** You are invited to stand.*

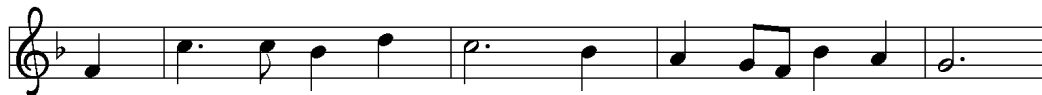

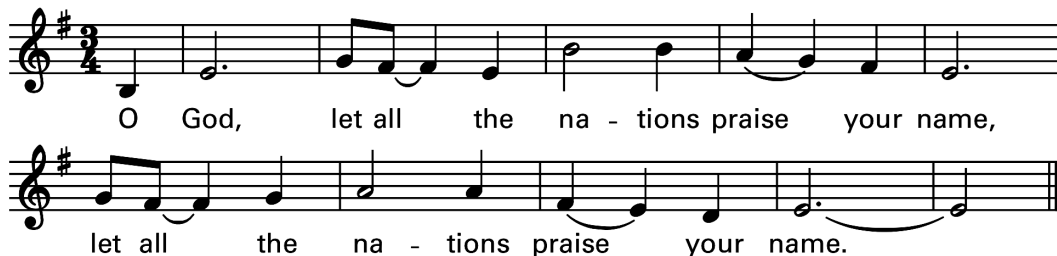

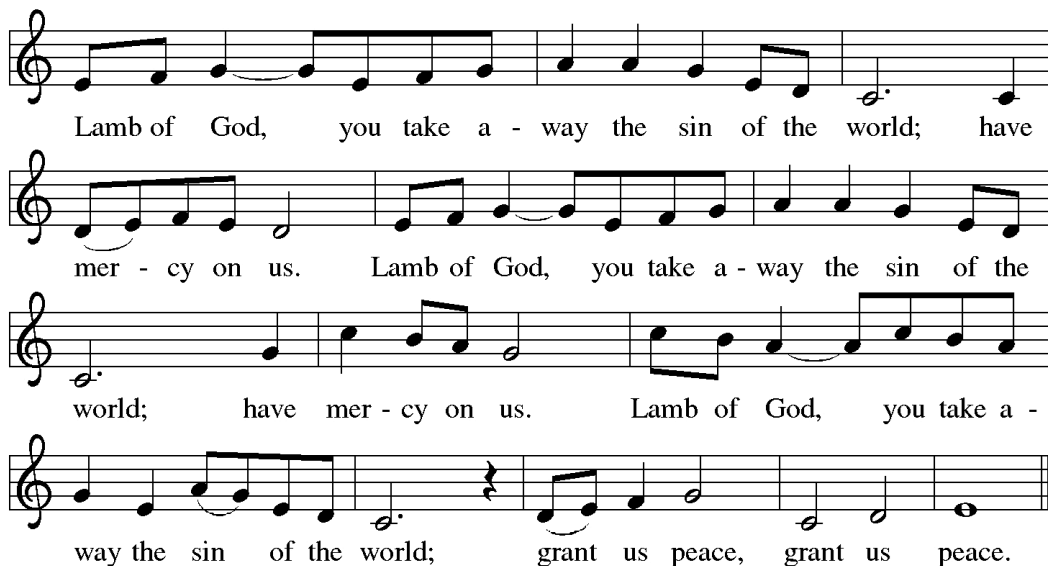
