer – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance allows monies to be transferred from line item 4004 to line item 2002 in the American Rescue Fund to have a Heart Pet Shelter Fund (3046-0805) for the purchase of small equipment in

the amount of \$14,088.28. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice Hutching. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-100 – Judge's Office – Accounting – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance is for an appropriation for the obligation of funds for the costs of Federal Audits for funds received from the American Rescue Fund (3046) for 2022 to 2026 in the amount of \$40,000.00. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice Nickels. Justice Vancuren made a motion to table the ordinance and Justice Reed seconded. The motion to table passed with Justices Hutching and Shipman voting against it.

Ordinance 2023-101 – Promise Land Area Community Organization – ARPA Request – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. The ordinance is to appropriate funds from American Rescue Fund (3046) to American Rescue Fund – Promise Land Area Community Organization (PLACO) Fund (3046-0604). The funds in the amount of \$40,683.00 will be used to construct a multi-function protective concrete surface area for Organization. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Hutching and seconded by Justice Scrima. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-102 – Oakland Area Improvement Association – ARPA Request – Sponsored by Justice Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance appropriates funds from the American Rescue Fund (3046) to the American Rescue Fund – Oakland Area Improvement Association, Inc. (OAIA), in the amount of \$78,000.00 for the purchase of a generator, a refrigerator, freezer and a shed for the food bank. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice Reed. The motion to amended Section 1 to include "food" was made by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice Brigham and seconded by Justice Vancuren. The motion passed unanimously. The motion to adopt also passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-103 – Lakeway Rural Volunteer Fire Department – ARPA Request – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance is to appropriate funds from the American Rescue Fund (3046) to American Rescue Fund – Lakeway VFD Fund (3046-0505) in the amount of \$35,000.00 for the purchase of fire protection equipment and/or gear. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-104 – Rea Valley Fire Protection District – ARPA Request – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance is to appropriate funds from the American Rescue Fund (3046) to American Rescue Fund – Rea Valley Fire Protection District (3046-0506) in the amount of \$35,000.00 for the purchase of fire protection equipment and/or gear. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Reed and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

Justice Vancuren made a motion to read the rest of the Fire Department ordinances by the name of the Fire Department only. Justice White seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-105 – Oakland Promise Land Fire Protection District – ARPA Request– Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance is to appropriate funds from the American Rescue Fund (3046) to American Rescue Fund – Oakland Promise Land Fire Protection District (3046-0507) in the amount of \$35,000.00 for the purchase of fire protection equipment and/or gear. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Scrima. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-106 – Peel Fire Protection District – ARPA Request – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance is to appropriate funds from the American Rescue Fund (3046) to American Rescue Fund – Peel Fire Protection District (3046-0508) in the amount of \$35,000.00 for the purchase of fire protection equipment and/or gear. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-107 – Pine Mountain Volunteer Fire Department – ARPA Request – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance is to appropriate funds from the American Rescue Fund (3046) to American Rescue Fund – Pine Mountain Volunteer Fire Department (3046-0509) in the amount of \$35,000.00 for the purchase of fire protection equipment and/or gear. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-108 – Bruno Fire Protection District – ARPA Request – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance is to appropriate funds from the American Rescue Fund (3046) to American Rescue Fund – Bruno Fire Protection District (3046-0510) in the amount of \$35,000.00 for the purchase of fire protection equipment and/or gear. The motion to adopt was

made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Scrima. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-109 – Ralph-Caney Fire Protection District – ARPA Request – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance is to appropriate funds from the American Rescue Fund (3046) to American Rescue Fund – Ralph Caney Fire Protection District (3046-0514) in the amount of \$35,000.00 for the purchase of fire protection equipment and/or gear. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-110 – Summit Fire Protection District – ARPA Request – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance is to appropriate funds from the American Rescue Fund (3046) to American Rescue Fund – Summit Fire Protection District (3046-0515) in the amount of \$35,000.00 for the purchase of fire protection equipment and/or gear. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice Hutching. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-111 – Yellville Fire Protection District – ARPA Request – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance is to appropriate funds from the American Rescue Fund (3046) to American Rescue Fund – Yellville Fire Protection District (3046-0516) in the amount of \$35,000.00 for the purchase of fire protection equipment and/or gear. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice Hutching. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-112 – Bull Shoals Fire Department Auxiliary – ARPA Request – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance is to appropriate funds from the American Rescue Fund (3046) to American Rescue Fund – Bull Shoals Fire Department Auxiliary (3046-0517) in the amount of \$35,000.00 for the purchase of wet/dry suits and an Aquaeye scanner. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-113 – Marion County Emergency Rescue – ARPA Request – Forwarded from the Budget Committee to the Quorum Court. This appropriation will transfer additional funds needed for the construction of a building to house and protect the water rescue equipment which is used by the Marion County Emergency Rescue to assist E-911, Cop of Engineers, Arkansas Game and Fish, and the U.S. Coast Guard in the amount of \$100,000.00. The motion to adopt was

