

#### Four Loves (Part Five) . . .

"A relationship, I think, is like a shark. You know? It has to constantly move forward, or it dies. And I think what we got on our hands is a dead shark." This is how Woody Allen's character broke up with Diane Keaton in the film *Annie Hall*. I always wanted to try this line, but all the girls I ever dated always broke up with me before I got the chance to. (Curses! Foiled again!)

But I do like the analogy. It reminds us that love ripens over the seasons of our life, and as we mature, as our personality develops, our love for the people in our life deepens—or at least, it should. It has to move forward or else it dies like a dawdling shark. The four loves we've been looking at don't exist independently; they constantly intertwine, converse with each other, and inform each other as we relate to those we love.

At least the three forms of love that originate in the human heart—natural affection (storge); friendship love (philia); and romantic love (eros) commingle as we grow. Agape is of a different stripe altogether: this is supernatural love, a gift from God, poured into our hearts by sheer grace through the waters of baptism, and which needs to be carefully and attentively groomed throughout our life. Agape Is much like an expensive orchid that a friend has given us as a present: it needs meticulous care from us to continue to blossom, and we provide this nurturing attention out of an appreciation for the flower's own beauty but also in appreciation for our friend.

Agape can purify these other varieties of love, and elevate them to the rich and rugged love that gives of itself without measure. But the flipside is always a real possibility, too, and a danger that we need to be on guard against. These "lower" forms of love (for lack of a better term) can entangle us so tightly that we never develop that love for God—a love that first comes from God—which perfects our human loves.

If the lower loves don't stretch upward and wrap around the higher forms, we stagnate. The relationship won't have grown, perhaps because our knowledge of the one we love hasn't penetrated past the initial stages of the relationship. We might be keeping our heart in harness to maintain a holding pattern. And if the relationship won't grow, it simply will shrivel.

St. John tells us that perfect love casts out all fear; but when our love is less than perfect, when it's less than *agape*, it can actually foster fear. We can become afraid of losing the loved-one's good favor, and this fear leads us to give in to the shallow and sentimental temptation to indulge their every whim. Our love then quickly deteriorates into something that's more about ourselves than the one we love.

For example, our natural affection is "need-love" (to borrow the term C.S. Lewis uses for it). *Storge* simultaneously is a love that prompts us to cater to the needs of those for whom we have this affection; but it also attaches us to them because they fulfill some need that we have. In some ways, even taking care of the loved-one's needs turns into a need of our own. We all need to be needed, but sometimes this can reach an extreme if it doesn't intertwine with a higher kind of love.


An over-indulgent mother can spoil her child because she needs to feel the gratification of making the little one happy. My own mother had this tendency of trying to shield us from the consequences of our mistakes by fixing the problems herself. This had disastrous results for one of my brothers in particular, who's never grown up, even now at 68. Our need to be needed, our attachment to *storge*, can lead us to *react* to situations rather than *respond* to them: that is, to rush into "fix-it" mode when what might be called for is to take the long view with a more level-headed approach; to recognize that current, temporary adversity can be the breeding ground for strengths that are more durable, such as character, a sense of responsibility, and the development of virtue.

There are some parents who need to keep their children as children forever because it makes them feel vital. This isn't a deliberate effort to stunt the offspring's personal growth; it's simply surrendering wholesale to storge without taking into consideration the further-reaching effects. Some fifteen years ago, a friend of mine—the mother of two young sons—once commented that she wasn't raising boys, she was raising men. That outlook changed the choices she made in her parenting style, and steeled her for making the hard decisions, to "hold their feet to the fire," so to speak—to practice what we used to call "tough love." This is the outlook of someone who has tempered *storge* with *agape*. It allows room for the beloved to grow, to fully flower into a well-rounded person—to achieve his/her highest good. And it's necessary if the loved-one is ever to achieve any degree of autonomy or self-sufficiency. By allowing him/her room to grow, (s)he also matures, and we can learn to develop a friendship with him or her, and so add *philia* to *storge* and agape.



The next meeting is scheduled for September 21<sup>st</sup> and will be located at the Parish Center.



#### STRATEGIC PLAN


Today's first reading points to absurdity in strategic planning given the limitations of human knowledge and the distortions created by desire: "...deliberations of mortals are timid, ... the earthen shelter weighs down the mind that has many concerns ... what is within our grasp we find with difficulty..." (Wisd. 9:13-18). A similar lesson could be learned from British deliberations about those American rebels. It would just take a show of force by British regulars to put that bunch, "incapable of any sort of order or discipline," back in line (cf. R. Atkinson, The British are Coming, pp. 20-27). Even Britain's most famous historian, Edward Gibbon, author of The Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire, consistently voted for the crown's policies in Parliament.

Only God can see the whole picture and inspire providential human actions. Paul appeals to God's providence to transform his situation, an old man in prison, and that of a fugitive slave belonging to Philemon, head of a house church. Paul converted the slave. So, he uses the "perhaps, God's providence is at work" to transform expectations for a runaway slave. No harsh punishment. Instead, Philemon should receive Onesimus as though he were "...my own heart...beloved especially to me, but even more so to you," (Phlm 10-17). God's strategic plan: to override harsh punishment with love.

Jesus presents the crowds with requirements for discipleship guaranteed to cut recruiting numbers, complete break with family ties, care for one's own life, giving up all possessions. What could make that a "trusted financial advisor's plan"? Two examples of situations which human wisdom should handle follow. The man who doesn't provide for what it will take to build that watch tower to protect his vineyard would become a local laughingstock. As a carpenter, Jesus might have one in mind! The wars between "kings" in the region were kept in check by Roman power, so Jesus imagines an earlier situation. So how did the colonists beat Britain? Renouncing family ties, possessions, even one's life for a greater good.
