Enthroning Jesus in Your Home

Rooted in the Church's early meditations on the pierced side of Christ, devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus gained significant momentum in the 17th century when Jesus revealed his Heart, burning with love for humanity, to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. In these revelations, Jesus expressed his desire to be honored in a special way through his Sacred Heart. Out of these revelations arose the tradition of the 12 Promises, according to which Jesus made various promises to those who venerate his Sacred Heart, including blessing every place where an image of his Heart is exposed and honored.

The ceremony of enthronement contained in this booklet, which can be used by families to dedicate themselves and their homes to the Sacred Heart, is based on a version widely promoted in the early 20th century through the work of Father Mateo Crawley-Boevey, SS.CC., who emphasized the role of enthronement in fostering a Christ-centered family life.

Through the enthronement ceremony, families recognize Christ's rule over their lives. They do this by placing an image of his Sacred Heart in a place of honor in their homes, renewing their commitment to be faithful disciples, and consecrating themselves to his Sacred Heart.

By enthroning the Sacred Heart, families commit to living according to Christ's teachings and embrace a way of life rooted in his love, mercy and blessings.

How to Enthroner the Sacred Heart

1. Choose a date for the enthronement, such as the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a First Friday, or another suitable day.
2. Spiritually prepare for the enthronement.
 - During the nine days prior to the enthronement, recite the prayers on pages 4-7.
 - Attend Mass and the Sacrament of Reconciliation on a date close to the ceremony.
3. In advance of the enthronement, invite your pastor or another priest to lead the ceremony. If he will not be

present at the ceremony, ask him to bless the image of the Sacred Heart and sprinkle it with holy water in advance of the ceremony.

- If a priest will not be leading the ceremony, the head of the household will lead it.
4. Choose a place of honor in your home to enthrone the image. A living room wall, a side table, or fireplace mantel are all suitable places. You may also hang a framed certificate of enthronement next to the image.
 5. Identify a small table on which to place the image before the ceremony. If possible, the table should be in a different room so the image can be carried in procession to the place of honor.
 6. As a family, select the Scripture reading you will use on pages 9-10, and select a reader for the Scripture reading and intercessions.
 7. Perform the enthronement on page 8.
 8. Following the enthronement, continue to allow the Sacred Heart to reign in your home by practicing the devotions found on page 14.

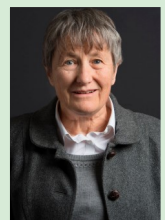
GOD'S PEOPLE

June 14th is "Flag Day" so it's worth asking whether civic pride is enhanced or challenged by our Christian faith. Certainly, media reports about the evangelical Christian nationalism being promoted by the Secretary of Defense fail to meet a concern for the "common good" that promotes peace, compassion and the common good for all humanity that Pope Leo advocates. Our first reading (Exod 19:2-6a) depicts God making a covenant with the people liberated from slavery, "...if you harken to my voice ... you shall be my special possession ... though all the earth is mine ... a holy nation.

That holy nation building project fails repeatedly in the stories of Israel. God's love, compassion, and stubborn fidelity never change. When Jesus sends twelve apostles to *gather the lost sheep of Israel* by announcing *the kingdom of heaven is at hand* in the gospel (Matt 10:1-8), they are to stick with descendants of that original covenant. But the conclusion of Matthew's gospel has the risen Jesus announce a radical change in God's plan. His disciples are to *make disciples of all the nations ... teaching them to observe everything I have commanded. Behold I am with you always to the end of the age,*" (Matt 28:19-20).

God's new covenant established by the sacrificial death of His Son is not a regime change or selecting another genetically related group of humans more willing to follow God's orders. As St. Paul puts it "*God proves his love for us that while we were still sinners Christ died for us,*" (Rom 5:6-11). Emperor Constantine invented the "Christian empire" in 312 CE when he led an army fighting under a Christ standard to oust his co-ruler Maxentius. Christ did not need an empire. Before that coup, the emperor's mother had already joined this sect that had been legally outlawed from 303-311 CE. Martyrs, not military might represent God's power.