made by Scrima and seconded by Justice Hutching. The motion to table was made by Justice Nickels and seconded by Justice Reed. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-114 – Clerk's Office – Wage Increase – Recorder's Fund – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This amendment to Ordinance 2022-98 will modify the currently appropriated budget and the numbers and compensation portion of the ordinance for the two deputies currently employed in the Clerk's office by raising the wages from \$13.25 to \$15.25 per hour. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Reed and seconded by Justice Hutching. The motion passed with Justice Vancuren voting against it.

Ordinance 2023-115 – Clerk's Office – Wage Increase – County General – Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This amendment to Ordinance 2022-98 will modify the currently appropriated budget and the numbers and compensation portion of the ordinance for the one deputy currently employed in the Clerk's office by raising the wage from \$\$15.60 to \$16.50 per hour. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Reed and seconded by Justice Hutching. The motion passed with Justice Vancuren voting against it.

Ordinance 2023-116 – Assessor's Office – Wage Increase - Sponsored by Justices Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance amends the numbers and compensation portion of Ordinance 2022-98 by allowing a \$2.00 an hour increase in wages in the Assessor's office. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Reed and seconded by Justice Hutching. The motion to table was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Brigham. The motion to table passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-117 – Collector's Office – Transfers – Sponsored by Justice Nickels, White, Reed and Hutching. This ordinance appropriates \$7,046.68 from the Automation Fund (3001) to certain line items in County General and \$14,134.94 from the Automation Fund to certain line items in the Automation Fund. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion to amend Article 2 to correct a clerical error was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Hutching. The motion to amend and the motion to adopt passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-118 – Sheriff's Office – Walmart Grant – Sponsored by Justice Scrima, Nickels, White, Reed, Hutching and Brigham. This ordinance appropriates \$5,500 from Fund 3568 – Walmart Grant Fund to the Other Miscellaneous line item in the amount of \$2,000 and into the Sales Tax Fund 1800

Clothing and Uniforms line item in the amount of \$3,500.00. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice Reed. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2023-119 – Sheriff's Office - Arvest Fund – Sponsored by Justices Scrima, Nickels, White, Reed, Hutching and Brigham. This ordinance appropriates \$5,000.00 from the Fund 3571 Arvest Foundation in to Sales Tax 1800 for the purchase of pistols. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Scrima and seconded by Justice Reed. The motion passed unanimously.

Resolution 2023-6 – October as 4H month – Sponsored by Justice Reed. This resolution resolves to honoring the youth and leadership of the Marion County 4-H by proclaiming the month of October as 4-H month. The resolution was resolved by voice vote unanimously.

Presentation – Melina Bennett - Veteran's Service office – Sponsored by Justice Hutching. Ms. Bennett introduced herself and explained the duties of her office.

The meeting was adjourned.

Please find for your review and deliberation the monthly report for the Marion County Office of Emergency Management. Should you have any questions specific to any of the following items please do not hesitate to ask.

- We are continuing to have a weekly ZOOM meeting with A.T. & T. personnel to plan and move forward with our NEXTGEN 911. We anticipate that this process be completed by the end of the year.
- All PSAP problems that were previously identified have been resolved. Most importantly, the issues regarding the grounding of the PSAP.
- We have submitted the FY 2024 OEM Budget to the Comptroller and Judge for review.
- The Bull Shoals Fire and Police Departments held an Operational exercise to test their abilities to respond to a boat accident with a fire, injuries, and missing boater on Bull Shoals Lake. Although the Office of Emergency Management was not involved in this excessive, our office conducted an on-scene evaluation & review of their response capabilities based on our (HSEEP) Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program training we attended in Camden, Ar.
- We continue to review a county wide emergency notification with the Regroup Mass Notification System Co.
- Wednesday, 21 SEP 23, we held our first planning meeting as we work toward the development of an IAP (Incident Action Plan) to address the challenges Marion County may face during the April 2024 Solar Eclipse. The meeting will be ongoing as we complete the IAP.
- 15 new addresses and 7 signs were completed.

