

#### "It's Good For Us to Be Here" . . .

One of the best westerns ever made is Sergio Leone's *Once Upon A Time in the West*. Throughout the movie, periodically, there'd be a flashback scene when the Charles Bronson character was remembering a scene from his youth. It was always the same image: a man slowly strolling forward toward the camera. At first, he's way in the background and the picture is blurred. As the movie unfolds, though, with each re-introduction of the flashback, the man is closer and the image is sharper. By the end of the movie, when he walks right into the foreground, the image is perfectly in focus, and we see that it's the Henry Fonda character. At this point, the rest of the scene plays out and we finally learn why Charles Bronson has been hunting Fonda down all this time. (I won't spoil the movie for you by giving away the ending—it's worth watching.)

For most of us, this is how we develop our relationship with Christ. It's slow . . . gradual . . . we encounter Him in broad strokes, either via word-of-mouth from our parents or grandparents, or else from the sketch the evangelists give us in the Gospels. It's through prayer, meditation on the Gospel passages, contemplation of the scenes we see in the Scriptures that we come, bit by bit, to sharpen our appreciation of who Jesus is. The guidance of the Church through Her teaching aids us in this lifelong project of fleshing Jesus out, so that we come to understand more and more perfectly the beauty and goodness of this Man who happens also to be God.

So, it's no wonder that Peter, James, and John were flabbergasted when they were treated to the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor. All at once—BOOM!—the splendor of the God-Man is unveiled before their eyes and they see Him in the full radiance of His divinity. I often wonder how they recognized that the two cats flanking Him in this moment were Moses and Elijah—I mean, it's not like there were any pictures of these two guys floating around in readymade history books or anything. But the light of God illuminated more than just Jesus's face and robes; it also shone on the three disciples' hearts and minds. Suddenly, they realized the fullness of salvation history centered around Jesus Christ; it became clear as creek water what they were witnessing, what they themselves were a part of.

As they come down from the mountain afterwards, with Jesus's radiant splendor tucked back into His commonplace humanity, this clarity begins to fade as their senses return to the mundane, familiar world that they're so used to and

they think they understand so well. But all the confusion, doubt, rationalization fumbling partial logic that dims our eyes to the mystery of God's presence with us creeps back in. Ironically, it's precisely in the world we think we know how to navigate our way through that we lose sight of the transcendent meaning of life.

And so it was with the disciples. Jesus tells them not to reveal the experience of the Transfiguration until after He has risen from the dead, and they start whispering among themselves what rising from the dead might mean. The old familiar logic obscures the clarity of the revelation—despite how plainly Jesus spoke about rising from the dead, they can't help but think this is just another parable, a figure-of-speech that's meant to symbolize something else altogether. How different from the pure certainty of their earlier recognition of Moses and Elijah! (And curiously, they don't even ask Jesus to explain Himself, as they had done so often before when they didn't understand His parables.)

This coming Wednesday is the Feast of the Transfiguration, when the Church recalls especially this privileged glimpse of Jesus as He really is. We're reminded that Jesus's divinity was not a product of His Resurrection but was His very nature right from the beginning. But it also reminds us that transfiguration is not transformation: when Jesus was transfigured, only His appearance changed, revealing Himself fully; but He Himself didn't change. For our own part, the grace that comes to us through the gift of the Risen Christ transforms us, changing us from what we are to what we're called to be—sharers in God's nature by participation in the life of Christ. What is the Lord's by right and nature is offered to us as a gift. Lest we lose sight of this splendid invitation to be transformed, allowing our senses to be reduced to the merely ordinary and mundane, we should make sure always to lift our hearts in gratitude to God, who reveals Himself to us and gives us His love. We should say with Simon Peter, "Lord, it is good for us to be here."

#### **JUDGE JESUS OR ...?**

The local chief or elders respected for wisdom often settle disputes in village cultures. Without citing legal precedents, wise women or men typically support their decisions with proverbs or fables. Asking Jesus to settle an inheritance dispute between brothers is not about some childish squabble over sharing toys (Lk 12:13-21). It signals community respect for Jesus' wisdom. The petitioner's brother must also be there waiting to hear the reply. As he had done when Martha asked him to make Mary help with hospitality (Lk 10:38-42), Jesus refuses the "Judge Judy" enforcer role. But our story does not end there.

Turning to the expectant crowd, Jesus follows his "wrong judge" reply with those expected proverbial examples of wisdom. The caution against identifying one's life with possessions might remind listeners of the "vanity ... what profit ... from all the toil and anxiety of heart" in today's first reading (Eccles 2:21-23). Then Jesus tells a parable to illustrate crazy thinking produced by greed. A farmer concludes that a harvest is so extraordinary that he would have to replace his barns with bigger ones. Life had handed him the ticket to that life of pleasure, "eat, drink and be merry..." an epigram that shows up on Roman tombstones. Its warning to those walking by is that "for tomorrow we die". So, Jesus simply compressed that timing to, "you fool, this night..."

Everyone listening would recognize such an extraordinary harvest as a gift from God. Jews know the story of Joseph in Egypt storing up the bountiful harvest to save the land from starving during the lean years. So, this man's problem was the "it's all mine" greed. The crowd listening to Jesus might even have imagined him as one of those idiots from comic mimes of the day. Without deciding the inheritance dispute, Jesus asks the brothers to reframe true inheritance as becoming "rich in what matters to God." How or even if the brothers resolved their dispute remains open to many possible endings.

#### Help Wanted! Family Promise Metrowest **Overnight Shelter Volunteers**

Family Promise has several openings for overnight volunteers at our shelter this summer. These volunteers fulfill a critical role in the organization, ensuring support for guests in the event of an emergency. Although the shift is typically quiet, the comforting presence of an overnight volunteer in the absence of our Residential Support Specialist is a gift to both families and our staff. You will stay in the private apartment above the FPM shelter where you have access to a full private bath, kitchen, and a full-sized futon for sleeping. While you are free to interact with the families in common areas after your initial check-in with them, they typically have small children and tend to retire early. You are expected to do nothing more than be present in the apartment and get a good night's sleep. You will know who is living in the shelter at the time, and you will have a contact number in the rare case of an emergency.

Each shift is 8:30pm - 8:30am but negotiable in the event you need an earlier start for work/family commitments in the morning. Eligible volunteers are 18+ years old, submit to a background check in advance of serving, and must have completed our online volunteer orientation through our website.


