Four Loves (Conclusion) . . .

My favorite poet is John Donne. A seventeenth-century British cavalier, his earliest poems were all love sonnets: verses designed to seduce his lady fair. Later in life he had a religious awakening and wound up becoming a cleric with the Anglican Church. His poetry shifted gears from the erotic to holy sonnets, but the truly striking thing is that these holy sonnets express the same amorous, rapturous passion as his love poems. "Batter My Heart, Three-Person'd God," to take just one example, burns with desire for the Trinity.

And so, it often is. Our compulsion for romance can be a false swipe for our hunger for God. Certainly, St. Augustine discovered this, as he explains in his classic autobiography *The Confessions*. But despite what we might see on the Hallmark Channel, *eros* can never fill us completely. However, it can lead us to that purest love, *agape*, or in Latin *caritas*: the love of God. Pope Benedict XVI, in his first encyclical, *Deus Caritas Est* ("God is Love"), offers a brilliant reflection on how *caritas* can preserve authentic *eros* and keep it from spoiling into mutual exploitation:

there is a certain relationship between love and the Divine: love promises infinity, eternity—a reality far greater and totally other than our everyday existence. Yet we have also seen that the way to attain this goal is not simply by submitting to instinct. Purification and growth in maturity are called for; and these also pass through the path of renunciation. Far from rejecting or "poisoning" *eros*, they heal it and restore its true grandeur.

... True, *eros* tends to rise "in ecstasy" towards the Divine, to lead us beyond ourselves; yet for this very reason it calls for a path of ascent, renunciation, purification and healing.

When it doesn't ascend by this path, it can prove to be mere disappointment. We take each other for granted; or we become bored and fickle, and move on. But serial repetition of romance is not the same thing as the upward progress to all-consuming love. The late Holy Father took the title of his encyclical from a line from the New Testament: In the first letter of St. John, we're told God is love. But the rest of the line is potent: "God is love, and the one who abides in love abides in God." To abide means to remain. And to remain means persevere. There's a constancy to love, the fierce commitment to persist, to endure, to continue despite conflict, despite frustration, despite disappointment, despite tedium. Another verse from Scripture sums it up

nicely: "Stern as death is love," we read in the Song of Songs, "Deep waters cannot quench love, nor floods sweep it away." A neat summation—neat, but demanding.

Love like this survives the wildfire of passion, even though it can be found within that passion. But like silver remains after a flame burns away the dross, agape abides even when removed from the heat of eros. God is love. But we must be careful not to make the mistake that the opposite holds true. Just because God is love doesn't mean that love is God. And I think it's perilously easy to get lost in those weeds. As Christians we readily succumb to the error that if God is love, then any sentimental gesture of storge or eros is an accurate reflection of Christian love. And in the wider world beyond Christianity, we toss ourselves headlong into the idolatry of making a god out of eros.

But *agape* is the love that we only experience when we have an encounter with God's love for us. Only once we've been touched by the overwhelming love God has for us do we begin to understand what love in all its grandeur is. When we've had this experience, it becomes nearly impossible to refrain from sharing it with others. It's the summit of the human adventure, and once tasting it, we want everyone to know it. This is what's really meant by a religious conversion. It's not necessarily a change in belief or a going-over to another denomination with a different set of teachings. It's the startling and joyous recognition that God is real and that He loves us perfectly with all four loves—with instinctive affection, with friendship, with a desire for us, and with the love that surrenders the Lover in a total and unrestricted gift of Self.

Little wonder that in the same New-Testament letter that tells us that God is love we also find these words: "In this is love: not that we have loved God but that He loved us, and gave His only son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins."





The next meeting is scheduled for September 21st and will be located at the Parish Center.



BATTLE STANDARD

Our Good Friday ritual has the faithful venerate the wood of the cross on which the Savior died. That reminds us of the cross as an instrument for execution. Why does the Church celebrate a Feast of the "Exaltation of the Holy Cross" on Sept. 14th? Notre Dame alums might remember the 19th cent. painting of the cross being carried up into heaven in the Lady Chapel of the Basilica. Or perhaps seeing mosaics in the apse of 5th and 6th cent. churches in Rome that have a cross enthroned or standing about that central Christ figure. Initially, a feast celebrating the finding of "wood of the cross" by emperor Constantine's mother (ca. 324), this 4th century Jerusalem festival was adopted by the Roman church in the 7th century.

Clearly this image is not an instrument of torture but a sign of victory. Legend said that a victorious emperor Constantine was inspired by a vision to use the Christian symbol on his battle standards. After that crucial change, Christianity was no longer a persecuted sect but promoted from the throne. As the battle standard for crusaders seeking to retake the holy places from Muslim rulers, the cross was no invincible shield. Other early Christians would not have viewed the cross as the "battle flag" for conquerors. After all the real triumph had been won by the martyrs and faithful believers who persisted despite official bans.

Historians estimate that by the early 4th century approximately 40% of the population belonged to some Christ-believing group. Admittedly that includes many who would be labeled "heretics" by later orthodoxy. Even those marginalized believers produced martyrs. So, the cross did not need the "battle standard" of government power. It triumphed over powers of evil in the hearts of people inspired by the gospel of a Son of God who died for humanity (Phil 2:6-11).

For the historically curious, Pope Leo I (d. 461) seems to have been the first pope to receive a relic of the true cross.


Tom Coan, Child Safety Program Coordinator, will be available after each Mass on the weekend of September 13/14 to help you complete your 2026 Child Safety's documents.


