MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

August 19, 2025

The Marion County Quorum Court held their monthly meeting beginning at 5:30 p.m. on August 19, 2025.

<u>Judge</u> Stumph <u>presided over the meeting and all Justices were present</u>, with the exception of Justice Kerwood. The invocation was delivered by Ms. Karen Carter and the Pledge was led by Clerk Dawn Moffet.

The July minutes were approved.

All reports were given and accepted.

Unfinished Business:

New Business:

The motion to read the ordinances by title only was made by Justice Reed and seconded by Justice Dorsey. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 25-31 – Judge's Office – Road Department Overtime – Sponsored by Justices Lee, Kerwood, Shipman and Dorsey. This ordinance appropriates \$40,000 from the County Road Fund (2000) in the line item for Overtime and Other Premium Compensation. This will fund the overtime for the remainder of the 2025 fiscal year. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Dorsey and seconded by Justice Reed. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 25-32 – Judge's Office – Peel Fire Department Grant Appropriation - Sponsored by Justices Lee, Hopson, Kerwood, Shipman and Dorsey. This ordinance appropriates \$15,000 from the Peel Fire Protection District Fund 35-62-0508 for the purpose of purchasing a replacement fire protection pumper truck. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Reed and seconded by Justice Dorsey. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 25-33 – Sheriff's Office – Establish Fund – Sponsored by Justices Lee, Hopson, Kerwood, Shipman and Dorsey. This ordinance would allow for a new fund to be established to track the revenues and expenses of a vehicle lease program for the Sheriff's department. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Reed and seconded by Justice Vanvelkinburgh. During the discussion Justice Reed questioned the portion in Section 1 regarding the portion which indicated that a contract was signed by the County Judge. Reed pointed out that there was no

signature on any contract. He recommended that that portion of the Section be deleted. Justice Dorsey made the motion to amend the Ordinance and Justice Reed seconded it. The motion to amend passed unanimously. Treasurer Crespino suggested that the portions of the ordinance that read that this ordinance was to establish a "County General Unique Fund" be stricken. The motion to amend was made by Justice Reed and seconded by Justice Dorsey. The motion to amend passed unanimously. Comptroller Cheyenne Stroud questioned the emergency clause. Justice Johnson asked what the emergency was. Sheriff Alexander replied that the fund was needed in order to pay for the vehicles in January as the vehicles needed to be ordered now to receive them in January, otherwise it could be March or April before they were received due to availability. Justice Reed asked for comments from County Attorney John Russo. Attorney Russo stated that this ordinance was not proper in the current format. Justice Reed asked about the current vehicles. Sheriff Alexander responded that five Dodges purchased in 2018 were going down and needed to be replaced. He also pointed out that the new vehicles were going to be leased. The motion to adopt as amended passed unanimously. (This ordinance was vetoed by Judge Stumph on August 20, 2025. He stated "This ordinance is unconstitutional. If an ordinance that is being amended (2024-61) is an appropriation ordinance the ordinance amended it has to be an appropriation ordinance as well. AR Code 14-14-907).

Ordinance 2025-34 – Library – Head Librarian Compensation – Sponsored by Justices Lee, Hopson, Kerwood, Shipman and Dorsey. This ordinance amends the position title classification and compensation of the Library Director to be consistent with the responsibilities and functions. The position of Library Director is amended to Head Librarian. The compensation for the Library Director was an annual salary of \$41,535.52. The position of Head Librarian is amended to \$16.00 to \$19.25 per hour. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Reed and seconded by Justice Shipman. During discussion Justice Lee questioned where the numbers came from, she stated that her math shows that the Head Librarian would be \$40,040.00 instead of \$41,535.52. Justice Reed admitted that his arithmetic was incorrect. Justice Johnson made a motion to amend the salary to \$40,040.00, Justice Reed seconded. The motion to adopt as amended passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2025-35 – FEMA – Reimbursement to City of Flippin – Sponsored by Justices Lee, Hopson, Kerwood, Shipman and Dorsey. This ordinance is for the transfer of funds to reimburse the City of Flippin for the use of their Fire Department Personnel and Equipment during the immediate response from the tornado outbreak on May 26, 2024 in the amount of \$11,163.76. The motion to

adopt was made by Justice Reed and seconded by Justice Johnson. The motion passed with Justice Lee voting against it.

Resolution 2025-4 – Clerk's Office – Automation Grant – Sponsored by Justices Lee, Hopson, Kerwood, Shipman and Dorsey. This resolution authorizes the Marion County Judge to apply for a grant from the Association of Arkansas Counties for the purposes of securing grant funds in the amount of \$1763.78 to purchase four scanners. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Lee and seconded by Justice Vanvelkinburgh. The motion passed unanimously.

Judge Stumph presented the proclamation for International Drug Overdose Day to Ms. Ruby Speak representing the Marion County Prosecutor's office.

The meeting was adjourned.







 motion made and seconded not to use Mockingbird ILL program; motion carried.




