St. John's Congregation Council

Our Council provides visionary, fiduciary and strategic leadership for the Congregation. Together with the Congregation, the Council discerns God's vision, monitors the budget, guides the financial well-being of the congregation, and oversees the Senior Pastor's administration of the mission of the Congregation.

The voting membership of the Congregation Council consists of the Senior Pastor and twelve lay members of the congregation. Any voting member of the congregation is eligible to serve on the Council, subject to term limits specified in the Church Constitution. In addition to the requirements listed above, the following five guidelines are also used in selecting candidates for all elected positions:

- Commitment to regular worship attendance.
- Commitment to a daily devotional and prayer life.
- Commitment to growth as a Christian.
- Commitment to growth giving with the tithe as a benchmark.
- Commitment to sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with others.

The Council meets on the third Tuesday of each month at 6:30pm in Oehler Hall.

Sunday Morning Education Hour – Susan Scott

In-between worship services at 10:15am every Sunday, adults are invited to gather in Oehler Hall for faith formation bible studies, presentations, explorations, and much more. Our Education Hour often focuses on a theme or scriptural text for a season, but there are always new opportunities sprouting up.

Wednesday Bible Study – Susan Scott

All are invited to join the mid-week bible study where we look at the readings for the coming Sunday's worship, following the style of Lectio Divina. Together, we wonder, wish and notice how these ancient words still speak to us. Some days we even look for what might be "shimmering" for us!

Luminaria is our entry program into St. John's—it is how someone becomes a member of St. John's. If you are interested in knowing more about St. John's and this community of faith, joining Luminaria is the right choice for you. This involves so much more than a brief course on Reformation history, discovering where the bathrooms are and giving newcomers offering envelopes. Luminaria is a journey that intentionally seeks to open one's mind and heart into the life of faith as people make their way into our congregation. We believe it is how the church is supposed to be there for those new to the faith, or new to St. John's. Members of Luminaria are called Lumens and are accompanied by Companions on their journey through the program. There are also several leaders that guide the journey and offer extra support. Congregational Care is a ministry that strives to provide compassionate caring for our members by nurturing body, mind and spirit. Congregational Care does not duplicate available services, such as nursing care, medical or community health services. It works as a collaborative partnership with these disciplines to offer resources, education and a communication network.

The practice of carrying communion to the sick and homebound has been encouraged in the Lutheran tradition since 1978. St. John's Eucharistic Ministers receive training so that they may serve those who are absent from worship.

Parish Nurse – Suzi Taylor

Parish nursing, or the more recent term "faith community nursing," has a long and successful history in its connection to the health and well-being of members in faith communities across the country. It is a professional nursing role and provides physical, spiritual, emotional and social support. Our parish nurse is an advocate for health, healing and wholeness. She is available to listen to health concerns; to make referrals to congregational and community resources; to provide support when making health care decisions; and is available just to listen.

Snack Stop – Linda Eytcheson

Every Wednesday and Thursday, and every second and fourth Monday of the month, from 2:00 - 4:00pm, the St. John's community offers a grab-and-go snack bag for anyone in need. These snack bags are prepared throughout the week and distributed in the afternoons by a group of volunteers. The Afternoon Snack Stop welcomes regular donations of: ritz fresh stack crackers, chewy fruit snacks, diced fruit cups, fruit and grain cereal bars, peanut butter packs, soft and chewy granola bars, and chicken salad. On every first, third, and fifth Monday of the month from 2:00-4:00pm, the St. John's community hosts a hot meal for anyone in need. Meal preparations take place Monday mornings, and volunteers help set-up tables, serve food, and mingle with guests.

Midtown HART Respite – Karen Olson

Every Tuesday from 9:30am-12:30pm, Midtown HART, of which St. John's is a member of, hosts Respite Care in the Gathering Place of St. John's. This respite provides a safe space for our guests to rest, to recharge, to receive hospitality and connect with potential resources. We offer guests essential hygiene items and survival necessities like sleeping bags and mats. Also available are shoes, clothing, and at times bicycles. Altar Guild

The Altar Guild's work focuses on three major actions of corporate worship: proclamation of the Word, celebration of Holy Baptism, and Holy Communion. This ministry involves preparing the worship with appropriate appointments, vessels, elements, linens and paraments used in the service; preparing the altar for communion; changing the paraments to reflect the proper color for the day or season; laundering the altar linens; caring for the silver, brass, candles, and banners; and preparing for baptisms.