Staff: 6 Full-time, 1 Full-time positions open.

<u>Technical Issues:</u> The south tower was down only due to a propane tank not being turned back on to run the generator when the gas company changed valves on the tanks.

Operations: 3 new towers are up and running. All law enforcement has gotten their computers and cad in their vehicles. We have hired 2 new dispatchers. We had one dispatcher leave us on the 29th was her last day and we have another who has put in her resignation, so we will have another position open. Once all positions have been filled we will



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have to go back to 12 hours shifts across the board instead of the 12,10,6 shifts we have now. Cad has been updated and we now have a 3 partial call station in my office for me to answer 911 calls when needed.

GRANT REPORT QUORUM COURT, TUESDAY OCTOBER 10, 2023

AMERICAN RESCUE FUNDS – The County must obligate the ARPA funds by Dec. 31, 2024, and spend them by Dec. 31, 2026. Going back through the ARPA files I updated some information on my spread sheet as follows:

Total Received: \$3,242,614.00

Total Obligated to this point: \$2,949,067.82

Total Remaining to fund projects pending: \$293,865.18

Justice Brigham's committee has met and given me the list of pending applications.

One is a non-profit organization who is a first time applicant: Pallette Art League.

The Ordinance for Marion County Emergency Rescue was tabled until the budget committee received additional information. They received funds for water rescue equipment. They are currently seeking funds in which to house their new equipment. White River Baptist Association were unable to attend the Budget meeting. Justice Brigham has asked they attend the next budget meeting to present information regarding their grant request.

There are 12 rural fire departments that Justice Brigham's committee has suggested receiving \$35,000.00/each. I have not received applications from the following fire departments: Fairview, Lazy Acres, or Pyatt.

CLERK AUTOMATED FUND – The Marion County Circuit Clerk's Office submitted her application for imaging equipment and will not know the outcome until October 2023. The grant amount applied for is: \$114,736.97.

COURT SECURITY GRANT

The court system has been busy, and our maintenance man has been assisting at the Transfer Station due to employee shortage so he has been unable to get the measurements needed for items that will be ordered for the grant.

ARKANSAS HISTORIC PRESERVATION – Grant applications are available starting September 2023, and Marion County is going to apply for a grant for a central heat/air system for the courthouse which will help with the electric bills, humidity in basement, and aesthetic appears of the building (hopefully not more window heat/air conditioners).

We are also looking into a grant for equipment for the Quarry.





Budget Committee Meeting Notes September 27, 2023

Attendance: Justice Nickels (Chair), Justice Reed (Recorder), Justice White, Justice Hutchings

The first order of business was to nominate a new chairman and recorder for the committee. Justice Nickels was nominated as Chairman and Justice Reed was nominated as recorder.

Note: Some ordinances were amended to correct small typographical errors. The corrections were not documented in the meeting notes.

Ordinances submitted for consideration:

- 1. An ordinance to transfer \$7,370.00 from The Road fund (2000) to Road fund vehicles (2000-0200-4005) representing monies from the auction of vehicles sold at auction.
 - a. The ordinance was referred to the Quorum Court for consideration.
- 2. An ordinance to transfer a grant for \$15,000.00 from the Oakland/Promiseland State Grant Fund (3561) to the fund 3561-0502)
 - a. The ordinance was amended to remove "District Court" from the Appropriate to lime.
 - b. The ordinance was referred to the Quorum Court for consideration.
- 3. An ordinance correcting a clerical error from County General Courthouse Maintenance (1000.0108.3060) transferring \$1099.33 to the Library Fund (3008-0600-3060).
 - a. The electric bill had been incorrectly paid from the wrong fund.
 - b. The ordinance was referred to the Quorum Court for consideration.
- 4. An ordinance to correct the naming convention for Oakland/Promiseland VFD State Grant (3561-0502).
 - a. The request consisted of two ordinances to correct and transfer \$15,000.00 similar to ordinance #2 above. The discussion became sufficiently confusing as to refer the ordinances to the Court for better explanation.
 - b. The ordinance was referred to the Quorum Court for consideration.
- 5. An ordinance to modify Numbers and Comp for the salary of the position of Assessor Chief Deputy from \$14.50 to \$16.50.
 - a. This ordinance was presented to the Court in September without the specific fund information. The Court requested corrections and resubmittal.
 - b. The ordinance was referred to the Quorum Court for consideration.
- 6. An ordinance raising the salary of Library Director position from \$41,525.58 to \$47,765.91
 - a. The Director stated this change had been approved in March. However the committee took exception to this statement

