After the reading: The Gospel of our Lord.

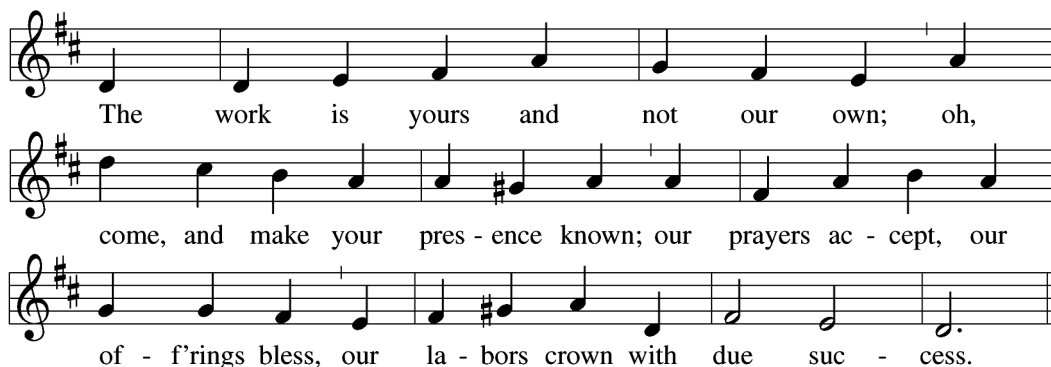