Greeters

Join a hospitable team of people who look for visitors and newcomers, welcoming them and helping them to feel at home.

Ushers

You can help provide a warm and hospitable welcome to all who worship to be disciples in fellowship. Ushers help hand out bulletins as people walk into the church, direct the congregation during communion and special activities, facilitate the collection of offerings, and direct worshipers if they have questions on Sunday mornings.

Lectors

Enrich the worship service by presenting the scripture lessons. Reading the Good News is a rewarding experience.

Eucharistic Servers

Eucharistic servers assist the pastoral staff in the sharing of the bread, wine, and grape juice during the Lord's Supper, a meal done in the remembrance of Christ at every worship service.

Assisting Ministers

Assisting ministers aid the leadership in worship. The group meets weekly via zoom to study texts and to write the prayers of the people.

Sanctuary Choir

Our Sanctuary Choir performs a variety of sacred choral works and festival hymns that reflect the lectionary and occasional sacred anthems, providing the essence of our high worship service. Rehearsals are held on Wednesdays at 1:30pm.

Handbell Choir

The handbells have been ringing beautifully at St. John's for two decades. The handbell choir plays at least once each month, enriching our worship services and special events. Rehearsals are held on Monday nights at 6:30pm.

Cantors

If you have a desire to lead worship with your singing voice, this is a wonderful opportunity. This is an auditioned role and requires a meeting with the Director of Worship and Music for a vocal assessment.

Celebration Singers

Comprised of about 20 voices, Celebration Singers specialize in providing contemporary and classical settings of sacred choral music in four- and eight-part harmonies during worship. This group is an auditioned choir and requires a meeting with Steven Johnson for a vocal assessment. Rehearsals are held on Wednesday nights at 6:00pm.

Advent Festival

The St. John's community kicks-off the Advent season with the annual Advent Festival. Hosted by the Director of Youth and Family Ministries and a plethora of volunteers, the congregation gathers at the 10:15am hour in The Gathering Place to make beloved yule log advent wreaths, fun Christmasy crafts, shop at a Fair Trade Marketplace, and welcome the Christmas season.

Holy Week Day Camp – Elyssa Lakich

As many children and youth at St. John's are on Spring Break during Holy Week, we offer a Holy Week day camp - similar to Vacation Bible School. A three-day camp, Holy Week day camp incorporates a mix of Holy Week themed bible stories and activities, fun outings around Midtown, unique games and crafts, and uniquely fun time with St. John's staff. Holy Week day camp is run by the Director of Youth and Family Ministries and a plethora of volunteers.

Santa Lucia – Karen Bruce + Dagny Starn

Held mid-December, the Santa Lucia worship service and festival celebrates St. Lucy of Scandinavia and the light she brought to her community. A female high school youth applies each year to be the Santa Lucia, and a committee selects one individual who exemplifies the St. John's mission of "Living God's Love in the World" to serve in this role. Other female high schoolers join the Santa Lucia and serve in her court, and younger youth of all genders dress-up as Cookie Elves to help during the festival. The worship service is predominately youth led, and the Santa Lucia typically preaches the sermon. As the congregation follows the Santa Lucia outside, lit with a crown of candles, they travel to The Gathering Place for an hour-long festival centered around FUN! Santa Lucia, her court, and the young cookie elves deliver plates of homemade cookies to a beautifully decorated hall, we sing Christmas carols and hear Scandinavian-themed jokes, and we conclude with everyone's favorite tradition of dancing around the Christmas tree. This event is hosted by a sub-group of the Community Engagement Committee.