- b. An unidentified person in the audience stated that the Elected Officials pay had been raised earlier in the year by a 3% COLA. Judge Stumph stated that his was mandated by the State.
- c. Aster some detailed discussions both Justice White and Justice Reed stated that they would not support a raise for this position as the current pay is significantly higher that current employee pay.
- d. In compliance to the State Constitution Amendment 55, the ordinance was referred to the Quorum Court.
- 7. An ordinance to corrected Fund number for \$30,261.31 from Fire Department fund (1006-0502) to Fire Depart Fund (3056-0502)
 - a. The ordinance was referred to the Quorum Court for consideration.
- 8. An ordinance reimbursing County General Fund (1000) for \$698.12 from the Office of Emergency Management Fund (1000-5000-3094).
 - a. The reimbursement was for travel and expenses expended for attending the Arkansas Emergency Management Association Conference.
 - b. The State paid for these expenses by check
 - c. The ordinance was referred to the Quorum Court for consideration.
- 9. An ordinance to correct the 2023 fund paid for ordinance 2022-96 expenses
 - a. This was a cleanup ordinance.
 - b. The ordinance was referred to the Quorum Court for consideration.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ANNUAL OPERATING BUDGET AND NUMBERS AND COMPENSATION ORDINANCE 2021-124 AND ORDINANCE 2022-13 FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2022 FOR MARION COUNTY, ARKANSAS. APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR ELECTION COMMISSIONERS TO BE PAID A PER HOURLY RATE FOR PERFORMING ELECTION-RELATED TASKS OUTSIDE A PUBLIC MEETING OR TRAINING, AND OTHR RELATED MATTERS.

WHEREAS, The State of Arkansas has mandated additional duties and responsibilities for County Election Commissioners without mandating compensation, and

WHEREAS, the Attorney General of the State of Arkansas issued Opinion No. 2016-040 on August 25, 2016 in which he opined that the term "election officials" does not apply to members of the County Board of Election Commissioner (CBEC) when it comes to pay even though Arkansas Code in 7-1-101(11) reads as follows "(11) "Election official" or "election officer" means a person who is a member of the county board of election commissioners, a person who performs election coordinator duties, a person who is a poll worker designated by a county board of election commissioners to be an election clerk, election judge, or election sheriff, or a deputy county clerk or a person assigned by a county clerk to conduct early voting;" and therefore are entitled only to statutory pay for public meetings, training of other officials, and election day unless the Quorum Court allows for an hourly rate for other election related activities; and

WHEREAS, from at least 2015 through 2021 members of the Marion County Election Commission have been paid hourly wages for preparation of elections over and above mere meetings or poll worker training in order to have open, fair and efficiently run election which included preparing the County for vote centers to make voting more accessible to citizens, and

WHEREAS, there has been a huge turnover in election commissioners in part due to the burdens placed upon them and it has been difficult for both the Democratic Party Committee of Marion County and the Republican Party Committee of Marion County to find people willing to serve pursuant to law to address this specific issue the Arkansas Legislature passed Act 356 of 2023, and

WHEREAS, the Marion County Quorum Court in 2022 refused to pay the Marion County Election Commissioners for the hundreds of extra hours they put in for the 2022 primary and general elections and the County Judge demanded return of the hourly funds paid out based in part on Attorney General Opinion 2016-040 and the County Judge further authorized with holding of any other pay until the county was "repaid", and

WHEREAS, the Marion County Quorum Court and the Marion County Election Commission demand fair and open elections with responsible accounting for expenditures as it is their respective duties to the Citizens of Marion County and to the people of then State of Arkansas that with the agreement of the Marion County Election Commission the following provisions are adopted:

A. ACCOUNTING:

SECTION 1: As there is no elected official or department head to approve claims submitted by or on behalf of the Marion County Election Commission all claims submitted to the County for payment shall be approved by a majority of the Marion County Election Commission at a public meeting and each claim shall include the signature of at least two election commissioners.