SPSYC

The Sierra Pacific Synod Youth Committee (SPSYC) is a synod-wide youth committee that many St. John's youth have served with throughout the past 15 years. SPSYC is a committee for high school aged youth who plan and lead retreats for Elementary-High School youth at Mt. Cross, serve as voting members at every Synod Assembly, and serve in other leadership roles throughout the synod. This year, four St. John's youth serve on SPSYC and youth have attended each Mt. Cross retreat they've hosted!

St. John's Nursery – Helen Disho

The St. John's Nursery is open for children under 5 years of age every Sunday during the 9:00am service, 10:15am education hour, and 11:30am service. Our highly qualified Nursery Attendants are in the Nursery every Sunday to welcome children into the space.

Kids' Worship Spaces

We offer a variety of worship spaces for children of all ages. The Kinderraum is located in the front right side of the sanctuary - our hope is that this space will allow kids to become engaged with worship. The Nursing Room is located next door to the Nursery, outside of the sanctuary, and is available at all times to nursing parents, complete with a private changing table.

Confirmation – Scott Mohler

The Confirmation Class is led by Pastor Jon Haug and longtime Sunday School teacher Scott Mohler, and is primarily for youth in grades 6-8th. They will invite youth to think more deeply about their individual faith lives, beyond just what their parents brought them up in. We do this through asking deep and meaningful questions related to a life of faith, and explore them together with their connection to scripture, tradition, and their own thoughts. In the Lutheran tradition, Confirmation serves as a "first act" of adulthood. Youth will experience fun activities, deep questions, prayer, time with each of our pastors, and community building while in Confirmation this fall. The Confirmation class meets on Sundays from 10:15-11:15am in the loft of The Gathering Place.

Scholarship – Ahnie Mosle + Amy Afoa

Each year, St. John's awards scholarships to deserving students who apply and are chosen by the Scholarship Committee. The scholarship program exists to assist qualified students who are members of St. John's Lutheran Church, Sacramento, CA. Two St. John's scholarships, each in the amount of \$3,000, and one Lawson scholarship of \$1,200, for those entering an education career, will be awarded.

Vacation Bible School

Vacation Bible School happens every summer at St. John's and is a 5-day, full-day summer camp for youth in Kindergarten-High School. The Middle and High School youth step into various leadership roles and are given opportunities to earn service hours and help lead some of the programming, but we often also welcome the staff of Mt. Cross Ministries to lead programming! Vacation Bible School is run by Mt. Cross staff, the Director of Youth and Family Ministries and a plethora of volunteers.

Sunday School – Elyssa Lakich

Sunday School at St. John's is divided into two classrooms. Kim Hendricks helps lead the Pre-K - 3rd grade class. In this class, Kim hopes that students will have fun learning about the Bible and develop a curiosity about their faith, and know that they are a vital part of the church family at St. John's. Elyssa Lakich, mother of elementary-aged twins and Sunday School Superintendent, will lead the 4th & 5th grade class as students dive deeper into biblical stories and prepare for Confirmation in the coming years. Eliseo Paniagua, Associate Director of Worship and Music, will continue to lead music during the Sunday School hour, as students will learn to sing and play fun musical instruments.

Order of St. John (Acolytes) – Betsy Long

Teenagers are invited to use their gifts and talents to serve at the altar of God by serving in the Order of St. John. They ring the bells, light the candles, lead processions, assist with communion, present the banners, hold altar books, lead the children to music practice and perform countless other tasks to assist the pastors each Sunday. The Order of St. John is open to anyone ages 10-18, and is a long-standing, beloved tradition here at St. John's. Youth serve on acolyte teams once a month and are an integral part of the worship leadership team. Joining the Order of St. John is a wonderful leadership opportunity that centers our young people in every worship service, as we continually strive to witness the diverse, unique body of Christ in all that we do.

High School Youth Group – Jeremy Kaetzel

The High School Youth Group welcomes youth in 9-12th grade for weekly gatherings, service projects, peer ministry, and summer trips. In addition to the many ways our high schoolers hold leadership positions and volunteer in other capacities throughout the church, we strive to provide a space for them to gather with their peers, too! The Youth Group gathers every Sunday at 10:15am in the Youth Room.