SECTION 2: This accounting includes all pay or reimbursements sought by commission members, poll workers or other election officials as well as all other expenses of the election commission that are to be paid by the County out of the County Election Commission budget or any special fund or grant related to elections.

SECTION 3: If the election commissioners or any election official attend a meeting or workshop or other training in which they are to be reimbursed directly by the State or Federal Government for attending then no claim may be submitted or approved by the Marion County Election Commission to seek reimbursement from County funds.

B. PAYMENT FOR PUBLIC MEETINGS, ELECTION DAY AND TRAINING SESSIONS

SECTION 1: PUBLIC MEETINGS: For all public meetings called by the Marion County Election Commission Commissioners shall be paid the minimum set by Act 356 of 2023 which is currently \$125.00 per meeting with a maximum ten (10) meetings per election.

SECTION 2: TRAINING SESSIONS: Whether the election Commission is attending a training session (including those sponsored by a county or private entity but still located in Arkansas) or conducting a training session pursuant to law each commissioner in attendance shall be paid \$100 per session unless reimbursement may be sought under Section A3 above.

SECTION 3: ELECTION DAY: For primary elections, general elections and run-offs from those two elections where there are 3 or more run-offs in the County or State each election Commissioner shall be paid \$300.00 for "Election Day." If there are less than 3 races then \$100 per commissioner on Election Day for run-offs. For school elections, special municipal elections or referendums the election Commissioners shall be paid \$100 for Election Day and \$50 for any run-off.

SECTION 4: MILEAGE: No mileage shall be paid to any election commissioner for attending meetings, training or Election Day if those sessions occur in Yellville or Summit. Otherwise election commissioners may submit a claim if they used their family personal vehicle and shall be paid at the rate the county reimbursed other county employees for mileage. This section does not apply if reimbursement is possible undersection A3 above and paid directly to the claimant.

C. PAYMENT FOR OTHER ELECTION RELATED MATTERS:

SECTION 1: The Quorum Court recognizes that there are times when members of the Marion County Election Commission will have to perform tasks to prepare for elections that are not practical for a public meeting such as issues that arise in early voting or preparing a vote center for an election, or addressing issues with improper billing by suppliers or preparing ballots or ordinances. Whenever it is practical the election commission should look to other election officials to handle matters and supply materials to election centers, however should members of the election commission be called to handle these tasks that are not part of the payment scheme set out in Section B1-3 above then they in accordance with Act 356 of 2023 they shall be paid the minimum rate set out in said act as amended.

SECTION 2: That each Marion County Election Commissioner shall be limited to 40 hours of paid additional work prior to election day for preferential primaries and 40 hours of paid additional work for general elections and 10 hours of paid additional work for run-offs for those elections and 20 hours of paid extra work for any school election (including run-offs) and 10 hours of paid additional work for any special municipal election or referendum.

SECTION 3: Election Commissioners are specifically excluded from claiming compensation for their own research, reading materials or preparation of matters to be presented to a County Committee or the Quorum Court UNLESS it involved gathering materials at the request of the Quorum Court or the Budget Committee nor shall Marion County Election Commissioners receive compensation for attending Quorum Court meetings.

D. 2022 MARION COUNTY ELECTION COMMISSION MEMBERS

SECTION 1: This is for appropriating of funds for the 2022 Election Commissioners to be paid an hourly rate for performing election-related tasks outside of a public meeting.

SECTION 2: That 2022 Election Commissioners hourly rate be set the same as the hourly rate for poll workers.

SECTION 3: This provision is to be retroactive to January 1, 2022. That all 2022 election Commissioners who either repaid monies paid to them for hourly work or had them deducted from subsequent paychecks shall have those funds returned to them or their estate.

SECTION 4: All county employees and elected officials involved herein shall prepare all documentation necessary to effectuate the transaction described above.

SECTION 5: That once the funds are paid to the 2022 election commissioners as set out in section D3 above those commissioners shall have no further monetary claims for 2022.

E. EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 1: This Ordinance is herein enacted and therefore effective immediately.

SECTION 2: All ordinances or parts thereof that are in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
